Significant Activity – Sep 26-27



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Significant Events: Hurricane Florence Response / Recovery

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic – Tropical Storm Kirk; Disturbance 1: High (90%)
- Eastern Pacific – Hurricane Rosa; Disturbance 1: Medium (70%)
- Central Pacific –Disturbance 1: High (70%)
- Western Pacific – No activity affecting U.S. interests

Significant Weather:

- Strong to severe thunderstorms possible – Mid-Atlantic to the Northeast
- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible – Southern Plains north across the Appalachians
- Elevated fire weather – ID & WY
- Red Flag Warnings – WY

Declaration Activity:

- Amendment No. 3 to FEMA-4394-DR-SC
- Amendment No. 1 to FEMA-3404-EM-HI
- Amendment No. 3 to FEMA-4366-DR-HI

Florence (FINAL)



Situation: Operations transitioning to JFOs supporting DRs 4393 NC & 4394 SC

Impacts:

Safety & Security:

NC: 12 counties remain under varying types of evacuation orders as flood waters crest and continue to recede

SC: Some local evacuations remain in effect; no current state ordered evacuation

Food, Water and Shelter:

NC: 21 (-1) shelters open with 1,460 (-90) occupants (ARC Midnight Shelter Report, 4:37 a.m. EDT)

SC: 9 shelters open with 205 (-2) occupants (ARC Midnight Shelter Report, 4:37 a.m. EDT)

Health and Medical: 45 confirmed fatalities in NC & SC

Energy:

- Negligible power outages reported; states are no longer tracking
- NC: Wilmington area reports 32% stations without fuel (Brunswick/New Hanover counties) and Greenville-New Bern-Washington area reports 22% (Pitt/Beaufort/Craven Counties)

Transportation:

- NC: 295 Primary and secondary roads remain closed; I-40 has reopened
- SC: 154 roads closed; all interstates reopened; efforts continue to protect critical transportation routes

Hazardous Waste:

- NC: 15 waste water facilities within 24 affected counties are partially operational

Response:

FEMA HQ

- NWC Enhanced Watch (Day shift) for U.N. General Assembly
- National IMAT East-1 deployed to NC EOC
- Composite IMAT deployed to SC EOC
- MERS assets deployed
- Region I and VIII IMATs deployed to NC EOC

Region IV

- RRCC transitions to Normal Ops at 10:00 a.m. EDT; RWC at Steady State
- IMAT 1 deployed to NC; IMAT 2 deployed to SC
- LNOs deployed to NC & SC
- DCO/DCE deployed to NC & SC
- US&R – Staged: 1 – Type 3; 3 – MRP Water Rescue

North Carolina (FEMA-4393-DR-NC & 3401-EM-NC):

- EOC at Full Activation; State of Emergency declared
- US&R: Red IST, 1 – Type 3

South Carolina (FEMA-4394-DR-SC & FEMA-3400-EM-SC):

- EOC at Full Activation; State of Emergency declared
- US&R: 2 – Type 1; 2 MRP Water Rescue; 1 HEPP

Tennessee & Kentucky: EOCs at Monitoring (EMAC support)

Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



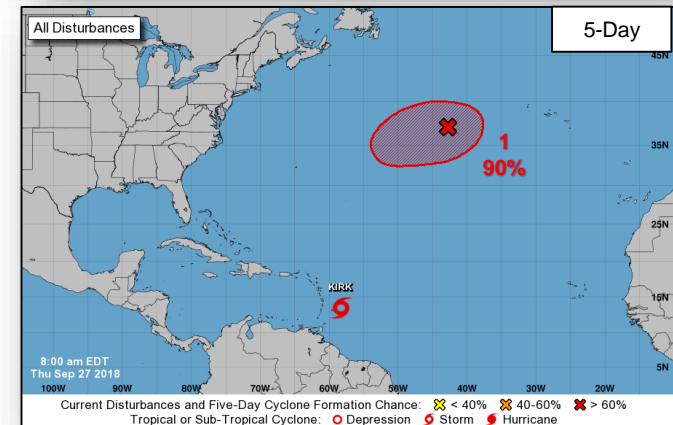
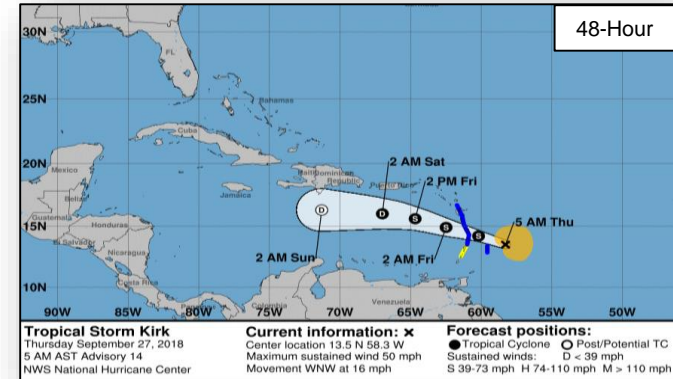
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Tropical Storm Kirk (Advisory #14A as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- 60 miles ENE of Barbados
- Moving WNW at 16 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 50 mph
- Tropical Storm Warning in effect for Barbados, St. Lucia, Dominica, Martinique & Guadeloupe; Watch in effect for St. Vincent & the Grenadines
- Tropical-Storm force winds extend 140 miles

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Post-Tropical Cyclone Leslie is several hundred miles W of the Azores
- Remains powerful non-tropical low with hurricane-force winds
- Expected to become subtropical storm or a tropical storm later today or Friday
- Formation chance through 48 hours: High (90%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (90%)



Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific

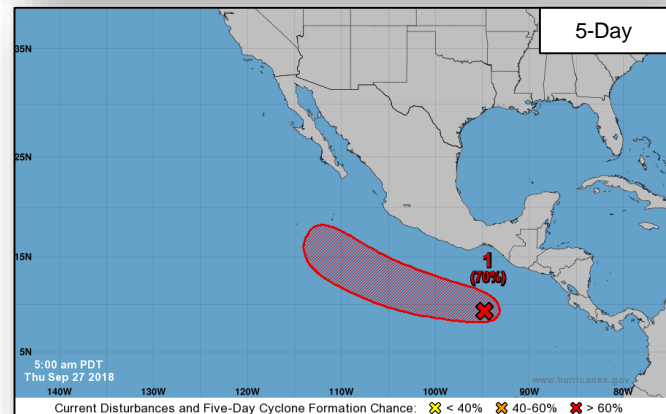


Hurricane Rosa (Advisory #9 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- 630 miles WSW of Puerto Vallarta Mexico
- Moving W at 12 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 85 mph
- No coastal watches or warnings in effect

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Located a few hundred miles S of the southern coast of Mexico
- Likely to form over the weekend or early next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (40%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (70%)

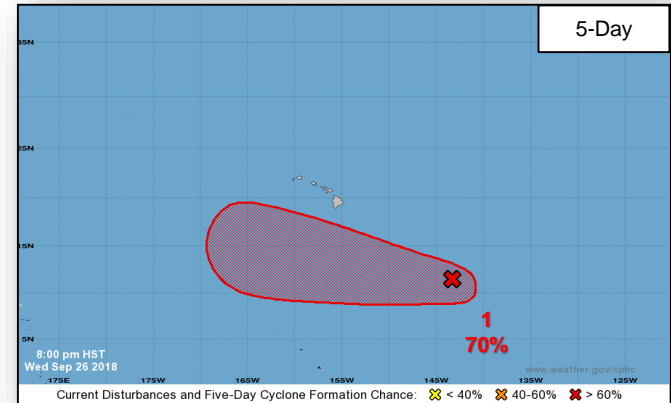
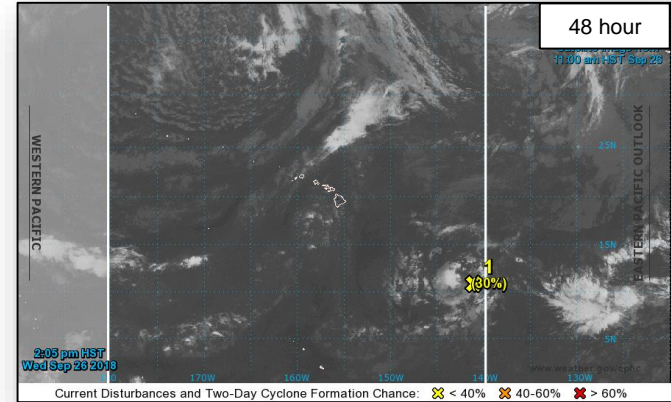


Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific

Flood Depth Overview



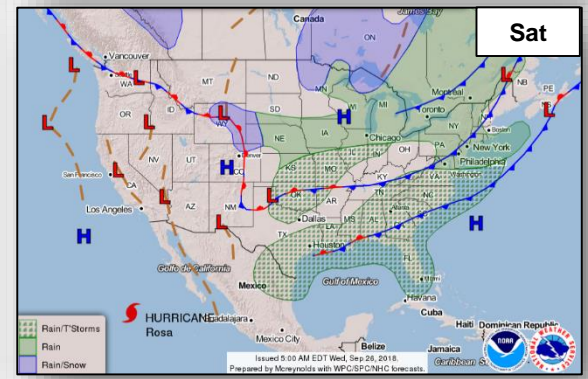
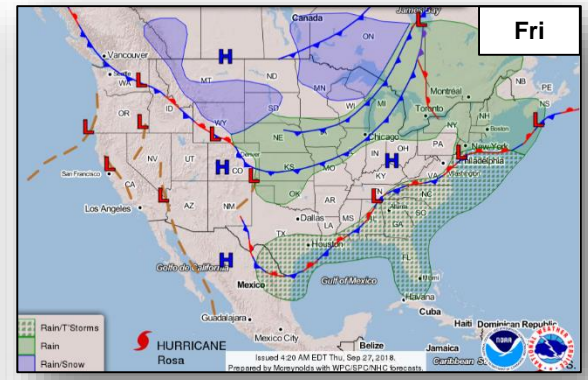
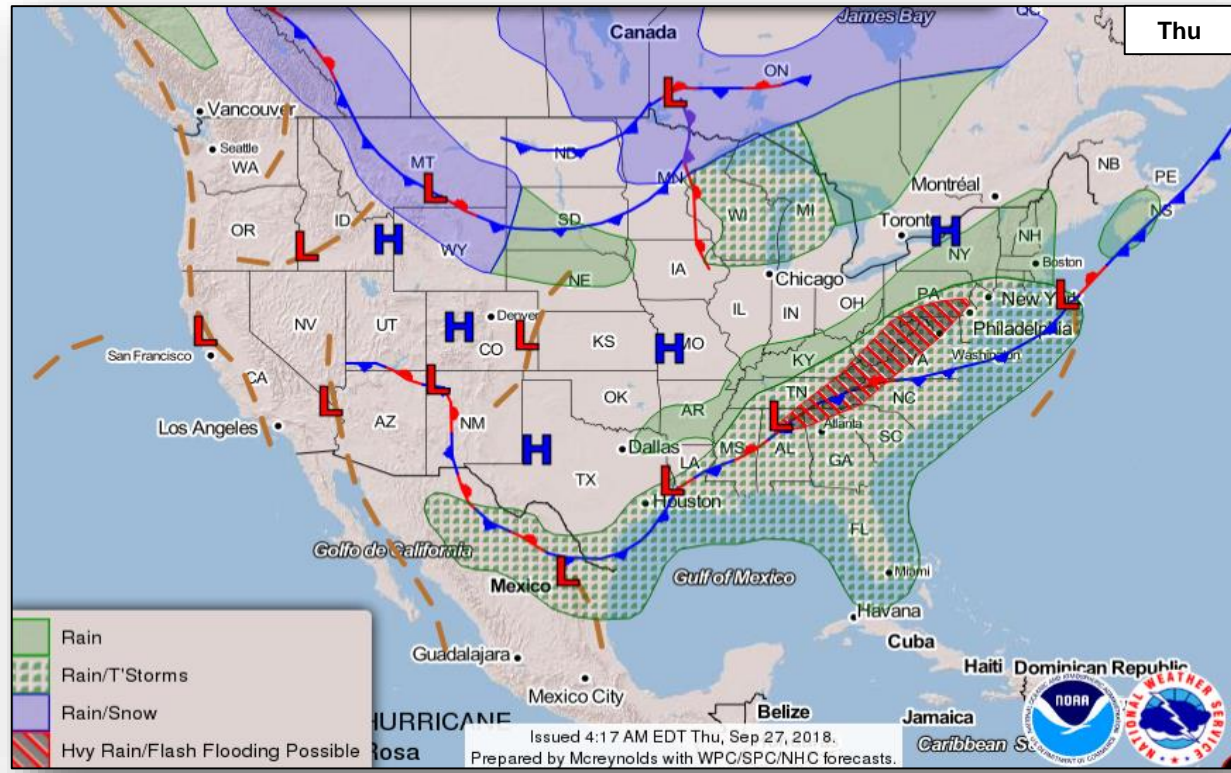

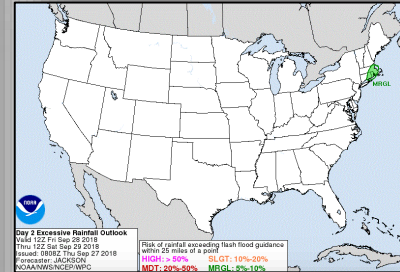
Precipitation / Excessive Rainfall Forecast



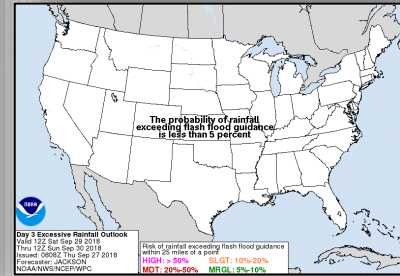
