## National Current Operations & Monitoring



#### **Significant Incidents or Threats:**

- Heavy Rain and Flash Flooding possible Southern Rockies and Southwest
- Critical Fire Weather Conditions NV, UT, and HI

#### **Tropical Activity:**

- Atlantic: Disturbance 1: Low (20%)
- Eastern Pacific: Disturbance 1: Medium (40%); Disturbance 2: Low (10%)
- Central Pacific: No new tropical cyclones expected during the next five days
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests



#### **Disturbance 1** (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- 100 miles S of Cuba
- Moving W
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)

### Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific




#### Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- 1,000 miles SW of southern tip of Baja California peninsula
- Tropical depression could form during the next several days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (30%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (40%)

#### Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- 1,500 miles WSW of southern tip of Baja California peninsula
- Slight development possible during the next day or two
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (10%)


