**Current Situation:** The Hermit's Peak Fire previously reported in San Miguel County, NM began April 12 and was granted an FMAG (#5431), reporting concluded on April 19 when all evacuations were lifted with 89% containment. The Calf Canyon Fire FMAG (#5438), also in San Miguel County, NM began on April 19 burning primarily on federal land. On April 27, the fires merged, and the incident commander began reporting both fires as the Hermit's Peak Fire (not reported as a complex).

- Sheltering in place: 2,130

**Food, Water, Shelter**

- 6 shelters open; unknown occupants (source: Mora County Sheriff's Office)

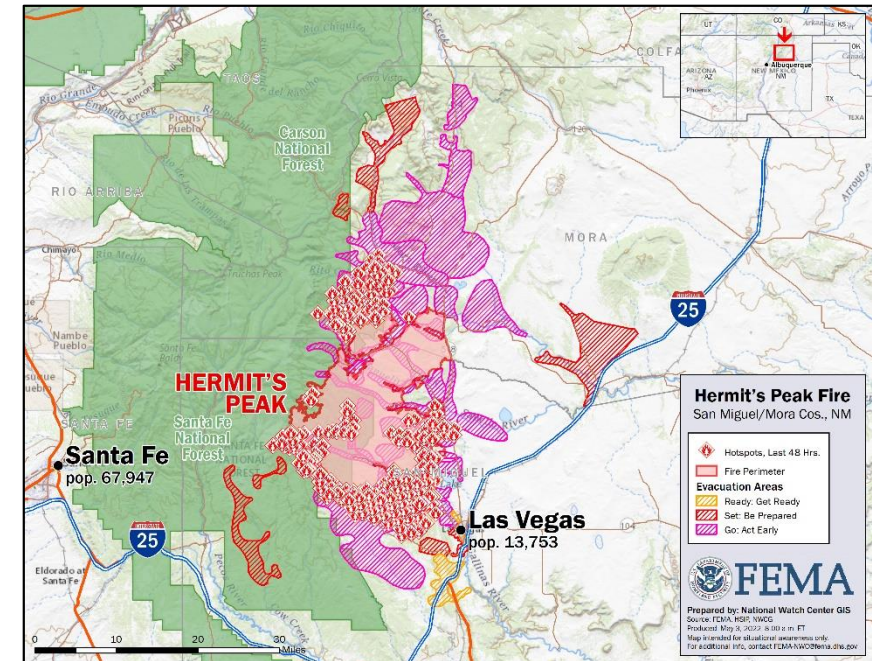

**Transportation:**

- Multiple roads closed for fire activity
- Highways 434, 442, and 518 are open for evacuation only

**Current Situation:** The Cerro Pelado Fire is burning approximately 7 miles southwest of Los Alamos National Laboratory. The fire does not currently pose a threat to the laboratory, although Los Alamos County officials have worked with laboratory and National Nuclear Security Administration officials to ensure there are measures and resources in place to protect and potentially evacuate the facility. Los Alamos, both the county and the laboratory, have completed a great deal of mitigation since the 2000 and 2012 Los Alamos fires additionally emergency managers for both are reported as being very experienced and well qualified. There has been no request for an FMAG or FEMA assistance.

- Jemez Mountain Baptist Church identified as evacuation point; unknown occupants

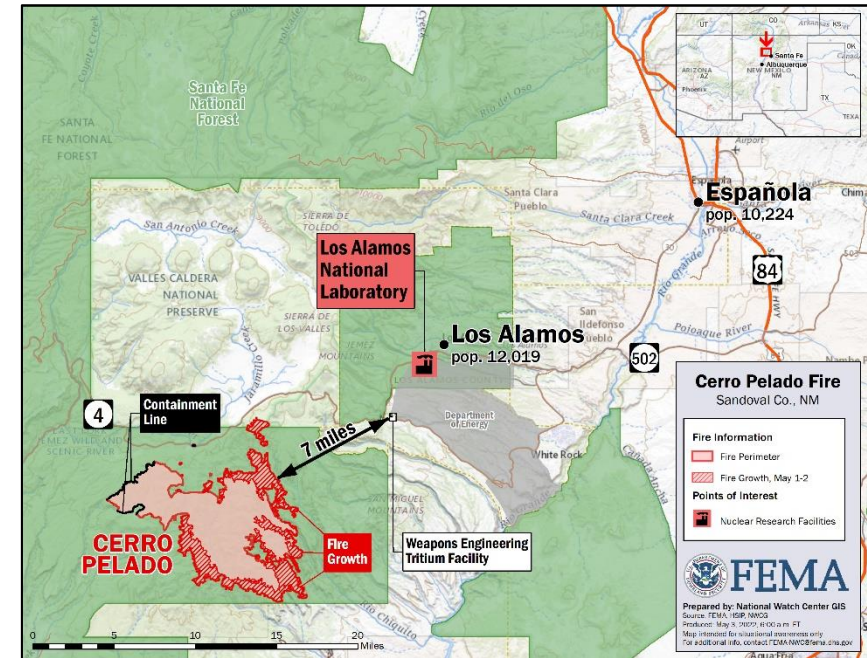

# Overnight Severe Weather – Oklahoma

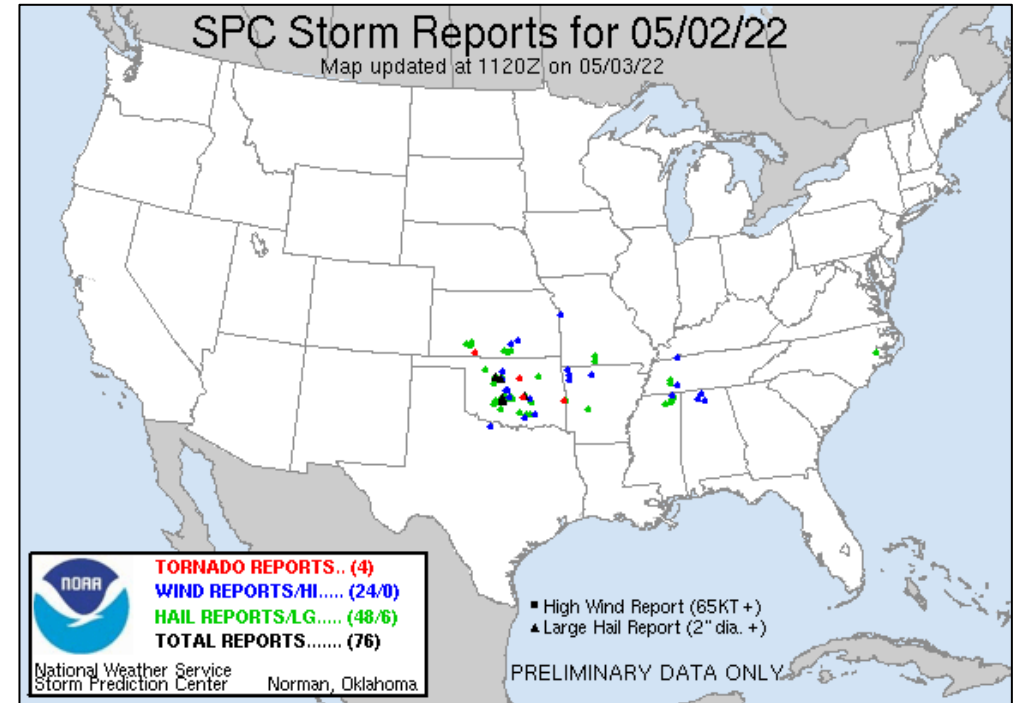
**Current Situation:** An area of severe weather passed through the Southern Plains and Middle Mississippi Valley overnight. The Storm Prediction Center issued preliminary data of 45 high wind events, 48 large hail reports, and 4 tornado touchdowns which occurred in Oklahoma. However, there were no reports of injuries, and all lifelines remain Green. There are no requests for FEMA assistance.

## Impacts:

- Two mobile homes were destroyed in Ripley (pop. 287)
- Damage homes in around Monroe County (pop. 200)
- Reports of downed trees and powerlines
- Minimal power outages reported statewide (*Eagle-1, as of 5:00 a.m. ET*)

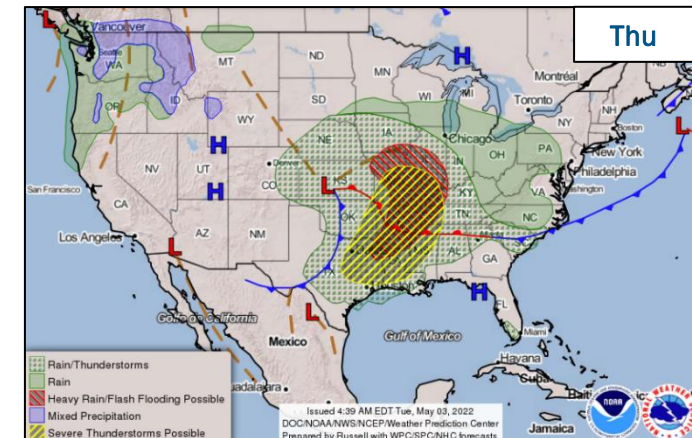
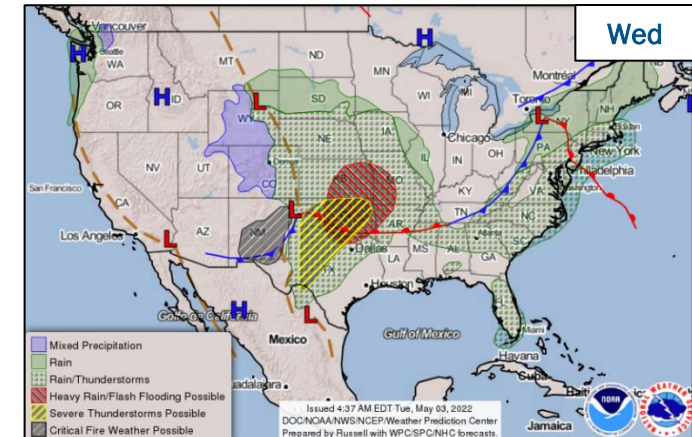
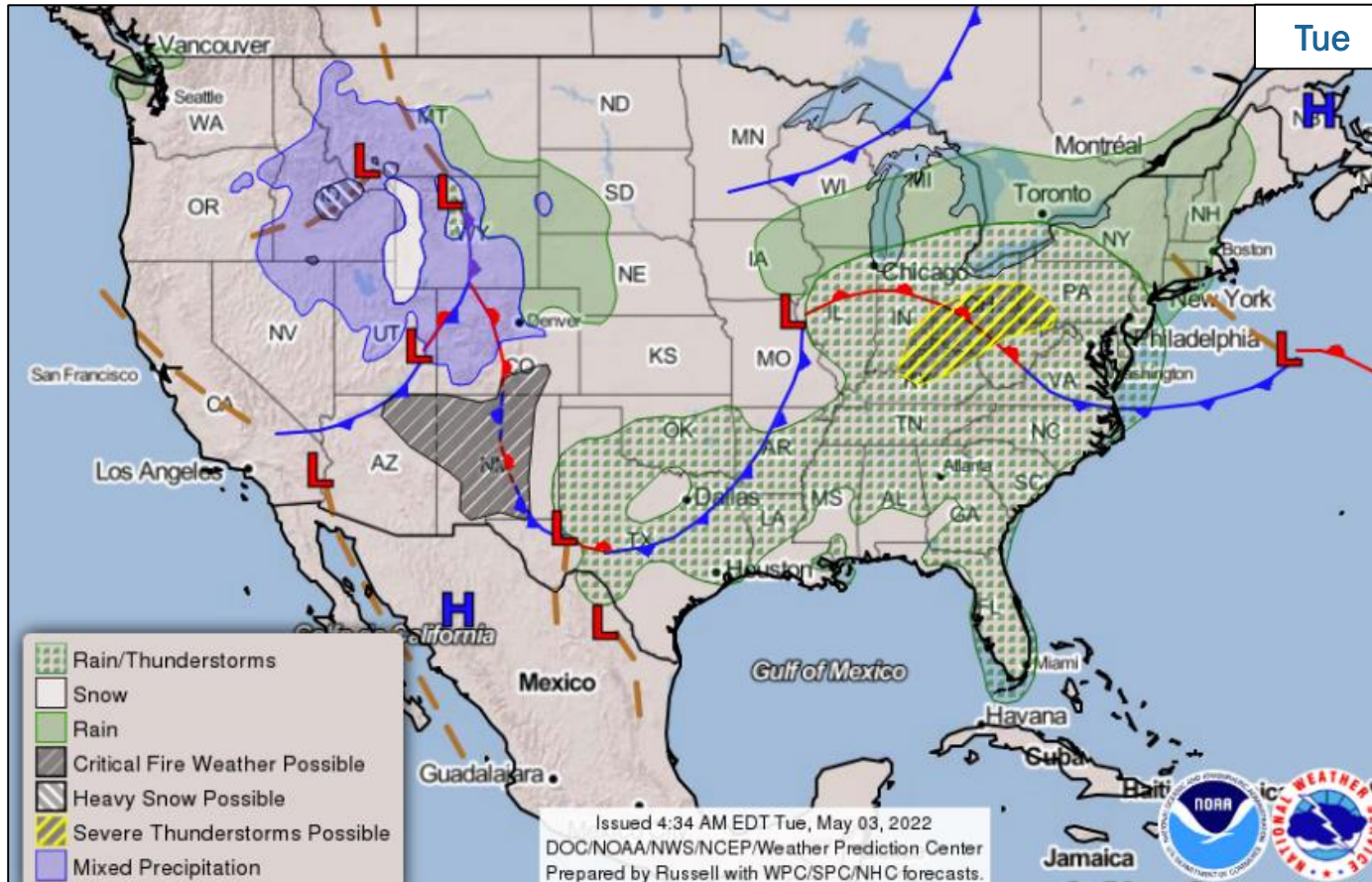

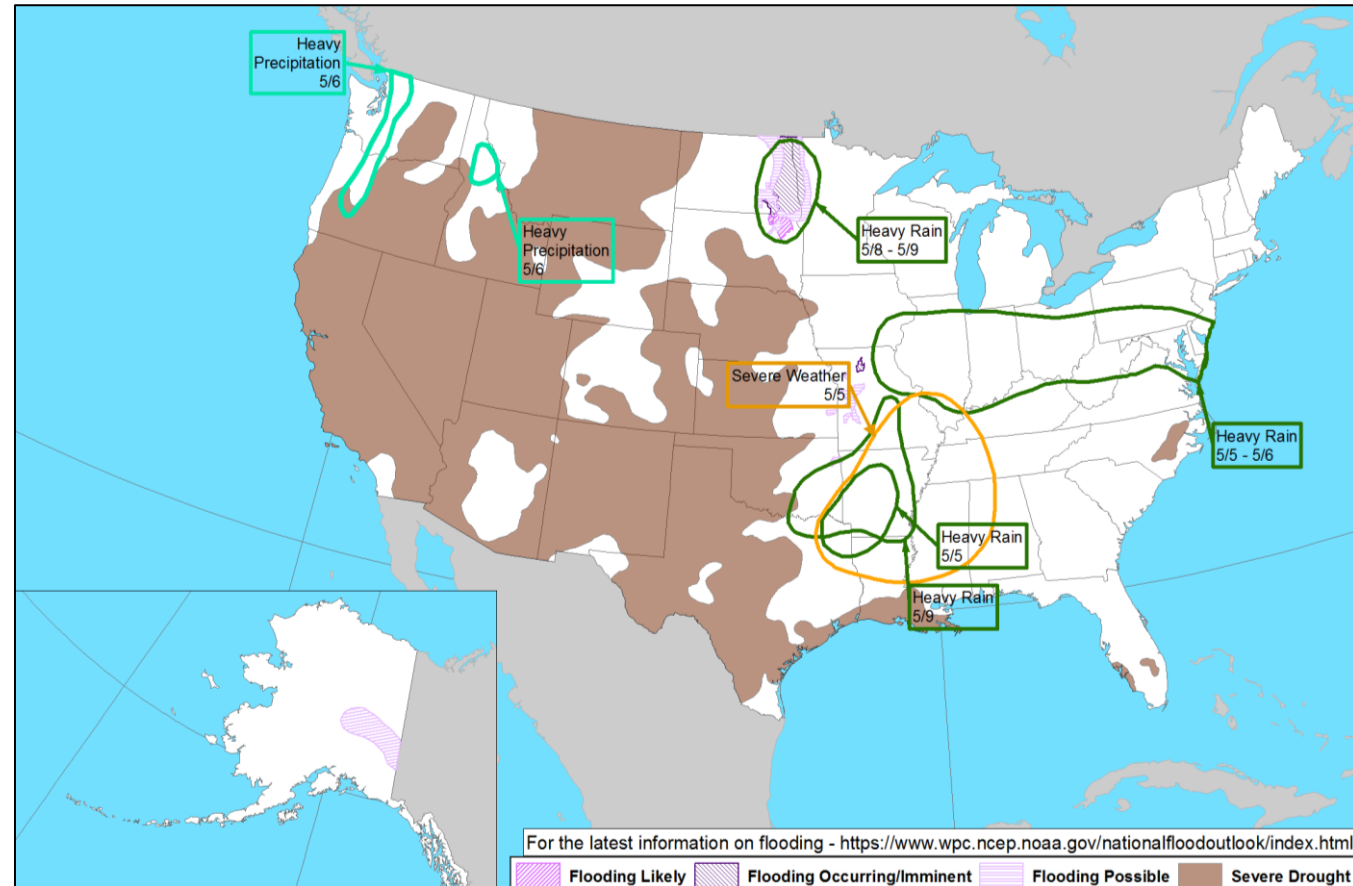
# Severe Weather Outlook

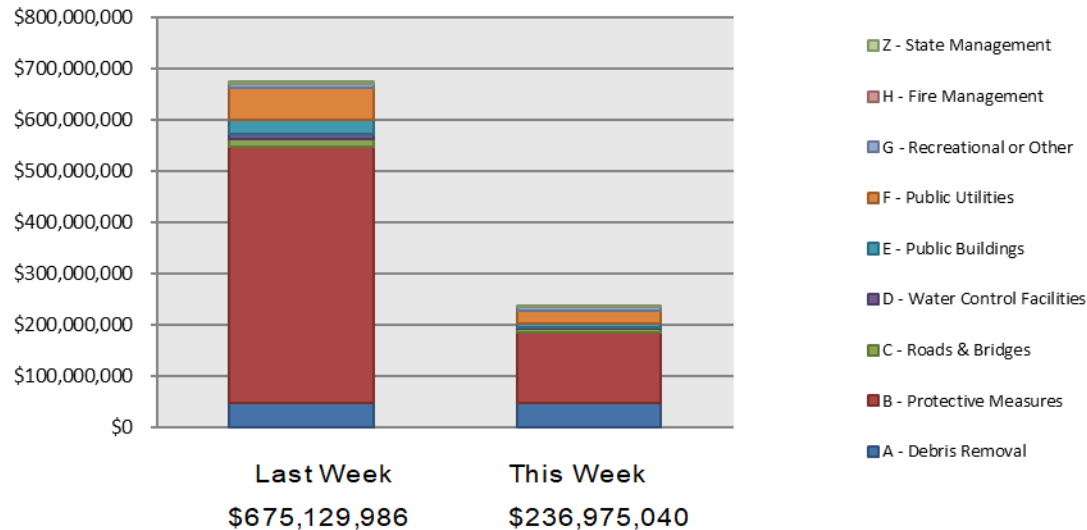

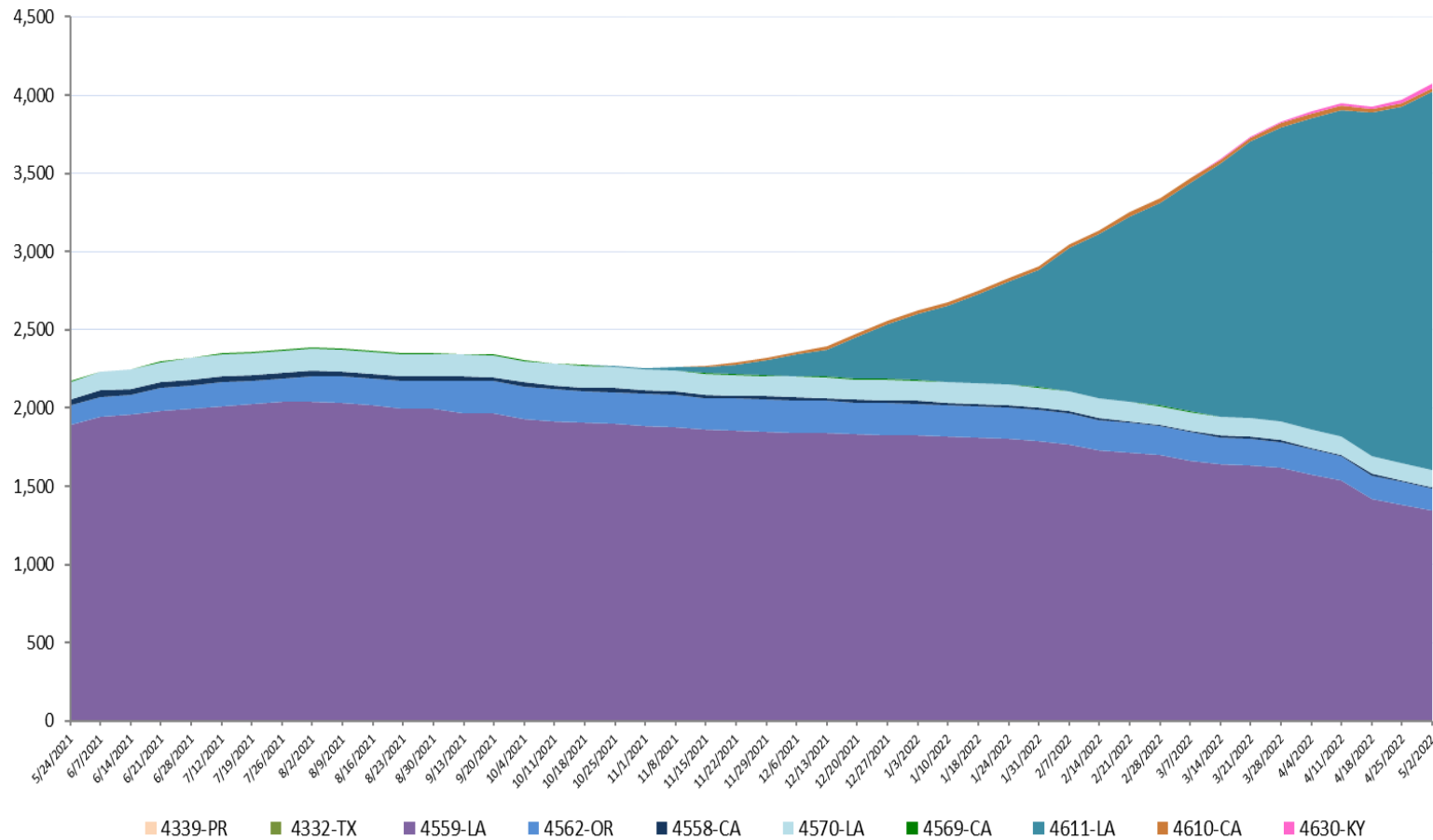

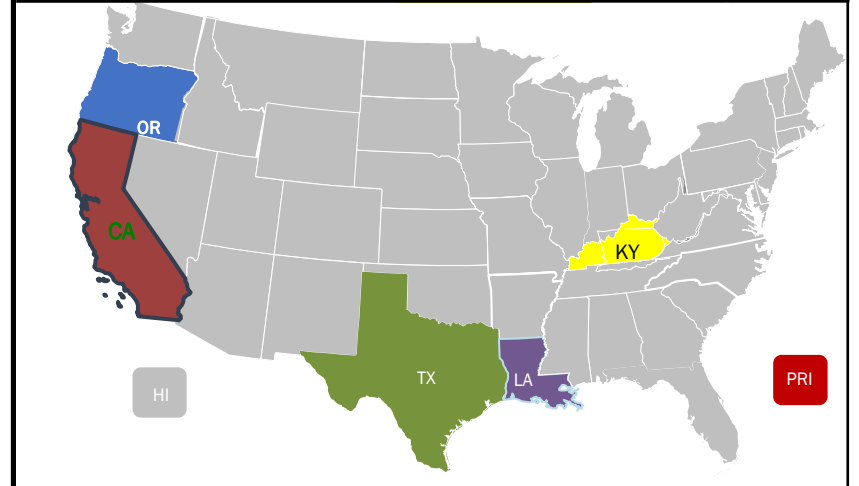
# Direct Housing

Past Year per Week, 5/24/2021 – 5/2/2022. There are currently **4,076** Households Occupying **4,095** Temporary Units.



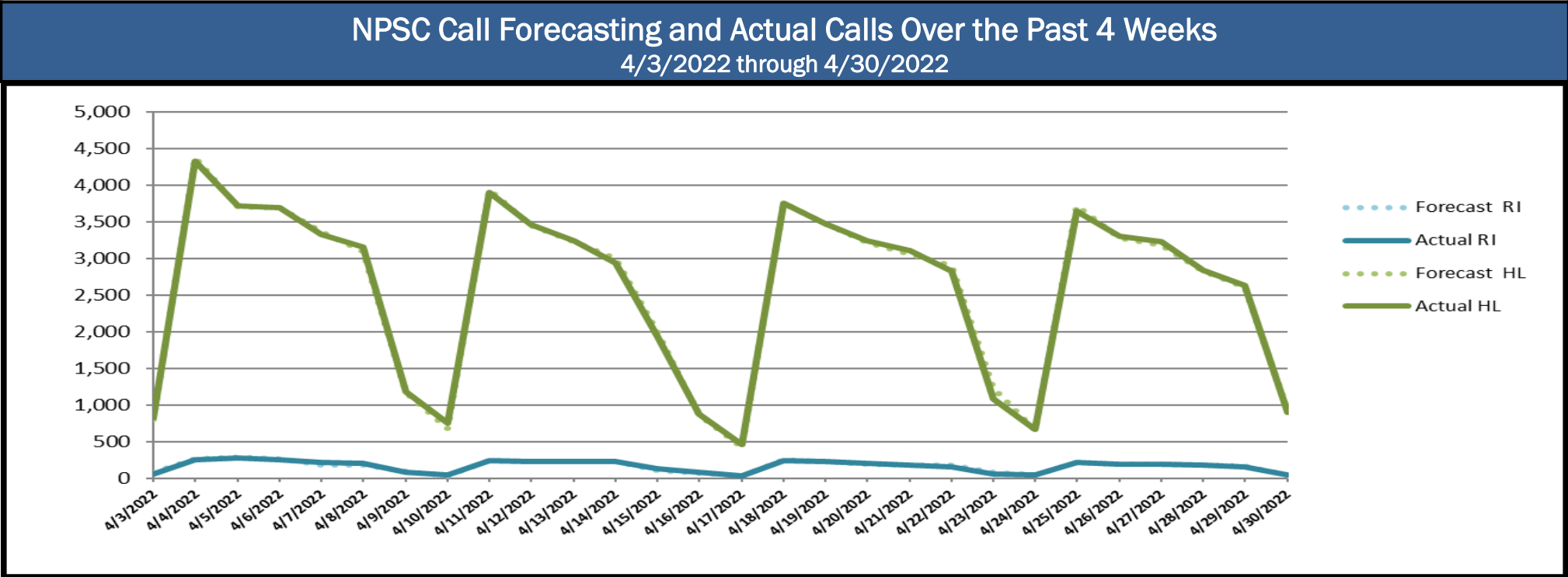

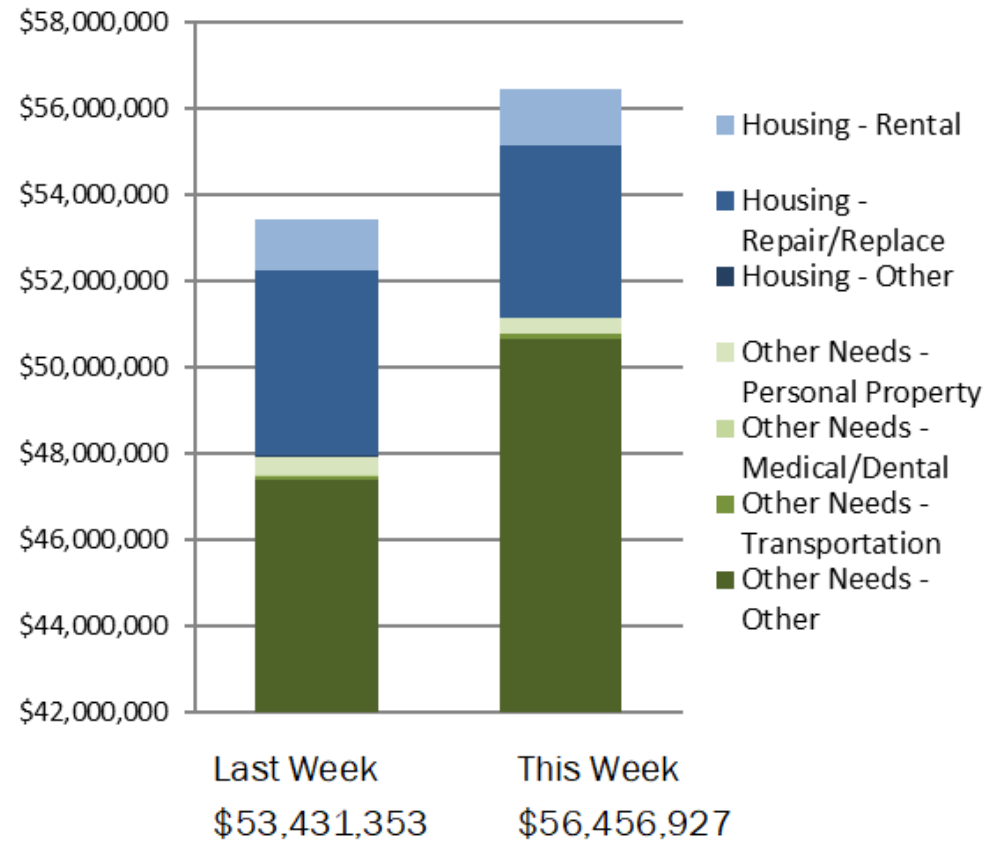
