SITUATION	A River Flood Warning remains in effect for the Chipola River in Calhoun County until Friday afternoon. A second crest back in moderate flood stage is expected Thursday morning which will likely impact some homes downstream from Altha and in Scott's Ferry. All other rivers are below flood stage and are receding. There is no tropical development expected over the next five days.
WEATHER	A weak cold front will move through North Florida tonight. This will result in lower temperatures and humidity for tomorrow. High temperatures will be in the lower 80s with breezy winds out of the northeast at 10-15 mph. Humidity will be lower and there will be no chance of rainfall across the Panhandle and Big Bend. Overnight Thursday, temperatures will fall into the middle and upper 60s across North Florida. Clear skies are expected and a light breeze will continue overnight, especially near the coast. Fog development is not expected.

LIFELINES

- Energy
 - Electric utility workers, contractors and mutual aid continue restoring electric service to the impacted areas. Utilities report more than 17,299 work force, contract and mutual aid restoration crew numbers mobilized to staging areas and into field work performing restorations to ensure critical services and facilities remain operational.
- Communications
 - Telecommunication industry partners are restoring service with priority for critical facilities, such as medical facilities, local Emergency Operations Centers and 9-1-1 dispatch.
- Transportation
 - Cut and toss operations along state roads and bridge inspections are complete in all counties. Maintenance crews continue emergency roadway repairs and critical signal restoration. FDOT will, at the county’s voluntary request and limited to fiscally constrained counties, take on the responsibility for each county’s existing pre-storm emergency debris removal contract.
- Safety and Security (supporting)
 - Clearing debris from roadways and restoring telecommunications, electricity and fuel to first responders and critical lifeline facilities (public safety, medical, drinking water, wastewater, and commercial resources).

7. General/Safety Message			
Downed power lines are dangerous. Never touch them. Always assume that a fallen power line is live, and follow these guidelines: Avoid touching the downed line with your hand or an object, such as a stick, broom or pole. Avoid touching anything, such as a car, object or equipment, or anyone who is in contact with a fallen power line. Avoid driving over a fallen power line. Call 911 immediately to report a fallen power line. If your vehicle comes in contact with a downed power line, follow these safety rules: Stay inside your car. The ground around your car may be energized. Sound the horn, roll down your window and call for help. Warn others to stay away. Anyone who touches the equipment or ground around your car can be injured. Use your mobile phone to call 911. Wait until the fire department, police or PG&E workers tell you it's safe to get out of your car before exiting the vehicle. If your car is in contact with a fallen power line and a fire starts, follow these guidelines when exiting your vehicle: Remove loose items of clothing. Keep your hands at your sides and jump clear of the vehicle, so you are not touching the car when your feet hit the ground. Keep both feet close together and shuffle away from the vehicle without picking up your feet.

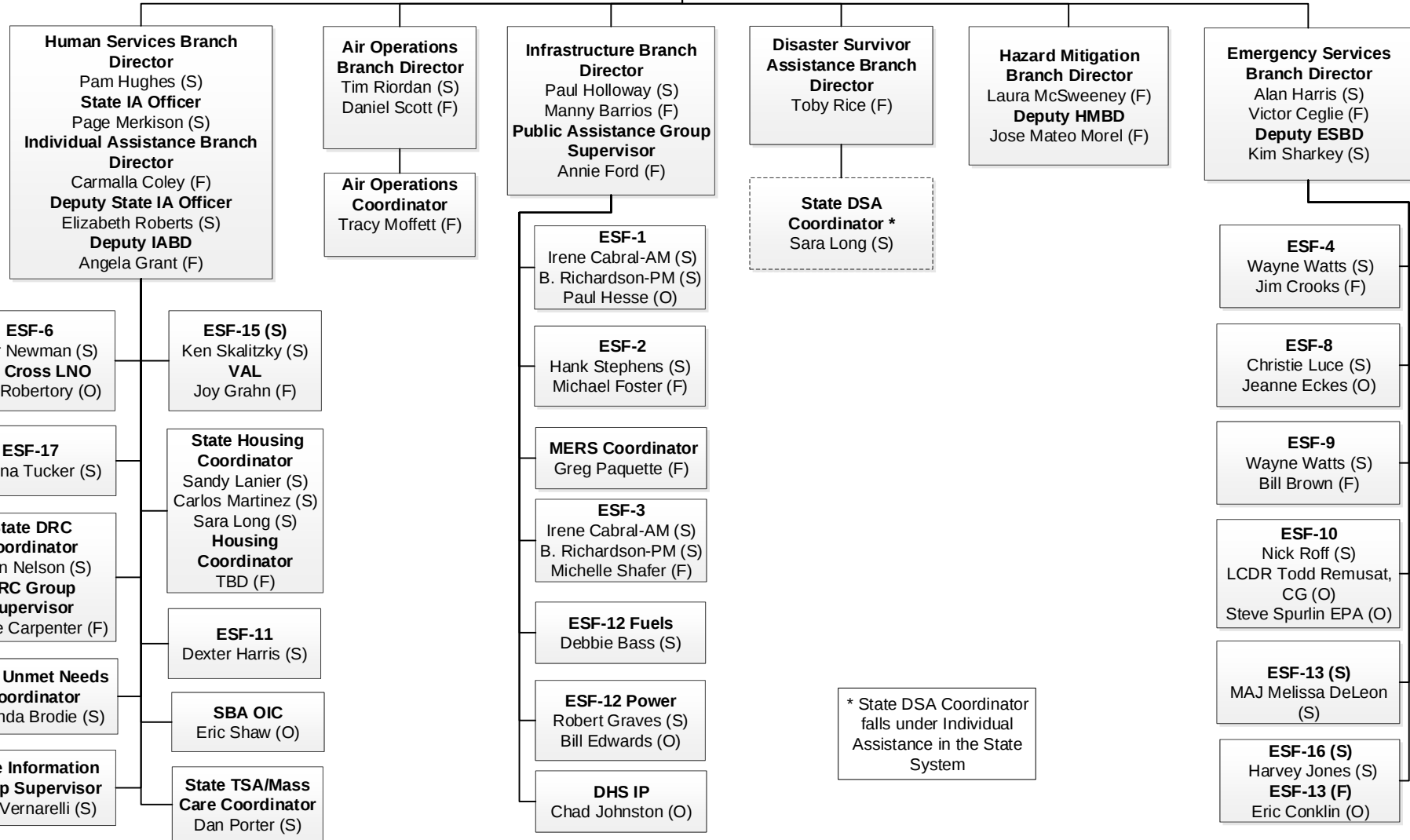

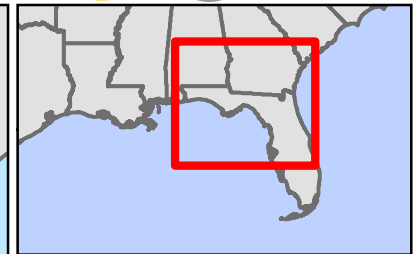

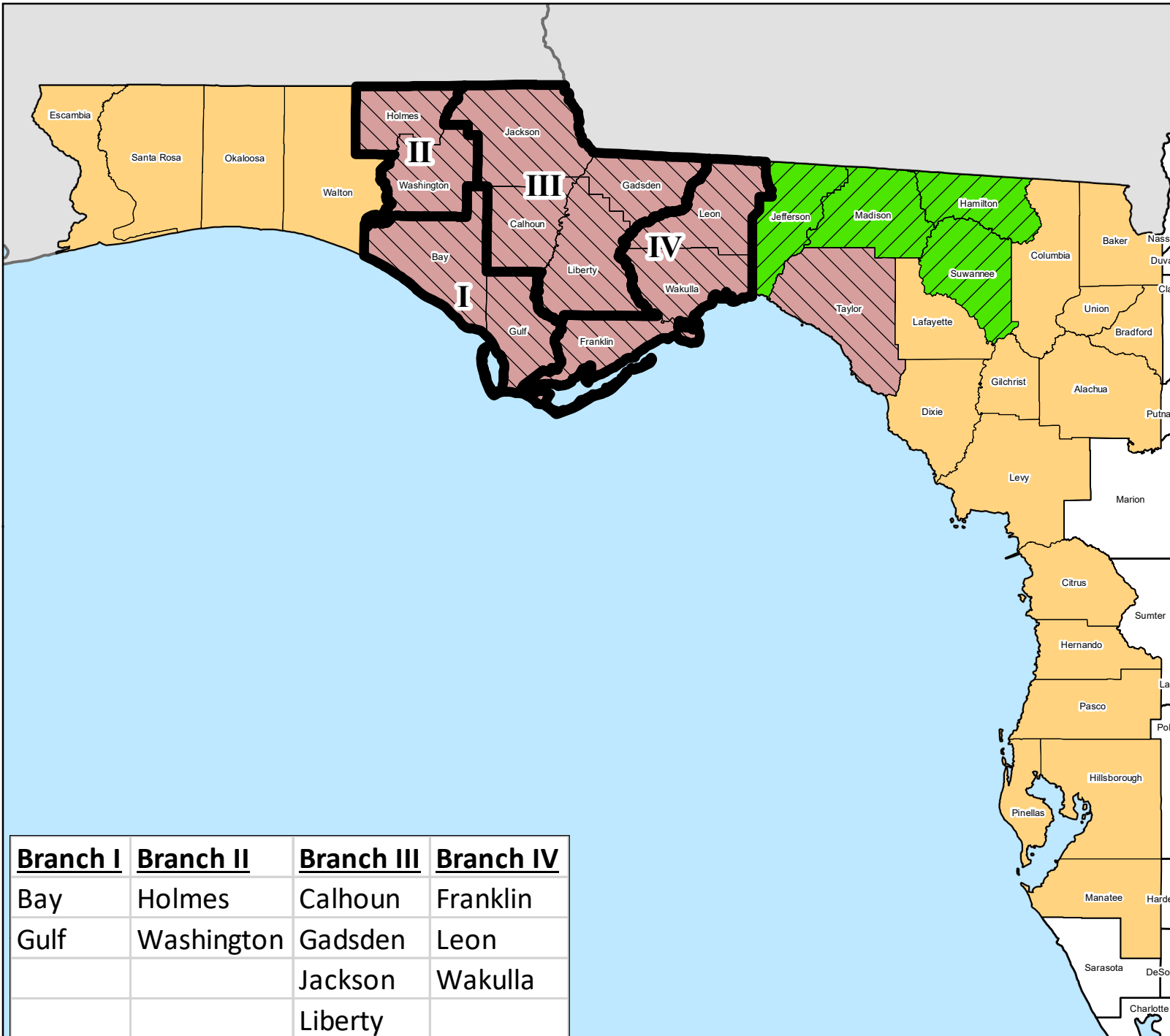

Road debris can be extremely dangerous to motorists. Especially so on roadways where cars travel at high speeds and have less time to react to objects in the road.

Plan your route and check road conditions before travelling to damaged areas.

Before traveling make sure tires are properly inflated. Tires need to have ample tread to properly grip roads.

Always wear your seatbelt!

Drivers should continually search the road ahead for debris.

Don't tailgate! By leaving at least 3 to 4 seconds of following distance, you can see potential objects in the road ahead.

If you see you are about to make contact with debris, safely reduce your speed as much as possible prior to making contact.

When driving at dusk and dawn be especially alert for animals or debris on or near the roadway.

Be aware of open space around your vehicle. Drivers should maintain open space to the front and at least one side of their vehicle at all times. Should the need arise, a driver can steer into that open space to avoid contact with an object.

Report incidents, and road debris. If you have an Emergency situation, dial 911. Otherwise, use your cellular phone; dial *FHP (*347) to reach the Florida Highway Patrol station nearest you.

Not all damaged or destroyed road signs have been replaced; be prepared to yield to a pedestrian or another driver or to stop unexpectedly.

Obey all road closed signs. Just because you can't see road damage doesn't mean it is safe.

Treat any intersection with non-working traffic signals as an all-way stop. Be prepared to stop at every intersection.

Should you come upon a stopped emergency vehicle, Florida's Move Over law requires you to vacate the lane closest to the vehicle as soon as it is safe to do so.

If your vehicle or tires are damaged by hitting debris notify your supervisor and safety as soon as possible. Then place a call to the rental car company for roadside repair.

■ Never feed alligators – it's dangerous and illegal. When fed, alligators can overcome their natural wariness and learn to associate people with food. When this happens, some of these alligators have to be removed and killed.

■ Dispose of fish scraps in garbage cans at boat ramps and fish camps. Do not throw them into the water. Although you are not intentionally feeding alligators when you do this, the result can be the same.

■ Seek immediate medical attention if you are bitten by an alligator. Alligator bites can result in serious infections.

■ Observe and photograph alligators only from a distance. Remember, they're an important part of Florida's natural history as well as an integral component of aquatic ecosystems.

Living with Alligators

In Florida, the growing number of people living and recreating near water has led to a steady rise in the number of alligator-related complaints. The majority of these complaints relate to alligators being where they simply aren't wanted. Because of these complaints, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's Statewide Nuisance Alligator Program permits the killing of approximately 7,000 nuisance alligators each year. Using this approach, and through increased public awareness, the rate of alligator bites on people has remained constant despite the increased potential for alligator-human interactions as Florida's human population has grown.

Alligators are an important part of Florida's landscape and play a valuable role in the ecology of our state's wetlands. Alligators are predators and help keep other aquatic animal populations in balance. A better understanding of the facts and information presented in this brochure will help ensure that people and alligators can continue to coexist.

Alligators and People

Alligators are a fundamental part of Florida's wetlands, swamps, rivers and lakes, and they are found in all 67 counties. Florida continues to experience human population growth. Many new residents seek waterfront homes, resulting in increased interactions between people and alligators.

Although most Floridians understand that we have alligators living in our state, the potential for conflict exists. Because of their predatory nature, alligators may target pets and livestock as prey. Unfortunately, people also are occasionally bitten. Since 1948, Florida has averaged about five unprovoked bites per year. During that period, a little more than 300 unprovoked bites to people have been documented in Florida, with 22 resulting in deaths.

In the past 10 years, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission has received an average of nearly 16,000 alligator-related complaints per year. Most of these complaints deal with alligators occurring in places such as backyard ponds, canals, ditches and streams, but other conflicts occur when alligators wander into garages, swimming pools and golf course ponds. Sometimes, alligators come out of the water to bask in the sun or move between wetlands. In many cases, if left alone, these alligators will eventually move on to areas away from people.

Safety Tips

■ Generally, alligators less than four feet in length are not large enough to be dangerous unless handled. However, if you encounter any alligator that you believe poses a threat to people, pets or property,

call the Nuisance Alligator Hotline at 866-FWC-GATOR (866-392-4286). Please be aware, nuisance alligators are killed, not relocated.

■ Be aware of the possibility of alligators when you are in or near fresh or brackish water. Bites may occur when people do not pay close enough attention to their surroundings when working or recreating near water.

■ Do not swim outside of posted swimming areas or in waters that might be inhabited by large alligators.

■ Alligators are most active between dusk and dawn. Therefore, avoid swimming at night.

■ Dogs and cats are similar in size to the natural prey of alligators. Don't allow pets to swim, exercise or drink in or near waters that may contain alligators. Dogs often attract an alligator's interest, so do not swim with your dog.

■ Leave alligators alone. State law prohibits killing, harassing or possessing alligators. Handling even small alligators can result in injury.
