




Central/East Pacific Overview TROPICAL OUTLOOK




Atlantic Overview TROPICAL OUTLOOK



Hurricane Idalia RADAR LOOP




Hurricane Idalia FORECAST TRACK




Hurricane Idalia PEAK STORM SURGE FORECAST

Hurricane Idalia MOST LIKELY ARRIVAL OF TS WINDS




Hurricane Idalia SEVERE WEATHER OUTLOOK



Updated 6 am EDT, Wednesday, Aug. 30, 2023 - Hurricane Idalia Latest Rainfall Forecasts and Information



Idalia is expected to produce a swath of 4 to 8 inches of rainfall with isolated maxima up to 12 inches from the Florida Big Bend through central Georgia and South Carolina, and through eastern North Carolina.



Areas of flash, urban, and moderate river flooding, with considerable impacts, are expected from the Florida Big Bend through central Georgia and South Carolina, through eastern North Carolina.

Hurricane Idalia - Response



<u>Current Situation:</u> The National Hurricane Center reports Idalia has intensified and is forecast to reach the Big Bend coast of FL this morning. After landfall, Idalia is expected to travel northeast along the coasts of GA, SC, and NC late tonight into Thursday.



- FL: Full evacuations of 72 medical facilities

Energy:

- Personnel staged to respond to power outages Communications:
- FL: MERS assets providing comms support, additional assets staged in Lake Mary
- GA: 4 MCOVs staged in Thomasville; 5 inbound 8/30 *Transportation:*
- FL: 10 ports and waterways closed; remaining ports are open and monitoring
- FL: Tallahassee International Airport (TLH) &
 Sarasota/Bradenton International Airport (SRQ) closed,
 partially open for emergency response; Gainesville Regional
 airport (GNV) scheduled to close today
- FL: SunRail service suspended UFN
- GA: 2 ports closed, all remaining ports open with restrictions


