

Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



Tropical Storm Laura (Advisory #10A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 50 miles S of San Juan, Puerto Rico
- Moving W at 21 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph
- On the forecast track the center will move near or over portions of the Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico this morning, near or over the Hispaniola this afternoon and tonight, and near or over eastern Cuba Sunday and Sunday night
- Tropical Storm Warning in effect for Puerto Rico, Vieques, Culebra, USVI
- Tropical storm force winds extend outward 205 miles
- Expected to produce 3-6 inches of rain over Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands through Sunday. Maximum amounts up to 8 inches are possible along eastern portions and the southern slopes of Puerto Rico. This heavy rain could lead to flash and urban flooding, and an increased potential for mudslides with minor river flooding.



Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



Tropical Storm Marco (Advisory #8A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- 110 miles E of Cozumel, Mexico
- Moving NNW at 12 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 50 mph
- Additional strengthening is forecast, Marco could be near hurricane strength when it moves over the central Gulf of Mexico on Sunday night and early Monday
- On the forecast track the center will cross the northeastern part of the Yucatan Peninsula by early evening and move over the central Gulf of Mexico toward the northwestern Gulf on Sunday and Monday, followed by a track toward the northwestern Gulf coast on Tuesday
- Tropical storm force winds extend outward 70 miles




Tropical Outlook – Atlantic



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located between the west coast of Africa and the Cabo Verde Islands
- Additional development is unlikely to occur
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (10%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (10%)

Tropical Outlook – Eastern Pacific



Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Several hundred miles SSW of the southern tip of the Baja California peninsula, Mexico
- Forecast to move east for the next couple of days
- A Tropical depression is likely to form during the early to middle part of next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Medium (40%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: High (80%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Likely to form south of the Gulf of Tehuantepec early next week
- Moving slowly northwest or north, near or parallel to the southwestern coast of Mexico
- A tropical depression could form by the middle of next week
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (near 0%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Medium (50%)




Tropical Outlook – Central Pacific



Disturbance 1 (as of 2:00 .m. ET)

- The remnant low of Tropical Depression Ten-E, located 1,050 miles SE of Hilo, HI
- Moving slowly east and then north during the next couple of days
- Conditions are only marginally conducive for development
- Formation chance through 48 hours: Low (30%)
- Formation chance through 5 days: Low (30%)


Tropical Cyclones Laura and Marco threaten U.S. interests in the Caribbean and Gulf Coast.

State/Local Preparations/Response:

- PR EOC at Partial Activation; PR Governor requested an Emergency Declaration on August 21
- USVI EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19 and tropical storms)
- FL EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19 and tropical storms); Governor requested an Emergency Declaration on August 21
- LA EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19); Governor declared a state of emergency

Federal Preparations/Response:

- Region II RRCC at Level II (Full Activation) with select ESFs
 - IMAT deployed to USVI
 - LNO on standby to support USVI/PR
 - · Region X DCE available to deploy to USVI if needed
 - DCE deployed virtually to PR
- Region IV RWC is rostering an Enhanced Watch for activation if necessary
 - Region IV RRCC will go to Level III at 8:00 a.m. ET, August 24-27 (RNC)
 - IMAT-2 and LNO deployed to Tallahassee, FL
- Region VI RRCC at Level III (COVID-19); will go to Level II at 9:00 a.m. ET, August 23
 - IMAT-1 deploying to Austin TX on August 23
 - IMAT-2 deploying to Baton Rouge, LA on August 22
- NWC to Enhanced Watch (day shift only) on August 23
- NRCC to Level I, 24/7 on August 24
- Logistics HQ: Staging Management Team (SMT) Atlanta deploying to Craig Field, AL;
 SMT Fort Worth deploying to Roseland, LA on August 22
- MERS deployed to USVI (x2), FL, PR; will deploy to TX and LA on August 22
- IA and PA Cadres are on alert
- US&R Equipment Cache pre-positioned in PR



COVID-19 Update



<u>Situation:</u> Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 3 (-1) states, with 10 (+3) states in a plateau status, and 43 (-2) states on a downward trajectory. 23,110 (+141) Federal employees deployed / activated; 1,946 (-17) FEMA employees deployed.




National Weather Forecast











Severe Weather Outlook









Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall








