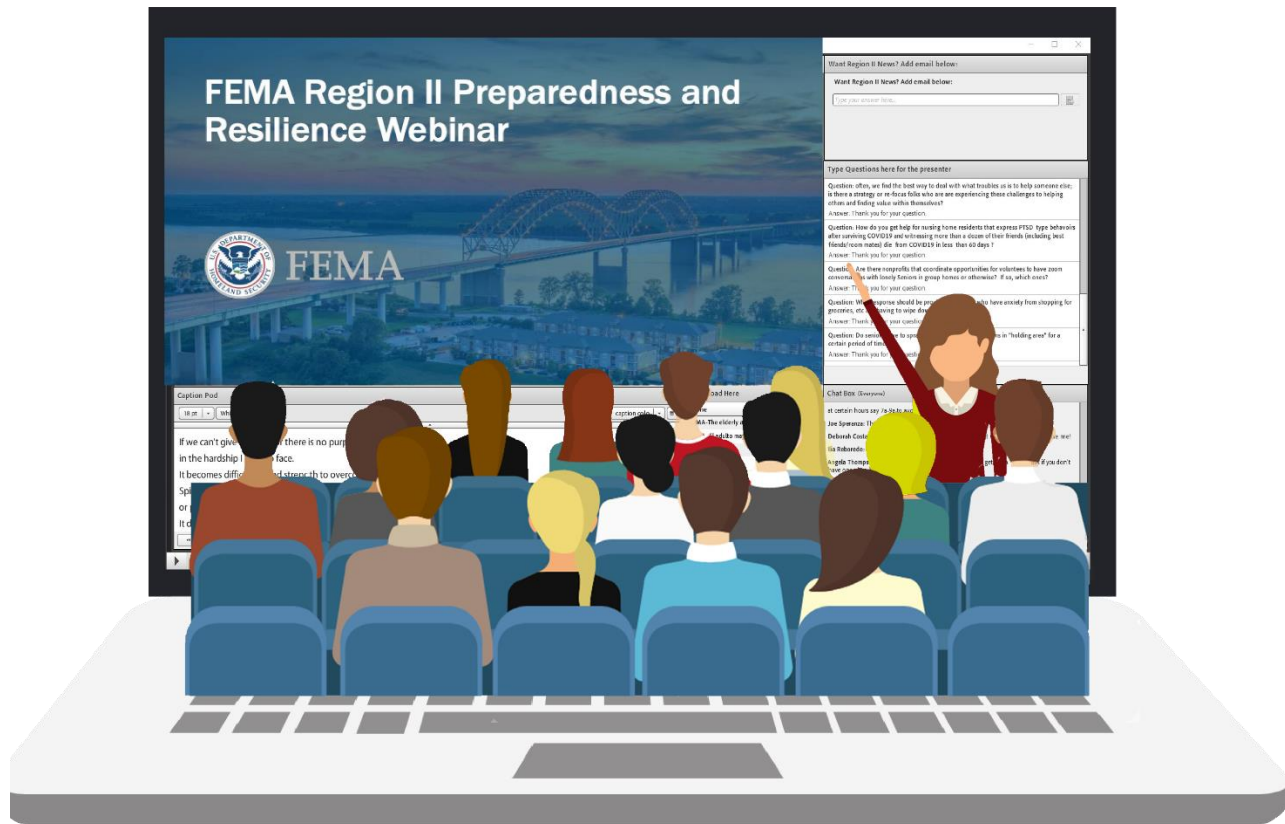

American Sign Language 101 for CERT

The Training was delivered by AQI Interpreting Services.

The FEMA Region 2 National Preparedness Division has partnered with the State of California Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES), and the National CERT Association (NCA) to host a training that focused on the communication needs for including Deaf and Hard of Hearing participants in your CERT program.

Typically, a person with a hearing loss and uses sign language as their primary mode of communication requires accommodations to fully understand presentations spoken in English. American Sign Language (ASL) and English are not the same. ASL has its own grammar and syntax with just as much richness and nuance as any other language. The instructors brought a perspective of being Deaf, a sign language interpreter and a person with a mild to moderate hearing loss, and learning sign language.

People were encouraged to join to learn techniques to enhance your curriculum to include Deaf and Hard of Hearing community members to your class. The webinar also included teaching a few survival signs used for Emergency management situations such as hurt, pain, where, water, name, and many more!

In crisis and emergency events, children think and respond in a different way than adults do. They also have specific needs according to their age and are more vulnerable to adverse effects according to their physical size and their social and emotional capacity to connect with service providers.

Knowing the expected reactions of children and adolescents according to their stage of development will provide us with more information for an adequate support intervention by applying activities and strategies appropriate for their age.

This workshop offers strategies (such as the emergency backpack) so that children and young people can know how to prepare for a disaster and thus avoid anxiety at the time of the event. It also teaches them to recognize how they react to stress in disaster events and how to properly cope with these events.

Mental and Emotional Health

A Social Reinsertion During the Pandemic

The Region 2 National Preparedness Division in partnership with Americares hosted a webinar on social reinsertion and managing the fear of leaving your home during the pandemic.

A global emergency, such as the current COVID-19 pandemic, can affect people on many levels.

Faced with the challenge of resuming ordinary social practices, while there is still a risk of contagion, many people may experience intense fear of leaving their homes, known as "The Cabin Syndrome". Initially, staying at home could be experienced as being "in prison", however, with the passage of time, it has become for many a refuge that they fear leaving. Faced with this challenge, there are measures that can be taken to reduce this fear without abandoning proper precautionary and personal protection practices.

Selfcare for Disaster Responders and Healthcare Workers

The Region 2 National Preparedness Division in partnership with AmeriCares hosted a webinar on selfcare for disaster responders and healthcare workers. Amidst the COVID-19 pandemic disaster responders and healthcare workers who test and treat COVID 19 patients were, and continue to be, at higher risk of contracting it, than the general public. The possibility of contagion and even of bringing the disease home entails a high level of stress and anxiety.

We deal with the double burden of stress from home and work in the face of major disasters. Facing the difficult scenario of caring for themselves and others during this emergency presents health workers with the risk of burnout, indirect trauma, and compassion fatigue. This webinar explained the specific stressors of first responders, mental and psychosocial health workers and healthcare providers, including secondary traumatic stress. The Americares team also provided tools that can be used to promote self-care and aid in self-assessment.
