Eastern Pacific




Tropical Storm Agatha (Advisory #2A as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 220 miles SW of Puerto Angel, Mexico
- Moving westward at 5 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 45 mph
- On the forecast track, the center will approach the southern coast of Mexico on Sunday and make landfall there on Monday
- Forecast to become a hurricane on Sunday
- Tropical storm force winds extend 35 miles
- Hurricane watch in effect for the southern coast of Mexico from Salina Cruz to Punta Maldonado





Disturbance 1 (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)


- Expected to form over the Bay of Campeche





Severe Weather Outlook





Fire Weather Outlook


