The Department is seeking qualified peer reviewers who have expertise and experience in issues related to: school climate, school safety, multitiered systems of support or frameworks, school turn-around, school administration, violence prevention, children and trauma, conflict resolution, mental health, posttraumatic



stress, grant administration and implementation, program evaluation, curriculum design and implementation, and rural education programs.

These reviews will utilize the Department's G5 system, a web-based tool that allows peer reviewers to complete online reviews. Reviewers complete the online technical review forms for the applications reviewed and then take part in 2-3 teleconferences for group discussions with other peer reviewers. Reviewers will read approximately 8-10 applications. Although reviewers will participate from their homes or offices, the reviewer's schedule should be free of all other responsibilities during the scheduled conference calls. Reviewers will be provided with instructions needed to complete the review via the G5 system as well as a detail review schedule once they are confirmed by the Department. Interested reviewers should be sure to do the following:

1- Make sure you have an active, updated account in G5 (<u>www.g5.gov</u>). Be sure to update your resume and make sure your email address is accurate.

Learn About Hurricane Michael Recovery Advisories from the FEMA Mitigation Assessment Team (MAT)

Hurricane Michael's flooding and high-winds in 2018 resulted in extensive damage to all types of buildings in the Florida panhandle. FEMA recently released Hurricane Michael Recovery Advisories (RAs) and has scheduled three webinar sessions in August to discuss the advisories. These RAs are intended to assist various stakeholders in rebuilding more resiliently by providing design and construction guidance to help minimize damage from future storm events. Registration is required for these webinars.
