### Flooding – Texas

Situation: In East Texas, additional rounds of heavy rainfall over already susceptible areas have resulted in scattered flooding, along with ongoing major riverine flooding. Several river gauges north of Houston are forecast to approach or exceed their flood of record. Rivers will reach their highest flows over the next 1-3 days, with the highest impact locations seeing their crest within the next 48 hours, but recession will be slow, as several rivers will remain above major flood stage through the middle of next week. The greatest flood threat will shift westward towards North-Central Texas and South-Central Oklahoma later today, but additional scattered showers and storms this weekend across East Texas may further delay river recessions. No major flood-related impacts yet reported or identified.








### **National Weather Forecast**






### **Severe Weather Outlook**






# **Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall**




