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# National Current Ops / Monitoring

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## New Significant Incidents / Ongoing Ops

- Severe weather – Central Plains
- Wildfires – Southwest U.S.
- Southwest Border Coordination Support – Washington, DC
- COVID-19

## Hazard Monitoring

- Severe thunderstorms – Southern/Central Plains; Ohio Valley to Mid-Atlantic
- Critical fire weather – Southwest to Southern Plains

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## Disaster Declaration Activity

- FMAG approved – New Mexico

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# Severe Weather – Central Plains

## Current Situation:

Severe weather impacted the Central Plains overnight April 29 with high winds, large hail, and strong tornadoes. Preliminary reports of 19 tornadoes, 95 wind, and 60 hail reports (16 in KS, 3 in NE). A tornado was reported in Andover, KS (pop. 14,892) approx. 10 miles east of Wichita, KS (pop. 136,342) where damage was reported to structures. There are no requests for FEMA assistance; local jurisdictions are coordinating mutual aid and have not requested major KS DEM response support.

## Lifeline Impacts: (Region VII Incident Report as of 8:17 p.m. ET)

Lifelines remain stable. Damage assessments are ongoing, while damage may exceed initial estimates, response remains within state capabilities. Power outages have dropped to minimal levels.

## Safety and Security:

- Search and rescue operations have moved to rural areas outside of Andover, KS
- Damage assessments ongoing in Andover where 1,000 structures may be affected; 50-100 homes damaged in Sedgwick County; damage assessments and NWS surveys continue

## Food, Water, Shelter:

- 1 local shelter open in Andover, KS

## Health and Medical:

- 4 (-1) injuries in Andover, 2 (-1) in Sedgwick County (Wichita metro)

## Energy:

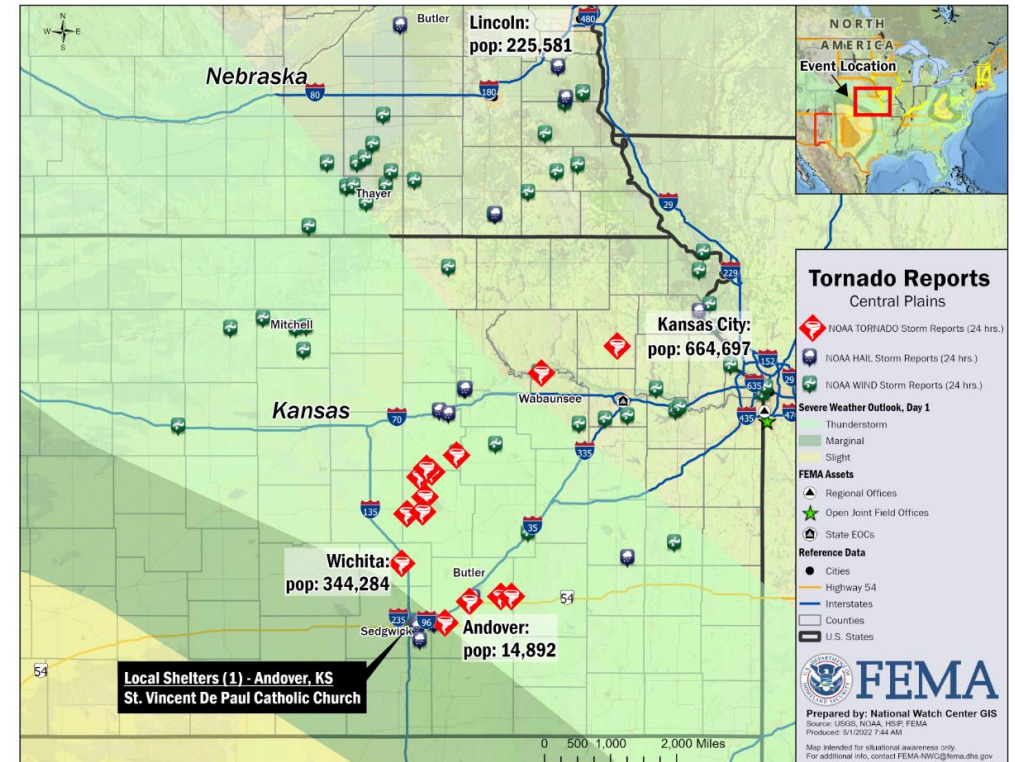
- Less than 1% of customers without power statewide in KS (peak 21k) (DOE Eagle-I as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

## Transportation:

- Eastbound lanes of Highway 54 in Andover have re-opened; westbound lanes remain closed

## Response:

- KS EOC at Monitoring (wildfires and severe weather); Governor declared a disaster emergency
- Region VII RWC and NWC are monitoring

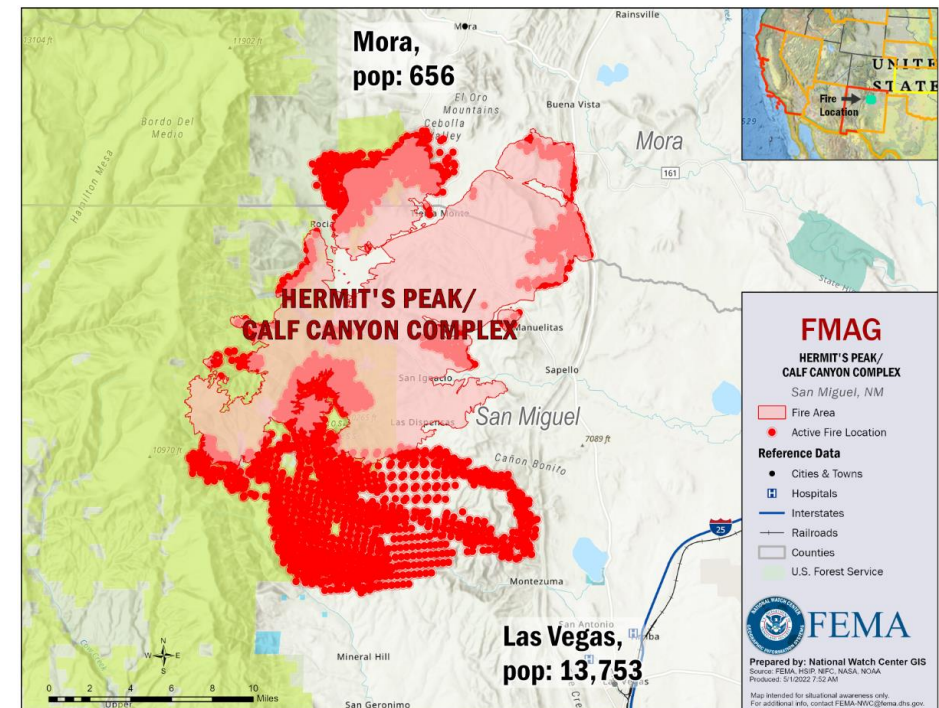

## Situation:

- Fire began on April 19; FMAG was initially denied, but Calf Canyon has now merged with the Hermit's Peak Fire and is now a complex
- Hermit's Peak fire received a FMAG previously and reporting was concluded due to the lifting of evacuations and 89% containment
- With the two fires now merged, reporting has begun again with the complex now called the Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon Complex and a FMAG was approved
- 1 shelter open with 24 occupants in San Miguel County (*ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 6:50 a.m. ET*)

## Response:

- FMAG FEMA-5438-FM-NM was approved April 30 for Calf Canyon Fire
- FMAG FEMA-5431-FM-NM was approved April 12 for Hermit's Peak Fire
- NM EOC at Full Activation (Wildfires)
- Region VI / Denton MOC and NWC continue to monitor

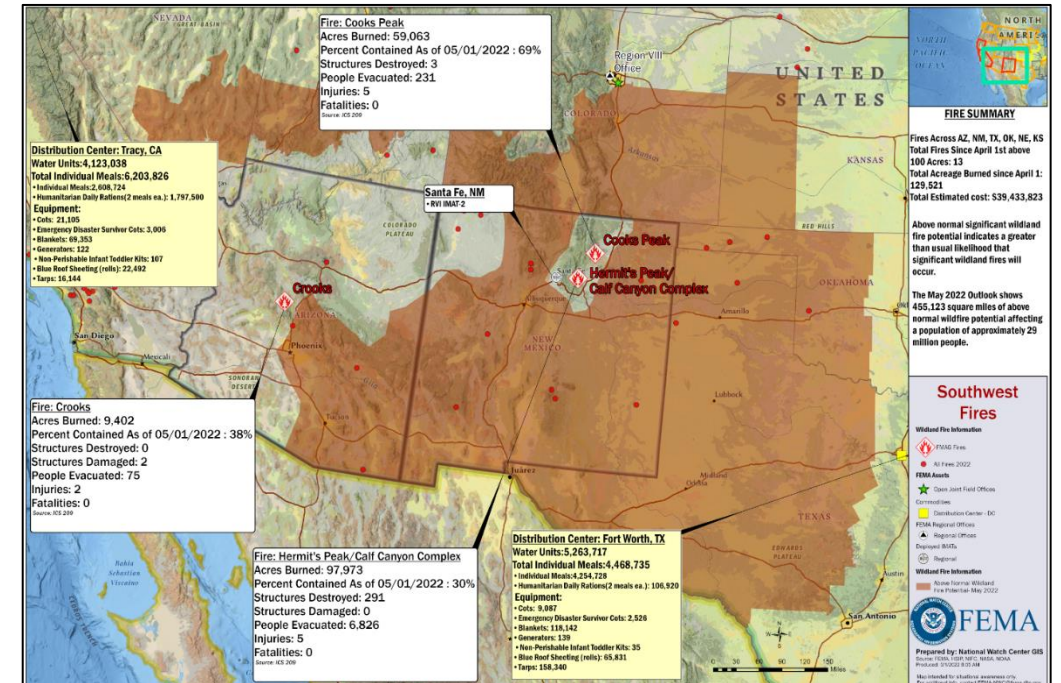

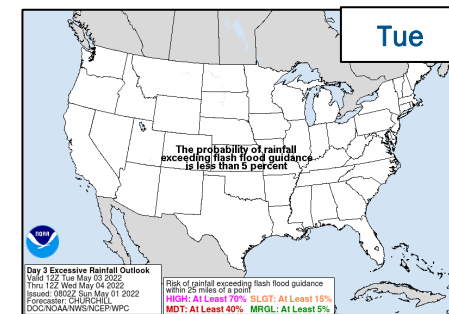
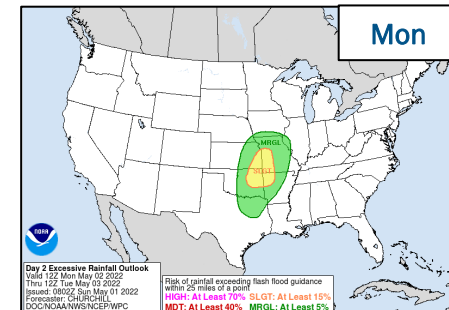
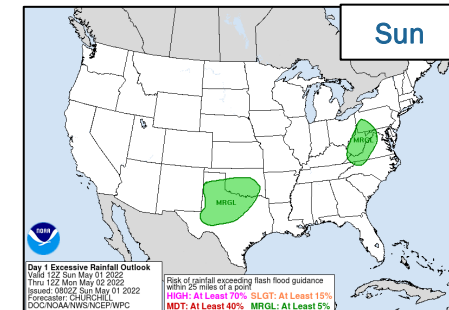
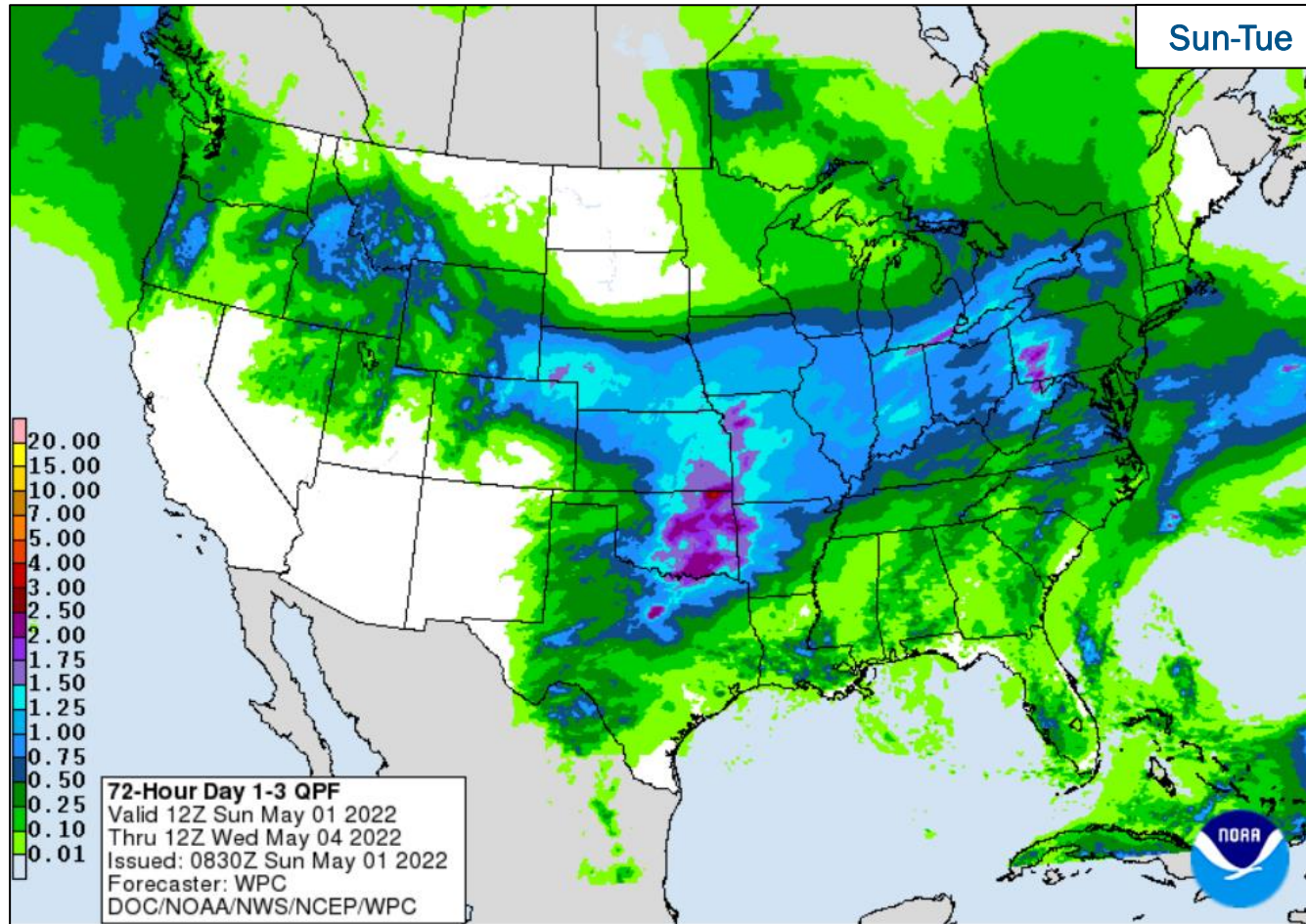


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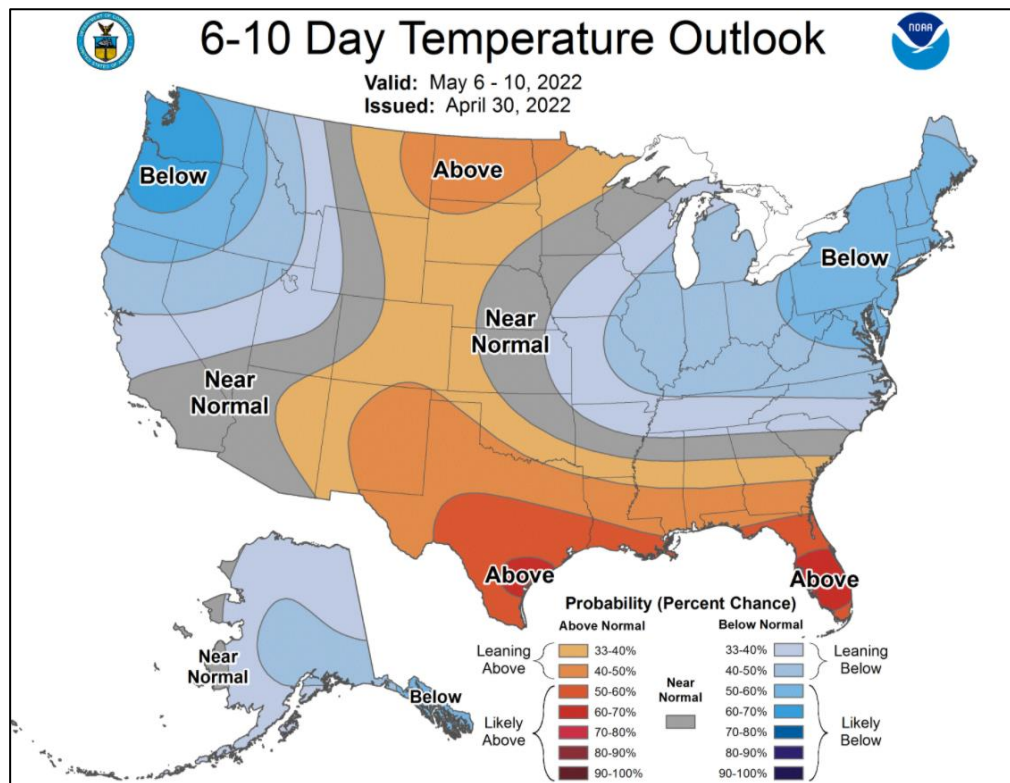
# Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



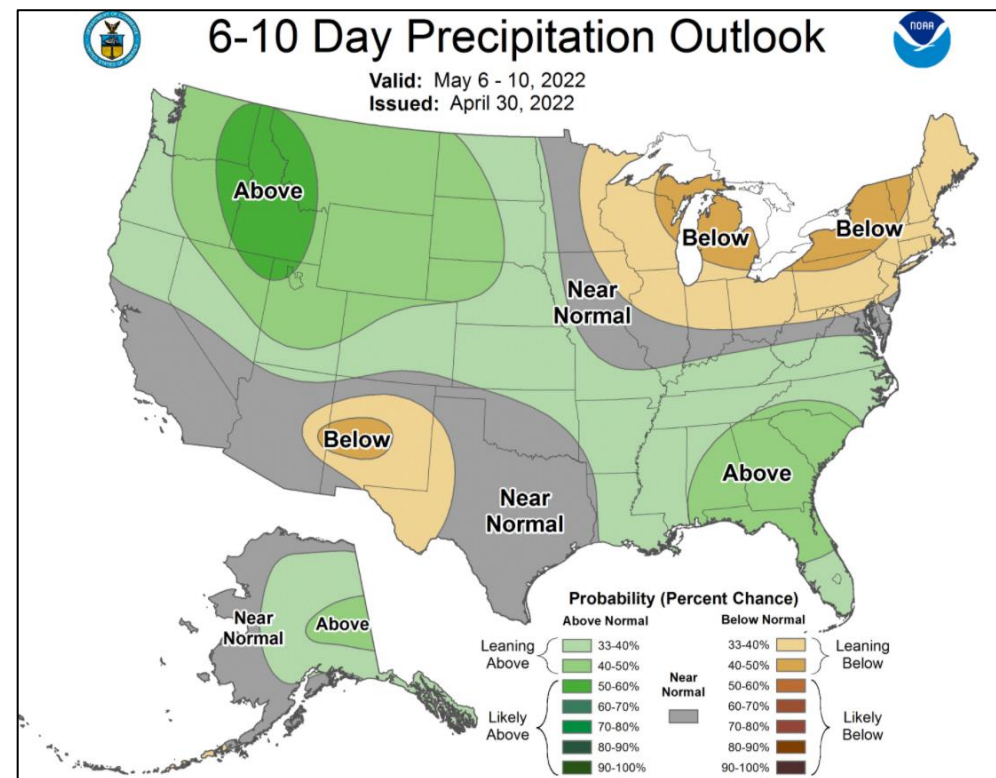
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# Long Range Outlooks – May 6 - 10

6-10 Day Precipitation Probability

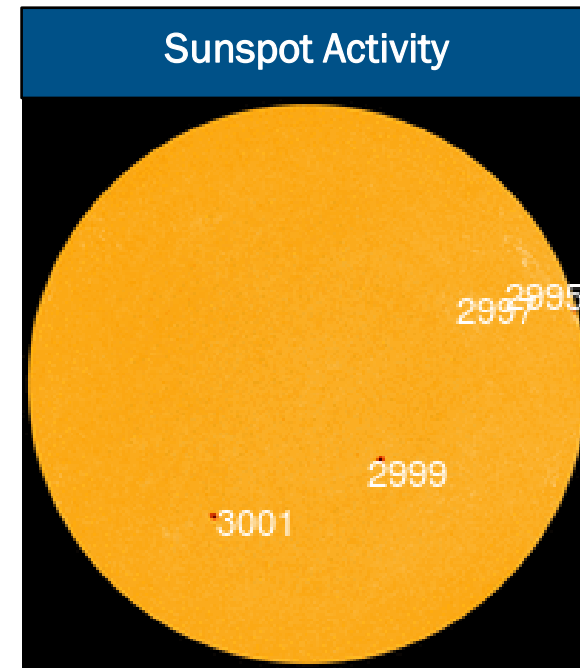
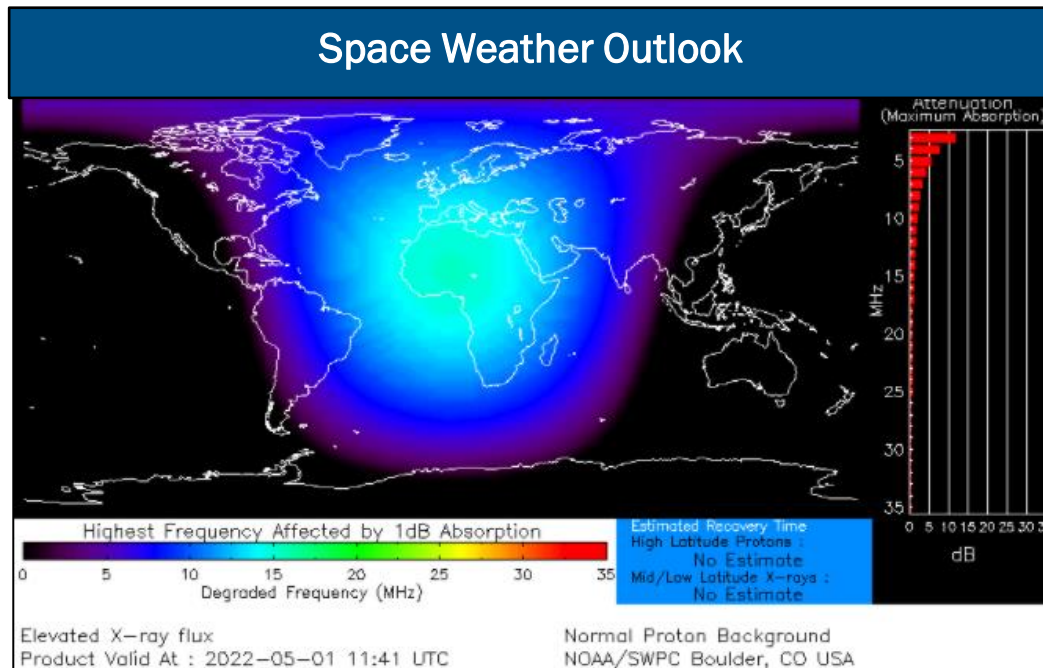

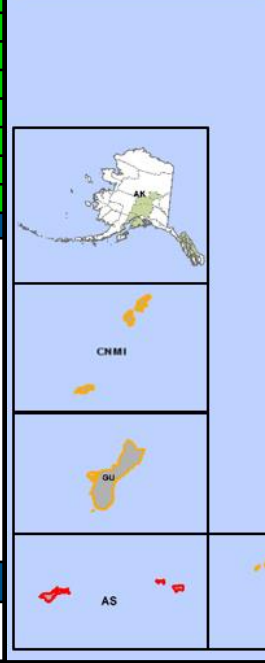
