<u>Current Situation:</u> FEMA and federal partners continue to support the state of Hawaii in response and recovery efforts from Hawaii Wildfires. Mission priorities remain focused on Search & Rescue, fire containment, and damage assessments in the impacted area (Maui County). Cellular service continues to improve in West Maui.

<u>Lifelines Impacts:</u> (FEMA-DR-4724-HI-SLB #17, as of Aug 26) **Safety and Security:**

- 65 (-91) FLEOs from various agencies supporting Maui PD *Food, Hydration, and Shelter:*
- Non-Congregate Shelters Open: 17 (+5); midnight count: 4,105 (+1,008); Hotel Survivor Population: 4,304 (+1,009)
- TSA: 199 (+35) people housed in 10 (+2) hotels

Health and Medical:


- 115 confirmed fatalities: 67 fire-related injuries
- HHS BH personnel assisting mobile clinic providing behavioral health services with primary care providers at shelters

Energy:

- 1,061 (-323) customers remain without power in Maui
- USACE is beginning to coordinate de-installation of generators as requested by the state

Transportation:

- 3 (+1) Temporary Flight Restrictions (TFR) in effect for Maui County
- Access limited for Honoapi'ilani and Lahaina Bypass Roads: open to the public during the day and evening; limited to residents and first responders overnight
- FEMA contractors providing universal communication and prior permission required (PPR) services at Kapalua Airport until 8/30





Disturbance 2 (As of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located off the west coast of Africa
- Moving W across the Atlantic
- Slow development of this system is possible later this week
- Formation chance 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (20%)



Hurricane Franklin- Atlantic

Situation (Advisory #27 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 270 miles NE of Grand Turk Island
- Maximum sustained winds 90 mph
- Moving NW at 8 mph
- Hurricane-force winds extend outward up to 25 mph; Tropicalstorm-force winds extend outward up to 140 miles
- Rapid strengthening is forecast over the next 24 hours and Franklin could become a major hurricane by tonight






Tropical Depression Ten- Atlantic

Situation (Advisory #3 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 30 miles SSE of Cozumel, Mexico
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Moving S at 5 mph
- Forecast to become a hurricane over the Eastern Gulf of Mexico in a couple of days






Tropical Depression 10E – Eastern Pacific

Situation (Advisory #2 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 765 miles WSW of the Southern tip of Baja California
- Maximum sustained winds 35 mph
- Moving WNW at 12 mph
- Some strengthening is forecast and the depression is expected to become a tropical storm by tomorrow; unlikely to reach hurricane intensity






Tropical Activity Preparations – Atlantic / Gulf

Current Situation: FEMA continues to prepare for response and recovery efforts focusing on FEMA Regions II, IV, and VI. The National Hurricane Center is monitoring several tropical disturbances in the Atlantic that may pose a threat to US interests over the next several days. Tropical Depression TEN is expected to start moving N or NNE on Monday into the eastern Gulf of Mexico. Conditions are conducive for further development. A Tropical Storm is likely to form today and strengthen into a Hurricane by Tuesday.


Situation: On August 26 the FEMA Region 6 Administrator approved the State of Louisiana FMAG request for the Lions Camp Road Fire burning in Vernon Parish, LA that started burning on August 26. No homes have been destroyed, an estimated 1,000 primary homes are threatened in and around Leesville, LA, (population 5,476). The fire is also threatening the area's electric cooperative, 2 recreation parks, 35 businesses, the watershed, fishing streams, spawning sites, wildlife, environmental resources, the public airport, and other government buildings and facilities in the area. Voluntary evacuations are taking place for approximately 2,000 people including an area nursing home. The fire has burned in excess of 1,000 acres of private and state land and is 25% percent contained.

6-10 Day Temperature Probability




6-10 Day Precipitation Probability






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Severe Weather – FEMA Region V - Final

<u>Situation:</u> The region will continue to coordinate with Michigan as they gain additional situational awareness and move into Recovery following a second round of severe weather. The Governor of Michigan declared a State of Emergency for Wayne and Monroe counties. Two fatalities, four tornadoes, downed trees, and power outages, have been reported. Twenty-five cars were damaged and I-96 remains closed. The National Weather Service (NWS) is not reporting any severe weather for the next 24 hours. Limited thunderstorms are possible for Upper Michigan.

Eagle-I is reporting power outages continue to trend downwards. All states in the impacted area continue to monitor the severe weather threats. There are no requests for FEMA assistance.

 - Cuyahoga County: 29k (-2k) without power (5%)
 - Lake County: 12k (-3k) without power (20%)
