Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic: No activity affecting U.S. interests
- Eastern Pacific: No significant activity affecting U.S. interests
- Central Pacific: No significant activity affecting U.S. interests
- Western Pacific: No significant activity affecting U.S. interests

Significant Weather:

- Flooding and Severe Weather Central U.S.
- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible LA to the Carolinas
- Severe thunderstorms possible Northern Plains

Situation:

Major flood levels expected to continue across the Midwest and Great Lakes regions for weeks.

Lifeline Impacts:

Safety and Security

- Levee breaches reported in IA, MO, IL, LA, and AR
- LA: Morganza Control Structure opening delayed indefinitely Food, Water & Sheltering:
- 24 (-2) shelters open / 397 (-70) occupants (ARC Shelter report June 7)
 - o AR: 8 (-1) / 142 (-18)
 - o OK: 3 (-1) / 69 (-29) o OH: 3 / 77 (-13)
 - LA: 1 / 16 MO: 8 / 106 (+3)
 - o TX: 1 / 0 (-6)
- Mandatory & voluntary evacuations: IL, OK, KS, MO, AR, & OH

Health & Medical

- Fatalities / Injuries:
 - o AR: 1/0 o OH: 1/7
 - OK: 6 / numerous
 KS: 3 / 56 (+2)
 - LA: 1 (+1) / 5 (+5) MO: 9 / 20

Transportation

- USCG closed portions of the Mississippi, Arkansas and Illinois Rivers
- Amtrak, Union Pacific and BNSF services suspended in some impacted areas; Freight cargo is being rerouted

Hazardous Materials

 27 AR wastewater treatment plants impacted; 3 inoperable, 2 threatened, 22 operable

Response:

State/Local

- Full Activation: KS and AR EOCs
- · Partial Activation: OH, and IL EOCs
- · Monitoring: MO, LA, and OK EOCs
- TX EOC returned to Normal Operations
- IL, IA, MO, KS, OK, and AR National Guard activated



 - RWC: Enhanced Watch (day shift only)
 - IMAT: Deployed (supporting EM-3412-KS)




Lower Mississippi Flood Forecast







National Weather Forecast











Precipitation Forecast












Severe Weather Outlook










Hazards Outlook – June 9-13









