

No tropical cyclones expected during the next 5 days


### **Eastern Pacific**



#### **Tropical Storm Paine** (Advisory #7 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 425 miles SW of southern tip of the Baja California, Mexico
- Moving NW at 5 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 40 mph
- Gradual weakening is expected in the next couple of days and Paine should become a remnant low later today.
- Tropical storm force winds extend 45 miles

### **Atlantic**



### <u>Tropical Depression Twelve</u> (Advisory #3 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 480 miles W of the Cabo Verde Islands
- Moving NW at 8 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Little change in strength is expected, system is expected to dissipate in a couple of days

#### **Disturbance 1** (as of 2:00 a.m. ET)

- Located a couple of hundred miles E of the Windward Islands
- Tropical depression could form during the next several days
- Formation 48-hour: Medium (60%); 5-day: High (80%)



# **Tropical Cyclone Ian – Response**

FL













<u>Current Situation:</u> FEMA and federal partners continue to support the State of Florida in response and recovery from the impacts of Tropical Cyclone lan. Federal teams, commodities, and equipment are providing support to life saving and life sustaining requirements across the impacted areas, including medical decompression and patient transport. Mission priorities continue to be focused on restoration of utilities (including power and water) to critical infrastructure within the impacted area, with emphasis on hospitals, long term care facilities, and other medical facilities. Communications restoration efforts are ongoing to return services to the Barrier Islands and other impacted areas. Search and rescue operations, commodity distribution, and damage assessments are ongoing, and the need for additional federal resources continues to be assessed as requirements develop.

  - LNOS deployed to FL, GA, SC, and NC
- Region VIII: IMAT deployed to Miami, FL
- FEMA HO: NRCC is Fully Activated 24/7, w/all ESFs, LNOs
  - National IMAT White deployed to FL EOC
  - Elements of National IMAT Blue deployed to FL EOC
  - Elements of National IMAT Gold deployed to Ft. Myers, FL
  - US&R White IST and Federal Search and Rescue Coordination Group operational in Orlando, FL
  - 3-Type 1 (VA-TF2, OH-TF1, IN-TF1), 8-Type 3 US&R task forces (VA-TF1, TX-TF1, PA-TF1, MD-TF1, MO-TF1, NJ-TF1, NY-TF1, MA-TF1) and 22-Canine Search Teams Human Remains Detection are conducting search and rescue operations in support of FL.
  - National Responder Mobilization team established a Personnel Mobilization Center (PMC) in Dallas,
     TX; GA PMC Annex established
  - o HHS: 7 DMATs deployed FL (Lee, Sarasota, and Charlotte counties)
  - DHS: Surge Capacity Force activated
  - HQ Logistics: SMTs at Maxwell, AFB (Montgomery, AL)








# **Precipitation Forecast**







