Tropical Depression Gordon - Final




Situation (Advisory #20 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 30 miles S of Little Rock, AR
- Moving N at 5 mph; this motion expected to continue through Friday
- Maximum sustained winds 10 mph
- Little change in strength is forecast during next 48 hours

Impacts:

- No major destabilizing impacts to lifelines
- · Shelters have closed
- Fatalities: 1
- · Evacuations have been lifted
- Rainfall: total rain accumulations of 4 to 8 inches over northwest MS and much of AR, up into the Midwest, with possible isolated maximum amounts of 10 inches expected through Saturday night
- · Flash Flood Watches in effect over MS and AR

Response

FEMA Region IV:

- RWC returned to Steady State
- LNO demobilized from MS; LNOs to FL & AL released from stand-by
- MS EOC at Partial Activation (24/7); Governor declared a state of emergency for 6 counties;
- AL EOC returned to Normal Operations; Governor declared a state of emergency

FEMA Region VI:

- RRCC de-activated
- RWC returned to Normal Operations
- IMAT-2 demobilized from LA EOC
- LNOs demobilized from LA EOC and city of New Orleans EOC; LNO on stand-by for AR
- LA EOC returned to Normal Operations; Governor declared a statewide state of emergency
- AR EOC at Monitoring for potential flooding

FEMA HQ:


- NWC returned to Steady State
- ISB Team Echo demobilized from DC Fort Worth, TX
- Commodities staged at FSA Sherwood Forest, Baton Rouge

Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

Tropical Storm Florence (Advisory #32 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 925 miles ENE of the northern Leeward Islands
- Moving W at 7 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 65 mph
- Expected to re-strengthen and become a hurricane over the weekend
- Tropical storm force winds extend 140 miles
- · No coastal watches or warnings in effect





Tropical Outlook – Atlantic


Disturbance 1 (Invest 92L) (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)


- Centered 650 miles W of Cabo Verde Islands
- Moving slowly W across tropical Atlantic Ocean
- Associated showers and thunderstorms remain fairly concentrated near the center
- Tropical depression expected to form later today or tonight
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (90%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (90%)

Disturbance 2 (Invest 93L)(as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Tropical wave forecast to move off the west coast of Africa on Friday
- Moving W or WNW over far eastern tropical Atlantic Ocean
- Tropical depression could form today or over weekend
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (80%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (90%)







Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific




Hurricane Olivia (CAT 3) (Advisory #27 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 1,555 miles E of Hilo, HI
- Moving WNW at 15 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 125 mph
- Slow weakening trend expected through the weekend
- Hurricane force winds extend 30 miles
- Tropical storm force winds extend 115 miles
- No coastal watches or warnings in effect

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located several hundred miles SSW of Baja California Peninsula
- Tropical depression likely to form this weekend or early next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (60%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (90%)




Current Disturbances and Two-Day Cyclone Formation Chance: X < 40% X 40-60% X > 60%

Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific



Hurricane Norman (CAT 1) (Advisory #41 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 290 miles NE of Hilo, HI
- Moving NW at 8 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 85 mph
- Weakening is forecast through Saturday
- Hurricane-force winds extend 30 miles
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend 105 miles
- No coastal watches or warnings in effect



Tropical Outlook – Western Pacific



<u>Tropical Depression 26W</u> (Advisory #2 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)


- Located 1,440 miles E of Guam
- Maximum sustained winds 20 26 mph
- · Expected to intensify over the next couple of days








National Weather Forecast











Precipitation / Excessive Rainfall Forecast








