Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic – No activity affecting U.S. interests
- Eastern Pacific – [Tropical Depression One-E](#) - no threat to U.S. interests
- Central Pacific – No activity affecting U.S. interests
- Western Pacific – No activity affecting U.S. interests

Significant Weather:

- Severe thunderstorms possible – Northern Intermountain to Upper Mississippi Valley
- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible – Northern Plains to Middle Mississippi Valley




Tropical Depression One-E (Advisory #3 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT)

- 360 miles SW of Manzanillo, Mexico
- Moving WNW at 15 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Expected to become a tropical storm later today
- Forecast to begin weakening on Thursday
- No threat to U.S. interests




Upper & Middle Mississippi River Flooding Updates

- **Moderate to Major** Flooding continues along the **Missouri and Illinois Rivers** and many tributaries. Additional rainfall over the past week has renewed crests and prolonged forecasted falls.
- **Moderate to Major** Flooding continues along the mainstem of the **Mississippi River**. Slower recessions are expected due to the flooding along the Missouri and Illinois Rivers this past week.
- All points in the Upper and Middle **Mississippi River** should fall below **Major** by the end of this week.
- **Moderate** Flooding continues along the Ohio River and its tributaries




Lower Mississippi River Flooding Updates


- **Major** flooding is occurring along the **Mississippi River at Cape Girardeau** and forecast to fall to **Moderate** flood early next week.
- **Major** flooding is occurring and forecast to continue for the foreseeable future along the **Mississippi River at Baton Rouge, LA**.
- Rainfall projected over the next week is not expected to not have a significant impact to current forecasts.
- Flows will remain elevated well into July.



