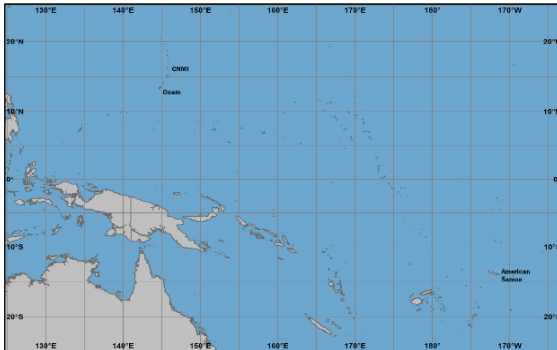

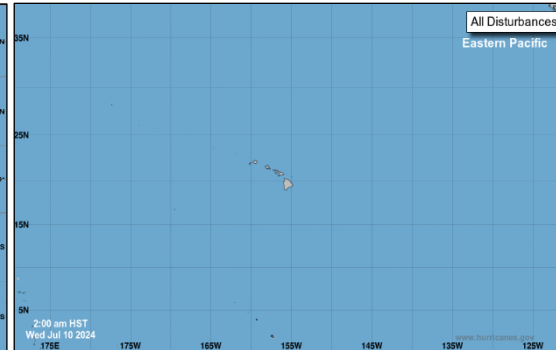

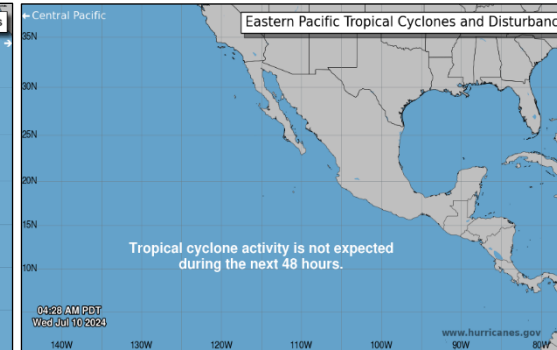

Central Pacific



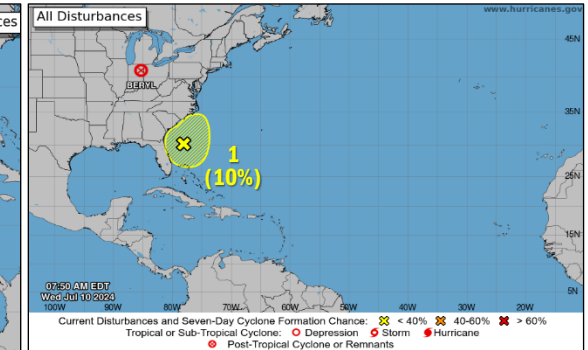
- No tropical cyclones expected during the next 7 days

Atlantic



Post-Tropical Cyclone Beryl: (*Advisory #47 as of 5:00 a.m. ET*)

- Located 100 miles NE of Indianapolis, IN
 - Moving NE at 20 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 30 mph

Disturbance1: (*as of 8:00 a.m. ET*)

- A broad trough of low pressure located off the southeastern U.S. coast
- Environmental conditions appear only marginally favorable for some additional development over the next couple of days
- 48 hour: Low (10%); 7-day: Low (10%)



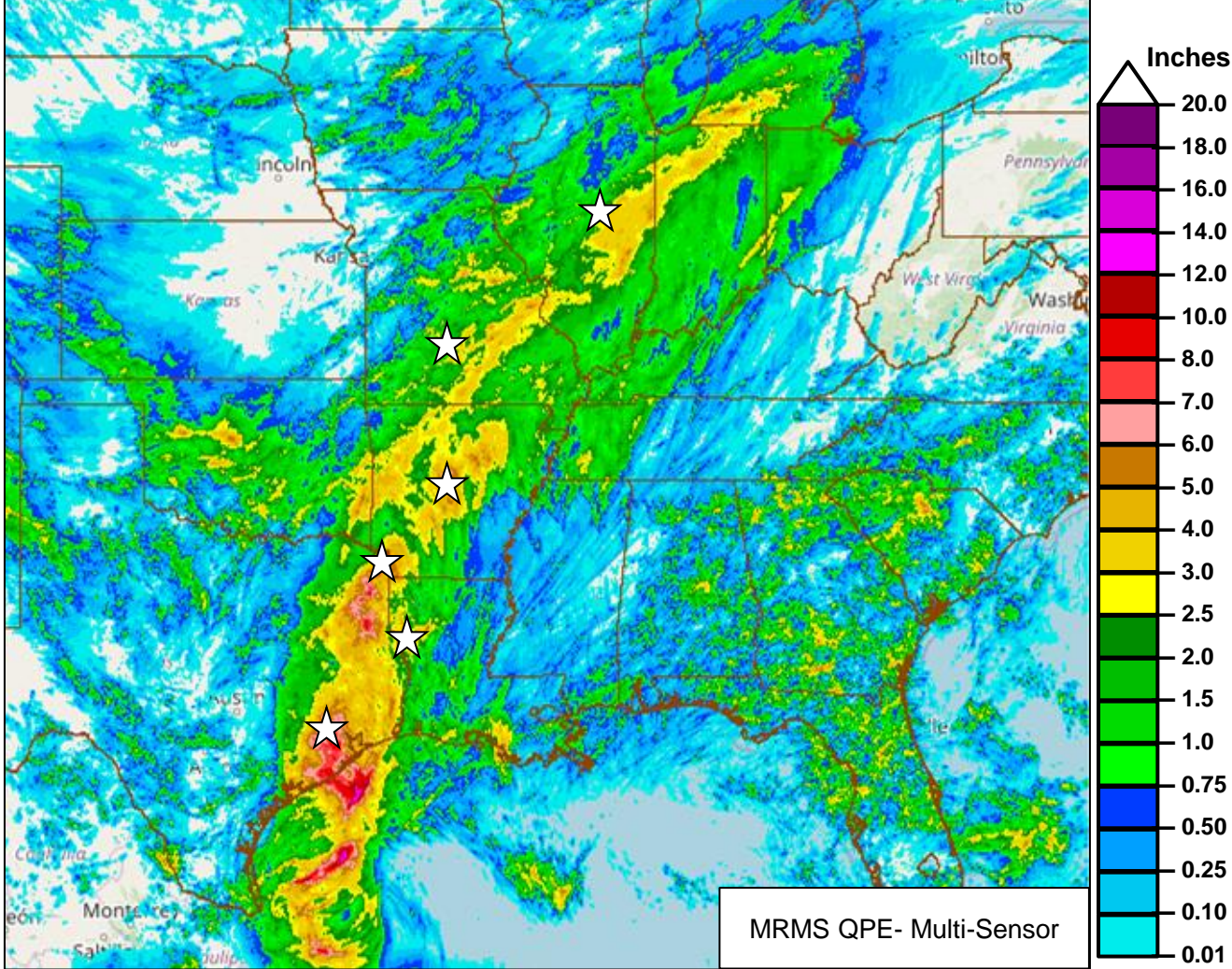

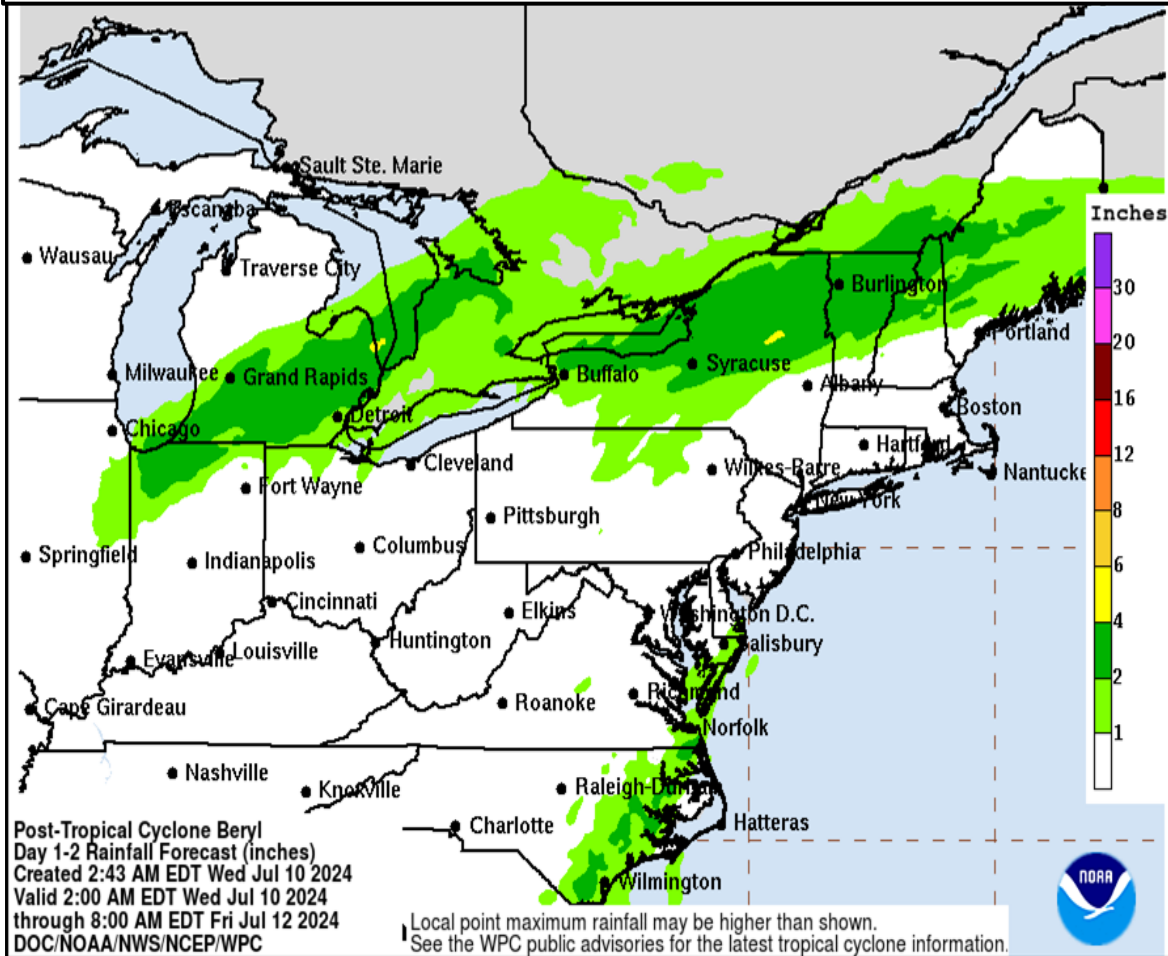

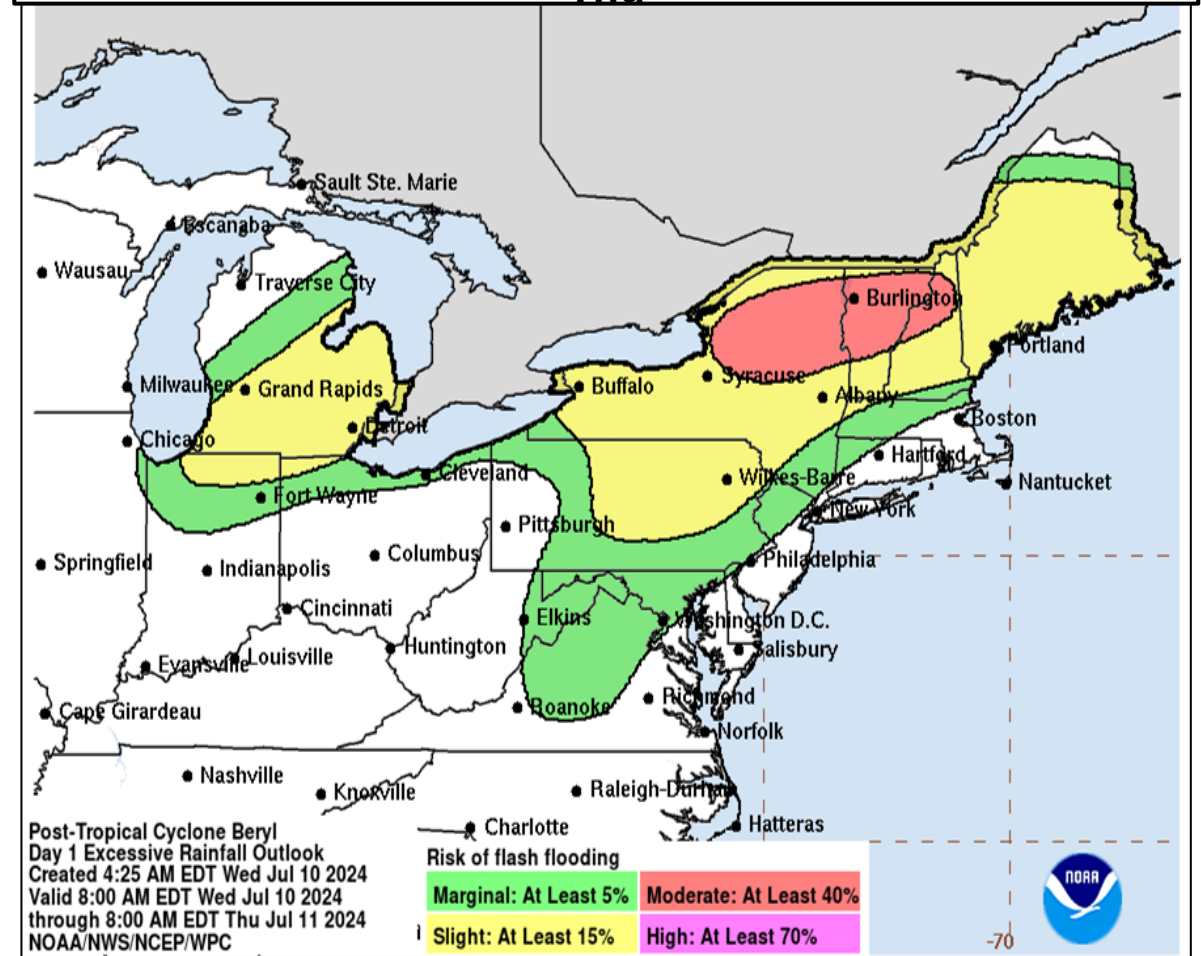

- **Heavy rainfall of 2-4 inches, with locally higher amounts,** is expected across portions of the southern Great Lakes, central/northern NY, and northern New England today / tonight

- **MODERATE RISK** includes ~1.4 million people in NY, VT, NH
- **Areas of flash flooding, some locally considerable,** from southeast MI into central/northern NY and northern New England

Post-Tropical Cyclone Beryl – Texas



Situation: Post-Tropical Cyclone Beryl continues to weaken as it moves northeast.

Lifelines: (RVI SLB as of 7:48 p.m. ET, Jul 9)

Food, Hydration Shelter:

- 11 (+5) shelters / 518 (+449) occupants

Health and Medical: Medical facilities and operations within the impacted area are improving as power is restored and damage assessments and repairs are completed

- 0 (-2) hospitals closed
- 0 (-3) psychiatric hospitals closed
- 16 hospitals on generator power
- 8 confirmed fatalities reported (RVI SPOTREP, as of 10:59 p.m. ET Jul 8)

Water Systems:

- Precautionary boil water notices for 52 drinking systems

Energy: Power assessments and restoration efforts are ongoing, and outages continue to trend down

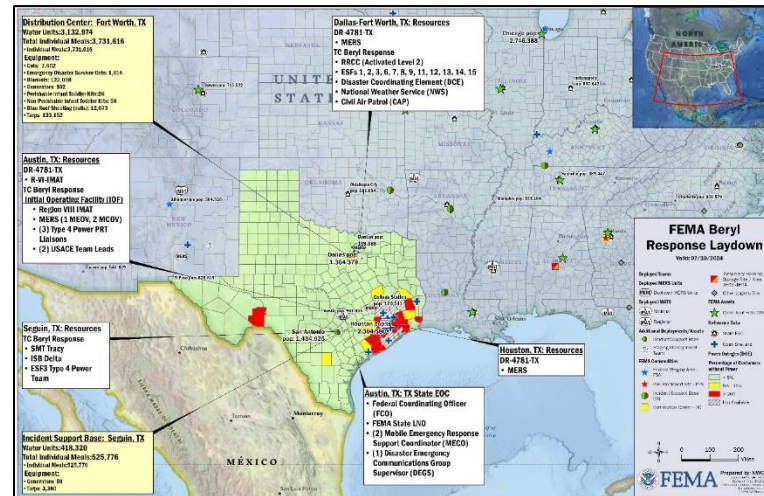
- Total of 1.7M / 13% customers without power statewide (Eagle-I as of 8:30 a.m. ET)

Communications:

- 71% cellular sites are operational within Disaster Information Reporting System

Transportation: All transportation nodes and services have stabilized

- Ports Open: Victoria
- Ports Open with Restrictions: Houston, Galveston, Freeport, and Texas City
- I-45 in north Houston remains closed



State / Local Response:

- TX EOC at Partial Activation (Post-Tropical Cyclone Beryl)
 - Gov declared severe weather disaster for 121 counties
 - Alabama-Coushatta Tribe in Polk County, TX declared State of Emergency

FEMA / Federal Response:

Region VI:

- RWC is Monitoring (24/7); RRCC is at Level II with select ESFs (1-3 & 6-15)
- IMAT-2 deployed to Austin, TX for DR-4781-TX

HQ: NWC at Enhanced (NATO Summit); NRCC at Level III (day-shift only)

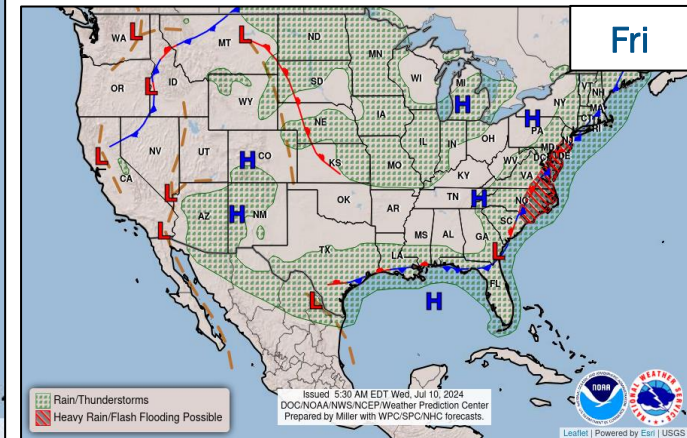
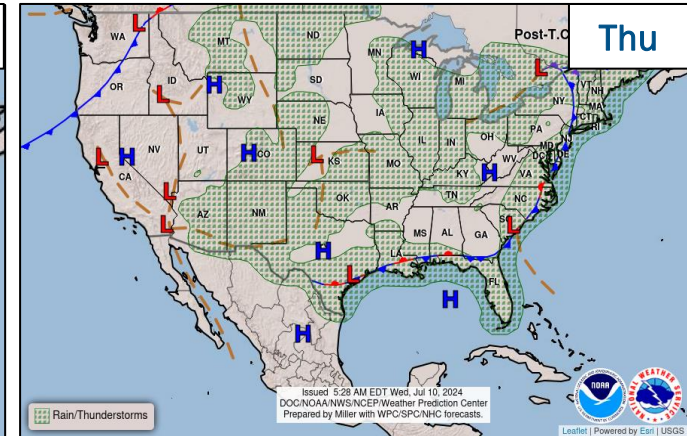
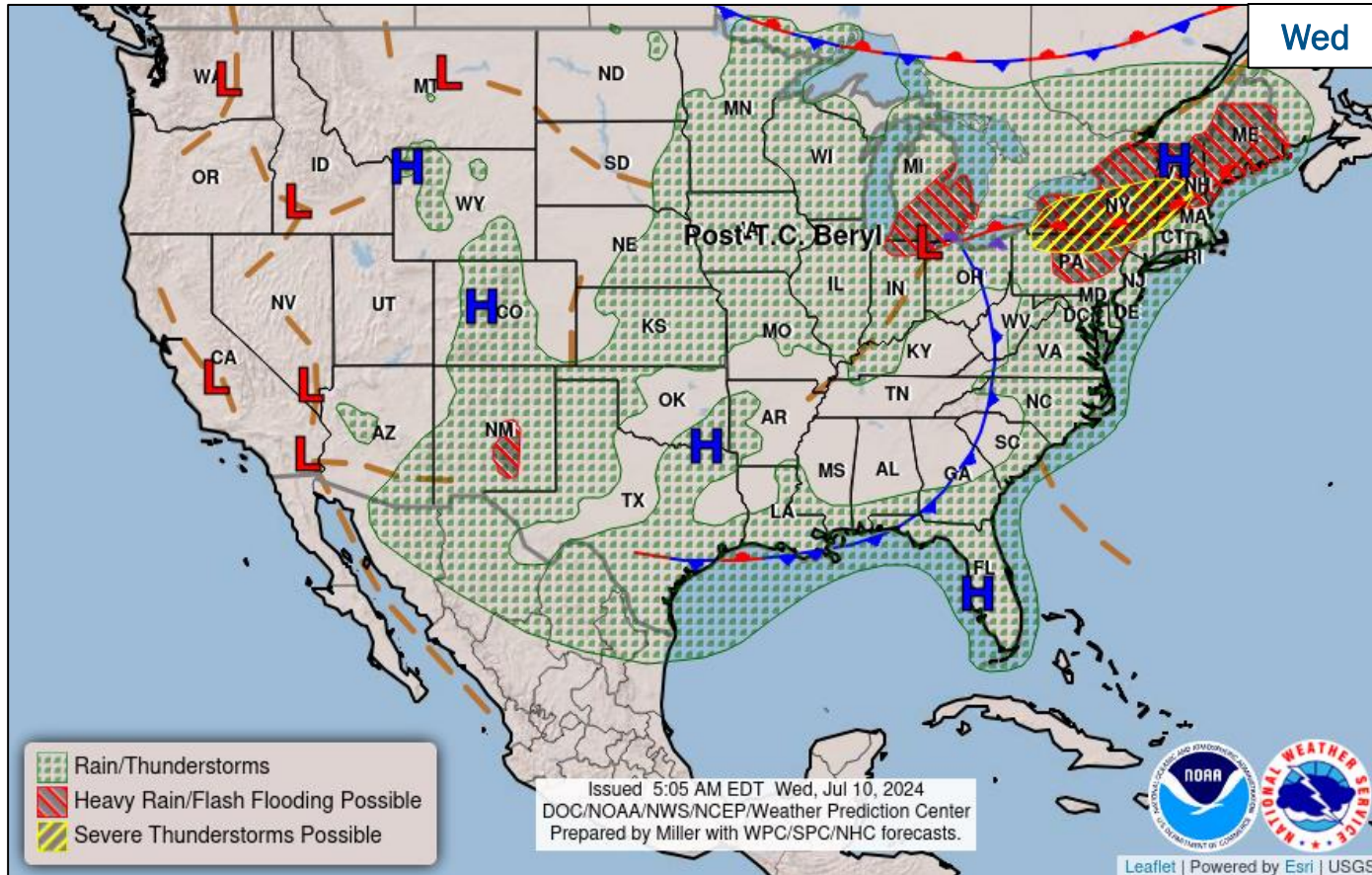
- Region VIII IMAT deployed to Austin, TX
- SMT Tracy and ISB Delta teams deployed to Randolph AFB, Seguin, TX
- US&R: All resources demobilized

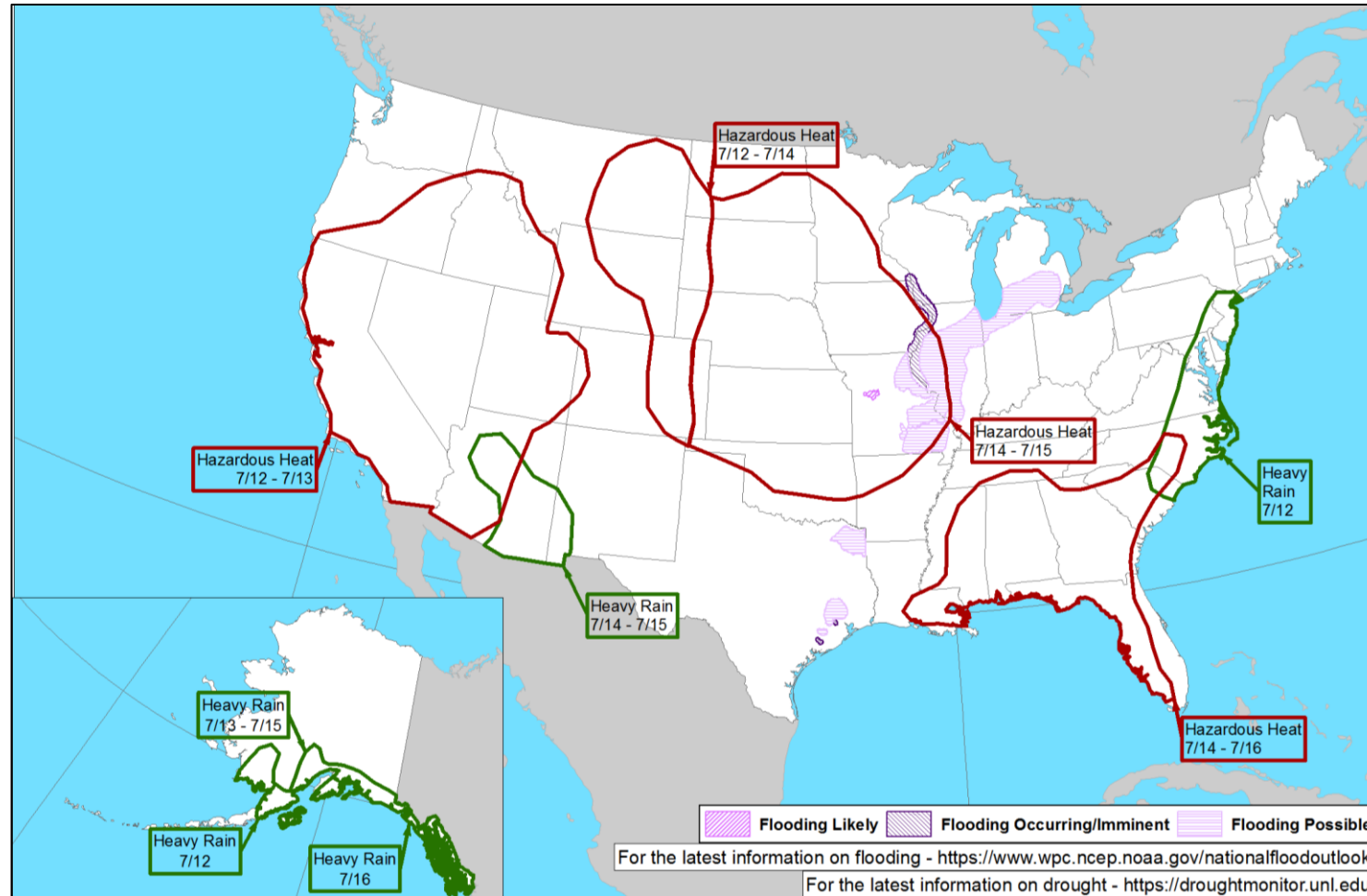
Severe Weather Outlook

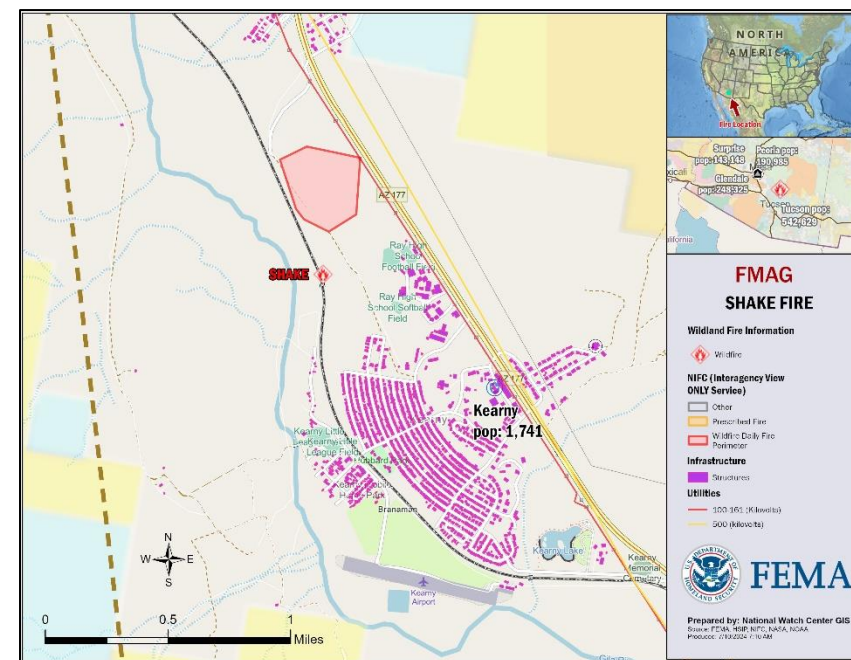
Situation: The Regional Administrator for FEMA Region IX approved a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Shake Fire on July 9, 2024. The fire started on July 9 near Kearny, AZ (pop. 2000), has burned more than 150 acres of State and Private lands, and is 0% contained.

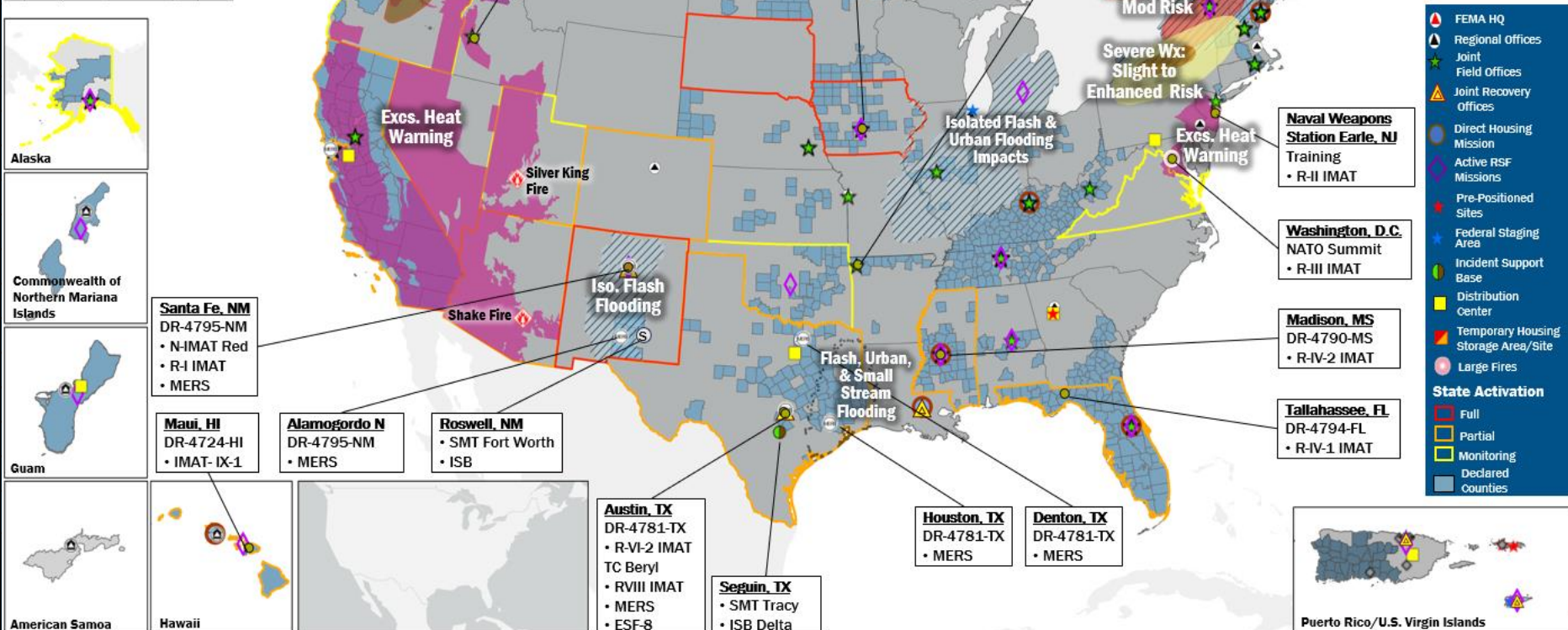
