


Tropical Outlook - Five Day


Disturbance 1 (as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- Located over the far eastern portion of the eastern North Pacific
- Conditions are conducive for some gradual development while the system moves NW
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (10%); 5-day: Low (30%)

Disturbance 2 (as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- Could form south of the southern or southwestern coast of Mexico in a few days
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 5day: Low (20%)

Atlantic



Hurricane Fiona (Advisory #20A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

Disturbance 1 (as of 2:00 a.m. ET)


- Located over the central subtropical Atlantic
- There is a short window for this system to develop further over the next day or two before conditions become less favorable later this week
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (20%); 5-day: Low (20%)



Hurricane Fiona - Atlantic

Hurricane Fiona (Advisory #20A as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Hurricane Fiona has made landfall along the coast of the Dominican Republic near Boca de Yuma, 15 miles WSW of Punta Cana
- Moving NW at 8 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 90 mph
- Some strengthening is expected during the next few days; forecast to become a major hurricane by Wednesday
- Hurricane-force winds extend outward up to 30 miles; tropical storm force winds extend 150 miles
- Tropical Storm Warning for PR
- Heavy rain from outer bands of Fiona will continue across PR into this afternoon
- Rainfall:
 - USVI: Additional 1-2 inches with storm total of 10 inches
 - Southern PR: additional 4-6 inches with local maximum totals of 10 inches; storm total of 12-20 inches with local maximum of 30 inches
 - Northern PR: additional 1-4 inches with local maximum of 6 inches;
 storm total of 4-12 inches with local maximum of 20 inches
- Localized coastal flooding remains possible along southern coast of PR





Tropical Storm Madeline- Eastern Pacific


Tropical Storm Madeline (Advisory #7 as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 160 miles W of Cabo Corrientes, Mexico
- Moving NW at 9 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 60 mph
- Weakening is expected to begin tonight; forecast to become a remnant low on Tuesday
- Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 115 miles






Observed River Flooding (AHPS)

Hurricane Fiona - PR and USVI

Current Situation:

TC Fiona has passed its closest point of approach to PR and has moved northwest. The potential for catastrophic flooding impacts remains over the next several days in southern and eastern PR.

Lifeline Impacts: (Region II SPOTREP of 5:04 a.m. ET and Region II SLB 2:00 p.m. ET)

Safety and Security:

- Preventative discharges in the Carrizo and La Plata reservoirs and Portugues Dam to avoid overflow
- All schools in PR and USVI will be closed today

Food, Water, Shelter:

• 132 (+45) shelters open with 2,198 (+1,554) occupants in PR (Region II Deputy Director as of 6:00 a.m. ET)

Health and Medical:

PR: FEMA provided generators to Centro Medico

Energy:

PR: Island-wide power outage (1.4 million customers); 91,000 customers in San Juan have been restored. USVI: 1,239 (2.21%) customers without power (peak 15k); FEMA generators pre-staged in USVI and PR


Transportation

- PR and USVI ports at port condition ZULU (closed to all traffic)
- All PR and USVI ferry services suspended
- Airports: PR airports open with flights expected to resume in San Juan later today; USVI airports closed until 12:00 p.m.

State / Local Response:

- PR EOC at Partial Activation; Governor declared a state of emergency and activated the National Guard
- USVI EOC at Full Activation





FEMA / Federal Response:

- Emergency Declaration FEMA-3583-EM-PR approved September 18
- Region II RRCC at Level III, day shift, with select ESFs
- Region II IMAT deployed to USVI; National IMAT Blue deploying to PR
- NRCC is activated
- ISB and SMT teams and MERS deployed to PR & USVI
- US&R MD-TF1. NE-TF1, and White IST deploying to PR
- NWC continues to monitor and provide updates

Remnants of Typhoon Merbok - Alaska

Current Situation:

Remnants of Typhoon Merbok continue to impact the west coast of Alaska. Heavy rain of 3-5 inches led to localized flooding; Coastal Flood Warnings are in effect. High winds and additional rain are expected through much of the week, which will keep inland river levels elevated.

<u>Lifeline Impacts:</u>

Food, Water, Shelter

- 18 (+10) shelters open with 459 (+359) occupants (ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 6:54 a.m. ET)
- Local evacuations in several communities; State EM will develop seasonally appropriate temporary roofing solutions and other temporary building repairs prior to the onset of extreme cold (Region X SLB 7:00 p.m. ET)

Energy:

3 villages with less than 2,500 residents with power outages; power restoration anticipated in 48 hours; generators are available (Region X SLB 7:00 p.m. ET)


Transportation:

- Temporary air and sea disruptions expected; most community airports still operational.
 Commercial flights have been cancelled in Nome, Bethel, and Kotsubuke (Region X SAB 12:53 p.m. ET)
- Flooding is impacting local roadways, docks, and some airport runways in numerous communities but flooding is not expected to be long term; USACE and AK DOT prepared to support impacted communities (Region X SLB 7:00 p.m. ET)

State / Local Response:

- AK EOC at Partial Activation; Governor declared a state of emergency
- Response is anticipated to remain within State capabilities and AK has sufficient commodities to meet the needs of impacted communities.






FEMA / Federal Response:

- Region X and Bothell MOC continue to monitor; Region X is Enhanced; RRCC and ESFs on alert
- Region X IMAT, National IMAT Red, and Bothell MERS deployed to AK
- U.S. Coast Guard and American Red Cross deployed to AK
- NWC continues to monitor and provide updates


