Significant Activity –Sep 8-9



Significant Events: Tropical Storm Florence; Hurricane Olivia; Typhoon Mangkhut

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic Tropical Storm Florence; Tropical Storm Isaac; Tropical Strom Helene; Disturbance 1: Low (10%);
 Disturbance 2: Low (20%)
- Eastern Pacific –Hurricane Olivia (CAT 1); Tropical Storm Paul
- Central Pacific Tropical Storm Norman
- Western Pacific Tropical Storm Mangkhut

Significant Weather:

- Flash flooding possible Southern Plains; Lower Mississippi and Tennessee Valleys; Middle Mississippi Valley to Ohio Valley; Mid-Atlantic to New England
- Elevated Fire Weather Idaho




Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Forecast to form several hundred miles WSW of Azores
- Slow development is possible
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)








Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



<u>Tropical Storm Florence</u> (Advisory #40 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- 765 miles SE of Bermuda
- Moving W at 6 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 70 mph
- Forecast to become a Hurricane today and a Major Hurricane by Monday
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend 125 miles
- No coastal watches or warnings in effect



Tropical Outlook – Atlantic

<u>Tropical Storm Isaac</u> (Advisory #7, as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- 1,540 miles E of the Windward Islands
- Moving WNW at 9 mph
- Maximum sustained winds are 50 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend 60 miles
- Gradual strengthening forecast
- Forecast to become a Hurricane by Monday

<u>Tropical Storm Helene</u> (Advisory #8a, as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- 110 miles ESE of the Cabo Verde Islands
- Moving W near 14 mph
- Maximum sustained winds are 65 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend 80 miles
- Strengthening is forecast over the next couple of days
- · Forecast to become a hurricane later today







Tropical Activity – Atlantic

FEMA

Potential Impacts

East Coast:

- Heavy congestion expected along evacuation corridors beginning early in the week, with road construction in some areas extending evacuation timeline
- Evacuees moving from one potentially impacted state to another can further increase congestion and slow evacuation times
- Limited lodging options expected along evacuation routes


Puerto Rico:

- Large numbers of recovery projects from 2017 underway, could be further damaged by storm slowing or halting previous progress
- PR developing COAs if Atlantic ports close

- North Carolina:
 - NC EOC at Normal Operations; increasing to Full Activation Sep 10
 - State of Emergency declared
- South Carolina:
 - SC EOC at Full Activation

 - o Considering healthcare evacuation to begin at 12:00 p.m. EDT
 - Considering coastal evacuations starting Monday morning, Sep 10



- RRCC at Enhanced Watch (24/7), increasing to Level III Sep 10 (7:00 a.m. EDT)

FEMA Region IV

- RWC at Enhanced Watch (dayshift)
- RRCC activating to Level II on Sep 10 (dayshift on Mon, 24/7 on Tue)
- LNOs deploying to NC and SC on Sep 10
- IMAT 1 deploying to NC today; IMAT 2 deploying to SC today
- FCO deploying to SC on Sep 10

FEMA HQ

- · NWC at Steady State
- NRCC at Enhanced Watch (24/7); increasing to Level II (24/7) Sep 11
- Region VIII IMAT deploying to FEMA HQ for redeployment as needed (ETA Sep 10)
- MERS deploying to NC and SC on Sep 10
- ISB Teams deploying to staging areas at Ft. Bragg, NC & Fort AP Hill, VA



Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



<u>Tropical Storm Paul</u> (Advisory #4 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- 635 miles SW of Baja California Peninsula
- Moving NW at 8 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend to 45 miles
- Gradual strengthening is forecast during the next couple of days, but slow weakening is expected to begin by Tuesday




Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific



Hurricane Olivia (CAT 1) (Advisory #35 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- 825 miles ENE of Hilo, HI
- Moving W at 16 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 80 mph
- Hurricane-force winds extend 30 miles
- Tropical storm force winds extend 115 miles
- Little change in strength forecast during the next couple of days
- Gradual weakening is possible on Tuesday, but Olivia will likely remain a threat to the Hawaiian Islands next week.
- No coastal watches or warnings in effect




Typhoon Mangkhut

Typhoon Mangkhut (Advisory #10 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located 500 miles ENE of Guam
- Moving W at 22 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 80.
- Tropical storm force winds extend 125 miles
- This motion is expected to continue through Tuesday, taking Mangkhut through the Mariana Islands Monday night
- Typhoon Warning remains in effect for Guam, Rota, Tinian, Saipan and adjacent coastal waters in the Mariana Islands





Tropical Activity – Pacific



Guam & CNMI:

- Governors declared a State of Emergency for Mangkhut
- Guam EOC at Partial Activation
- CNMI EOC monitoring; Condition of Readiness (COR 3) in place
- Shelters identified & opening Sep 10
- School and Government Offices closing Sep 10

Hawaii:

HI EOC at Partial Activation (previous incident)


FEMA Region IX:

- RWC at Normal Operations; continuing to monitor
- Region IX IMAT 1 in HI for previous activity
- LNOs deploying to Guam
- · Select ESFs deployed to HI
- Elements of Regions VII & X IMATs, with select ESF, ISB, and MERS support deployed to Guam & CNMI (ETA September 9)
- DCO-Guam/CNMI activated

Interagency:

- USCG set condition X-RAY for the Ports of Guam, Saipan, Rota,
 & Tinian
- USCG set condition WHISKEY for the Ports of Hawaii, Maui, & Honolulu counties












Precipitation / Excessive Rainfall Forecast







Fire Weather Outlook









6 - 10 Day Temperature Probability




6 - 10 Day Precipitation Probability


