

FEMA COVID-19 Update

Key Messages

- On May 24, President Biden and Dr. Anthony Fauci participated in a [COVID-19 YouTube town hall](#) with several YouTube stars to answer questions about the COVID-19 vaccines and stress the importance of getting vaccinated.
- Working with state governments, FEMA will continue to provide federal support to community vaccination centers, including supplemental vaccine allocation to 15 pilot sites.
- There are 15 active or temporarily closed federal community vaccination center pilot sites and 114 mobile pop-up sites receiving supplemental vaccine allocations and other federal support. Additionally, there are 13 federal community vaccination center pilot sites that are receiving federal personnel support but are no longer receiving supplemental vaccine allocations. Eleven federal community vaccination center pilot sites and 68 mobile pop-up sites have completed the pilot program.
 - The federal community vaccination center pilot sites have administered more than 5.5 million vaccinations.
- Additionally, 14 mobile vaccination units are deployed to Arizona, Connecticut, Idaho, Maine, Maryland, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon and South Dakota. Two units are supporting the Indian Health Services mission to vaccinate tribal communities across the Great Plains.
 - The mobile units have delivered more than 48,800 vaccinations.
- Individuals interested in receiving the COVID-19 vaccine can visit [vaccines.gov](https://www.vaccines.gov) to find a location near them and make an appointment. Individuals can also text their zip code to 438829 to receive a text with the closest COVID-19 vaccine location. In addition, individuals can get a free ride to and from the COVID-19 vaccination centers from two ridesharing companies through July 4.
- FEMA is processing applications for [funeral assistance to provide financial assistance for COVID-19](#) related expenses.
- As of May 25, FEMA has received more than 197,300 funeral assistance registrations and approved more than \$71.6 million in assistance to individuals.
