National Current Operations & Monitoring



Significant Incidents or Threats:

- Severe Thunderstorms possible Plains and Middle / Upper Mississippi Valleys
- Heavy Rain and Flash Flooding possible Plains and Upper Mississippi Valley
- Bush Fire AZ
- COVID-19

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic: Disturbance 1 Low (20%)
- Eastern Pacific: Disturbance 1 Low (30%); Disturbance 2 Medium (40%); Disturbance 3 Low (30%)
- Central Pacific No new tropical cyclones expected during the next five days

Situation:


The Bush fire began on Jun 13 and is burning in Maricopa and Gila counties (pop. 2,000). Local residential power distribution, residential services, and municipal water supply threatened in and around Tonto Basin and nearby communities; winds blowing the fire toward threatened homes. AZ State Routes 87, 88, and 188 are closed.

State / Local Response:

- AZ EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19)
- Mandatory evacuations for 1,700 residents in and around Apache Lake, Sunflower, Tonto Basin, Punkin Center, Pioneer Pass, and Brownsville
- American Red Cross Shelters established at Payson Police Department and Lee Kornegay Intermediate School

FEMA / Federal Response:

- FMAG approved on Jun 20
- FEMA NWC and Region IX RWC at Steady State; monitoring

<u>Situation:</u> FEMA and HHS continue to lead the COVID-19 Response / Recovery efforts. 36,580 Federal employees deployed / activated; 2,520 FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide Testing: 26,500,497 cumulative as of June 19.

Lifelines Impacts:

Health and Medical


- AZ: The White Mountain Apache Tribe reports over 1,300 cases in a population of 12,000 (10.8%); increasing testing capacity remains top priority and the Tribe is working with Indian Health Service and Bureau of Indian Affairs to identify / refine strategies
- FL: Gainesville has 251 new cases over the past 7 days (+210%); 46% of all cases in the county are between 15-34 years of age; county is considering stricter social distancing guidelines

Medical Care

 NC: Three consecutive days of record high hospitalization rates;
20% of hospital beds and 22% of intensive care unit beds available

Energy

 U.S. demand for transportation fuels increased for the week ending June 12; demand continues to remain below the seasonal 5-year average by 18% for gasoline, 11% for diesel and 56% for jet fuel



Response:


- NRCC at Level I; Region I and II RRCCs at Level II; Region III, IV, V, VI and X RRCCs at Level III; Region VII, VIII and IX RRCCs are rostered, COVID-19 response being worked from the Virtual JFOs
- NWC and all RWCs and MOCs at Steady State; monitoring

Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located a few hundred miles off the east coast of NC
- This system could briefly acquire some subtropical characteristics
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (20%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)



Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- 1000 miles southwest of the southern tip of the Baja California Peninsula
- Slow development possible during the next few days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located several hundred miles south of the southwestern coast of Mexico
- Some gradual development possible through the middle of next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (20%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (40%)


Disturbance 3 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Another area of disturbed weather is forecast to form south of the coast of Mexico by the middle of next week
- Slow development possible through the middle of next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)











National Weather Forecast










Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall















Long Range Outlooks – June 25-29





6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability




