Situation: The South Fork and Salt wildfires are burning in New Mexico, threatening homes, businesses, and other structures, forcing the evacuation of the populations. Thunderstorms and locally heavy rainfall around the fires and burn scars have caused flash flooding and debris flows complicating the situation.



- NM: Power outages remain minimal statewide and continue to trend downward (DOE Eagle-I, as of 12:00 a.m. ET, Jun 23)

- All PSAPs in Lincoln and Otero Counties are receiving 911 calls with location information


Flooding Threats – FEMA Regions V, VII, & VIII

<u>Situation:</u> Between 8 to 12 inches of rain fell over the past 48 hours near the border of lowa, South Dakota, and Minnesota affecting portions of Regions V, VII, and VIII.

Region V: Numerous communities are experiencing power outages and flash flooding. Rainfall totals between 5 to 9 inches have been observed across southern and northeast Minnesota over the past 7 days. Multiple flood warnings and watches are in effect. Power outages peaked at 63k at 3:45 a.m. ET last night but are trending down. (DOE Eagle-I, as of 6:00 a.m. ET, Jun 23) There are no requests for FEMA assistance. (Region V Advisory, as of 10:32 p.m. ET, Jun 22)

Region VII: Significant flooding overnight in northwest lowa has potentially impacted over 1,500 homes. Governor of lowa declared a disaster on Saturday for 21 counties in the affected region. The Rock River Levee at Rock Valley was breached overnight due to heavy rainfall. Additional flooding is forecast today through Monday with lingering flooding likely through Thursday as the crest shifts downstream. Significant number of road closures in northwestern lowa reported. The river is expected to drop rapidly and fall below flood stage by Wednesday. Flood watches and warnings remain in effect until further notice throughout the state. There are no requests for FEMA assistance. (Region VII Advisory, as of 12:17 p.m. ET, Jun 22)

Region VIII: There are reports of localized flooding and road closures in South Dakota however, there are no requests for FEMA assistance. (Region VIII, as of 11:00 p.m. ET, Jun 22)













Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall






Severe Weather Outlook






National Heat Risk – Jun 23







