National Current Operations & Monitoring



Significant Incidents or Threats:

- COVID-19
- Earthquakes Puerto Rico (M4.8 and M4.4)
- Severe thunderstorms possible Northern Plains, Upper Mississippi Valley, Ohio Valley, Mid-Atlantic,
 Northeast
- Heavy rain and flash flooding possible Upper Mississippi Valley; Ohio Valley to Mid-Atlantic
- Critical Fire Weather Central Great Basin to Southwest and Central Rockies

Tropical Activity:

- Atlantic:
 - Disturbance 1 Low (20%)
 - Disturbance 2 Low (20%)
- Eastern Pacific:
 - Disturbance 1 Low (20%)
- Central Pacific: Post-Tropical Cyclone Boris FINAL
- Western Pacific: No activity affecting U.S. interests


Earthquakes—Puerto Rico FINAL



<u>Earthquakes – Puerto Rico</u>

- At 2:42 am ET, on June 28, M4.8 earthquake occurred 18 miles west of Ponce (pop 153k), PR at a depth of 7 miles
 - Green PAGER alert issued for shaking-related fatalities and damage
 - Level V on Modified Mercalli Intensity Scale (MMI) 66k exposed to moderate shaking; 579k exposed to light shaking
- At 2:45 a.m., on June 28, M4.4 earthquake occurred 18 miles west of Ponce (pop 153k), PR at a depth of 5 miles
 - Green PAGER alert issued for shaking-related fatalities and damage
 - Level VI on MMI 11k exposed to strong shaking, 59k exposed to moderate shaking
- No tsunami warning issued
- · Aftershocks continue
- No power outages or significant damages reported; power plant did not shut down; awaiting daylight for further assessments

Current Situation:

- Fire began on June 27 and is threatening the community of Avondale (affected pop 10k), approximately 20 miles west of Phoenix, AZ
- Threatening 150 homes
- No structures damaged or destroyed
- Mandatory evacuations for 150 homes
- No injuries or fatalities
- FMAG approved June 27

- AZ EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19)
- Region IX RWC at Steady State, continues to monitor
- NWC at Steady State, continues to monitor

Current Situation:

- Fire began June 27 and is threatening the communities of Black Springs, Golden Valley, and Seneca, NV (combined pop 4k), approximately 10 miles north of Reno, NV
- Threatening 4,000 homes, 200 businesses, a propane farm, and 345 kV lines
- Responders are unable to access Black Springs for assessment
- Mandatory evacuations for 1,000 homes
- No injuries or fatalities
- FMAG approved June 27

- NV EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19)
- Region IX RWC at Steady State, continues to monitor
- NWC at Steady State, continues to monitor



Tropical Outlook – Atlantic




Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 p.m. ET)

- Located several hundred miles west-southwest of the Cabo Verde Islands
- Some slow development possible over the next 2 to 3 days
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)

Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 p.m. ET)

- Expected to form of the southeastern coast of the U.S.
- Some development could occur as it moves northwest
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)




Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located a few hundred miles off the coast of southwestern Mexico
- Expected to move NW at 15 mph parallel to the coast of Mexico
- Some development is possible before it reaches cooler waters in the next day or so
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (20%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (20%)




Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific



Post-Tropical Cyclone Boris (Advisory #15 as of 11:00 p.m. ET) - FINAL

- Located 1,015 miles ESE of Hilo, HI
- Moving WSW at 8 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 30 mph
- Little change in strength is forecast during the next 48 hours; the remnant low is expected to dissipate in a couple of days
- This is the last Public Advisory issued by Central Pacific Hurricane Center on Boris

<u>Situation:</u> FEMA and HHS continue to lead the COVID-19 Response / Recovery efforts. 36,442 (+155) Federal employees deployed / activated; 2,518 (+17) FEMA employees deployed. Nationwide Testing: 30,110,061 (+770,304) cumulative (as of June 25).





- NWC, all RWCs, and MOCs at Steady State; monitoring




National Weather Forecast






Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Severe Weather Outlook









Fire Weather Outlook










6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability




