<u>Situation:</u> FEMA and HHS continue leading the multiagency COVID-19 Response / Recovery efforts. 37,399 FEMA, DoD, HHS, VA, and CDC personnel deployed / activated; 2,656 FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide testing: 22,418,881 (+367,990) cumulative as of June 12


Walter Reed Army Institute of Research selected a lead COVID-19

Transportation

 USCG is currently monitoring 73 commercial vessels having embarked from a COVID-19 port of interest within 14 days and have a scheduled arrival in a U.S. port within the next 96 hours, 19 of which will arrive in the next 24 hours (USCG Update, June 11)


Response:

Tropical Outlook – Five Day











National Weather Forecast






Precipitation






Long Range Outlooks – June 20-24






6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability


