National Current Operations & Monitoring



Significant Incidents or Threats: Super Typhoon Hagibis

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic: Disturbance 1: Medium (40%); Disturbance 2: Low (30%); Disturbance 3: Low (10%)
- Eastern Pacific: No new tropical cyclones expected during the next five days
- Central Pacific: No new tropical cyclones expected during the next five days
- Western Pacific: No new tropical cyclones expected to threaten the islands


Declaration Activity: Declaration Approved for CNMI and South Dakota

Typhoon Hagibis

Super Typhoon Hagibis CAT 5 (Warning #13 as of 5:00 a.m. EDT;

7:00 p.m. CHST)

- 310 miles NW of Saipan; 360 NNW of Guam
- Moving NW at 15 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 155 mph
- Moving away from the Marianas toward the NW
- Typhoon-force winds extend out up to 85 miles
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend out up to 300 miles
- Typhoon Warning in effect for Alamagan and Pagan
- Damaging winds for Alamagan and Pagan



ChST: EDT + 14hrs (0830 EDT = 2230 ChST) Hawaii: EDT - 6hrs (0830 EDT = 0230 HST)



Typhoon Hagibis – Lifelines & Response



Impacts:

Safety and Security:

- CNMI: Schools and government offices closed (FEMA Region IX Update)
- CNMI: People in tents from Yutu have transitioned into shelters; Fire and Medical Services assisted residents in breaking down tents and securing personal belongings (DFEMS Website)

Food, Water, Shelter:

- Saipan:
 - Water system restoration concurrent with electrical restoration (FEMA Region IX)
 - Precautionary "Boil Water" notice has been issue per CNMI Bureau of Environmental Quality (BECQ) policy
 - 7 of 14 tanks meet chloritization levels the remainder are being chlorinated by crews (FEMA Region IX)
- Shelters: Saipan: 3 (-10) shelters open with 166 (-296) occupants (*FEMA Region IX*) *Health and Medical:*
- Commonwealth Healthcare Corporation: well stocked and prepared with generator fuel topped off with 2-weeks supply; water tanks also have 2-weeks supply (CHCC Website)

Transportation:

- Road: Department of Public Works continued to clear drainage areas as long as possible to minimize impacts
- Air: All Airports returned to Normal Operations
- Sea: Saipan and Guam: Port Condition WHISKEY (Open with restrictions) (FEMA Region IX)

Energy:

• Saipan: Island wide power outage re-energization on-going; USACE mission assigned to support power restoration (FEMA Region IX)

Response

- CNMI EOC at Full Activation; Governor declared a state of emergency
 - o FEMA-3424-EM-CNMI approved
- Guam EOC returned to Normal Operations
- Region IX IMAT-2 deployed to Saipan
- Region IX Movement Control Center activated
- Bothell MERS in Guam awaiting forward movement
- CNMI Long Term Recovery Office is closed until after the storm passes
- FEMA ISB teams enroute to Guam
- NWC and Region IX RWC remains at Steady State, continues to monitor



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)


- Over the central Atlantic between Bermuda and the Azores
- Moving W
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (40%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (40%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Over the western Atlantic between the southeast coast of the U.S. and Bermuda
- Moving NW
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)

Disturbance 3 (as of 8:00 a.m. EDT)

- Low pressure system moving across the southern FL peninsula
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (10%)





Precipitation Forecast






