Region 1 (ME, VT, NH, MA, CT, RI)

DR-4810-VT:

- Vermonters affected by severe storm, flooding, landslides, and mudslides from July 9-11, 2024, have until October 21, 2024, to apply for FEMA assistance.
- VALs continue to advocate for the private bridge rebuild project with Mennonite Disaster Service, coordinating with FEMA Interagency Recovery Coordination, the Federal Disaster Recovery Officer, and the *Engineers Without Borders* collegiate chapter of the University of Vermont, for potential hands-on project support.
- The VAL Team continues to support seven Long Term Recovery Groups in various stages of development, procuring national, and local resources aiding in their recovery efforts. In conjunction with the State Individual Assistance Officer and Vermont VOAD, VALs are also facilitating a series of capacity-building webinars to LTRGs.

DR-4820-CT:

- Federal disaster assistance is available to the state of Connecticut to supplement recovery efforts in the areas affected by severe storms, flooding, landslides, and mudslides from August 18-19, 2024. The disaster declaration makes federal funding available to affected individuals in Fairfield, Litchfield, and New Haven Counties.
- Federal funding is also available on a cost-sharing basis for hazard mitigation measures statewide.

Region 2 (NY, NJ, PR, USVI)

DR-4818-NY:

• Federal disaster assistance is available to the **Saint Regis Mohawk Tribe** to supplement recovery efforts in the areas affected by the severe storms and flooding from August 8-10, 2024. **Public Assistance** federal funding is available to the Tribal Nation and certain private nonprofit organizations on a cost-sharing basis for emergency work and the repair or replacement of facilities damaged by the severe storms and flooding. Federal funding is also available on a cost-sharing basis for hazard mitigation measures.

DR-4825-NY:

• Federal disaster assistance is available to the state of New York to supplement recovery efforts in the areas affected by the remnants of Tropical Storm Debby from August 8–10, 2024. **Public Assistance** federal funding is available to the state, tribal, and eligible local governments and certain **private nonprofit organizations** on a cost-sharing basis for emergency work and the repair or replacement of facilities damaged by Tropical Storm Debby in **Allegany, Broome, Delaware, Essex, Franklin, Jefferson, Ontario, Steuben, St. Lawrence, and Yates Counties**. Federal funding is also available on a cost-sharing basis for hazard mitigation measures statewide.

Region 3 (DC, MD, VA, PA, WV, DE)

DR-4815-PA:

- A new **Disaster Recovery Center** (DRC) opened at the Penn-York Retreat Center in Potter County: Hepburn Township Volunteer Fire Company, 615 East Route 973 Highway, Cogan Station, PA 17728. Hours of operation are Monday Saturday, 8 a.m. 6 p.m. With this addition, survivors are able to visit DRCs in all four disaster-designated counties in Pennsylvania: Lycoming, Potter, Tioga, and Union Counties. **Click for full list**.
- The VAL Team is working with the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency State VAL on an updated common operating plan for disaster.

Region 4 (KY, TN, SC, NC, GA, AL, MS, FL)

DR-4806-FL:

- FEMA has opened Mobile Disaster Recovery Center in Baker County to provide one-on-one help to Floridians affected by Hurricane Debby. **Center location: Baker County,** Baker County Fairgrounds, 5567 Lauramore Road, Macclenny, FL 32063. Open 10 a.m.–8 p.m. Monday-Thursday. When this center moves to a new location, details will be provided.

DR-4821-GA:

- Federal disaster assistance is available to the state of Georgia to supplement recovery efforts in the areas affected by Tropical Storm Debby from Aug. 4–20, 2024. The declaration makes federal funding available to affected **individuals in Bryan, Buhr lloch, Chatham, Effingham, Evans, Liberty, Long, and Screven Counties**.
- Federal funding for **Public Assistance** is also available to state, eligible local governments, and certain private nonprofit organizations on a cost-sharing basis for emergency work and the repair or replacement of facilities in Appling, Atkinson, Bacon, Brantley, Brooks, Bryan, Bulloch, Burke, Camden, Candler, Charlton, Chatham, Clinch, Coffee, Colquitt, Cook, Echols, Effingham, Evans, Jeff Davis, Jenkins, Lanier, Long, Lowndes, McIntosh, Pierce, Screven, Tattnall, Thomas, Tift, Toombs, Ware, and Wayne Counties.

DR-4804-KY:

- Homeowners and renters affected by May 21-27 severe storms, straight-line winds, tornadoes, landslides, and mudslides are invited to Flatwoods Senior Center to meet with FEMA face to face. Disaster survivors can talk with FEMA experts to ask questions and learn everything they want to know about federal disaster assistance. FEMA, other federal agencies and local resources will be on hand to provide one-on-one assistance.
 - Sept. 27, 10 a.m.-7 p.m. ET; and Sept. 28, 9 a.m.-5 p.m. ET., at Flatwoods Senior Center, 2513 Reed St., Flatwoods, KY 41139.

Region 5 (MN, IL, WI, MI, IN, OH)

DR-4797-MN:

- FEMA/State DRC opened in Murray County to help residents kickstart their recovery after the severe storms and flooding of June 16 – July 4, 2024: Fulda Senior Center 107 N. Lafayette Ave., Fulda, MN 56131 Hours: Mon. – Fri. 9 a.m. – 6:30 p.m., Sat. 9 a.m. – 4 p.m. Closed Sundays.
- FEMA has extended the application deadline to October 27, 2024, for survivors in the <u>21 counties</u> designated for Individual Assistance (IA).
- VALs have begun outreach efforts in counties newly designated for IA.
- The VAL Team continues to build capacity around participation in Long Term Recovery Groups with local partners.
- VAL POC: Tamara Theiler

DR-4819-IL:

- Federal disaster assistance is available to the state of Illinois to supplement recovery efforts in the areas affected by severe storms, tornadoes, straight-line winds, and flooding from July 13-16, 2024. The disaster declaration makes federal funding available to affected individuals in Cook, Fulton, Henry, St. Clair, Washington, Will, and Winnebago Counties.
- Federal funding is also available on a cost-sharing basis for hazard mitigation measures statewide.

Region 6 (AR, LA, NM, TX, OK)

DR-4652-NM | HERMIT'S PEAK/CALF CANYON:

- By law, the Claims Office can only pay claims that include the required documentation. After filing a Notice of Loss (NOL), claimants have 150 days to provide documents showing Proof of Loss (POL). If claimants think they will be unable to deliver the needed documents in 150 days, they can request an extension. Extensions are not automatic and must be requested by the claimant. It's important to know that claimants do not have to wait for a Navigator to reach out to them to submit documentation. Claimants may submit documentation any time after they have received their Letter of Acknowledgment. Documentation may be hand delivered directly to one of the three claims offices or may be submitted via email to: FEMA-hermits-peak@FEMA.dhs.gov, or mailed to: P.O. Box 1329 Santa Fe, NM 87504.
- People impacted by the Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon Fire who are awaiting conservation restoration plans from the U.S. Department of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) are encouraged to start a FEMA claim as soon as possible. Affected individuals should not wait for the NRCS to inspect their properties before filing a Notice of Loss (NOL) with the FEMA Hermits Peak/Calf Canyon Claims Office as they may risk missing the Nov. 14, 2024, deadline due to NRCS working through a heavy backlog.
- The State's Disaster Case Management Team is hosting a Contractor Connects event on Saturday, 10/19 from 10am to 2pm at Mora Elementary School Gymnasium, 455 NM-518 Ranger Drive, Mora, NM 87732. The event will be a community rebuilding and repair expo for those impacted by the Hermit's Peak/Calf Canyon Fires. Residents can get assistance with finding and hiring a contractor for rebuilding, repairing, and flood clean-up; meet licensed contractors ready to start working; and get help from disaster case managers.

DR-4795-NM:

- The Lincoln County COAD and LTRG has been officially developed to serve residents of Ruidoso and Lincoln County impacted by the wildfires and subsequent flooding. An executive board has been established that consists of board chair, board co-chair, board secretary, and board treasurer. The VALs will work with the COAD and LTRG to identify support and technical assistance needed to develop any committees or sub-committees.
- Effective Saturday, 9/28, the State of New Mexico/FEMA Disaster Recovery Center (DRC) hours at the Horton Complex, 237 Service Road, Ruidoso, NM 88345 will be Monday through Friday, 9am to 6pm and Saturdays, 12pm to 4pm MT.
- Disaster Legal Services (DLS) is a free service, funded by FEMA and available to southern New Mexico residents impacted by the South Fork and Salt Fires and flooding that began June 17 through Aug. 20. If you are in need of legal services and you live in **Lincoln, Otero, Rio Arriba or San Juan Counties or the Mescalero Apache Reservation**, DLS may be able to help. Disaster Legal Services are provided through the Young Lawyers Division of the American Bar Association (ABA). You can reach them at **1-855-204-2569**. DLS may only give advice and help with cases that won't have a fee. For fee cases, they may suggest a local lawyer referral service.
- For purposes of the Post-Wildfire Exception, the federal agency responsible for the land on which the post-wildfire conditions existed determines the fire containment date. The Post-Wildfire Exception of the 30-day waiting period is determined on a case-by-case basis at the time of loss using the above criteria. Referred to as the Post-Wildfire Exception, the standard 30-day waiting period does not apply to new policies if, at the time of your flood loss, all of the following criteria are met. For more information about flood insurance, please call your insurance agent or contact the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) Call Center at 877-336-2627.
 - The covered property experiences damage caused by flood that originated on federal land; and
 - o Post-wildfire conditions on federal land caused or worsened the flooding; and
 - o The policyholder purchased the policy either before the fire containment date; or during the 60-calendar-day period following the fire containment date.



FEMA Updates its National Disaster Recovery Framework to Enhance Disaster Recovery





The 30-day public comment period is open through Oct. 23, 2024.

FEMA has updated the National Disaster Recovery Framework (NDRF) to streamline and clarify the federal government's approach for providing disaster recovery resources and support to disaster impacted communities. The NDRF explains the federal government's roles and responsibilities for organizing and deploying disaster recovery assistance. It also enhances effective collaboration among federal agencies and state, local, territorial governments and Tribal Nations, while informing nongovernmental partners.

States, local governments, Tribal Nations and territories, as well as nonprofits and the emergency management community, are encouraged to visit **fema.gov** to review FEMA's updates to its National Disaster Recovery Framework. Key revisions focus on clarifying roles and responsibilities, detailing the Federal Recovery Support Function structure and its role in supporting local recovery goals, enhancing collaboration across the whole community, and providing practical resources to assist in recovery planning efforts.

The updates also incorporate feedback from Tribal Nations, territories, state and local partners, nonprofits and voluntary organizations. FEMA engaged business, industry and academic partners to gather lessons learned, best practices and other input to maximize the usefulness of the framework.

The 30-day public comment period is open through Oct. 23, 2024. Written comments may be submitted through **fema.gov**; any remarks received during the comment period will be reviewed and considered for the final version of the framework.

Emergency Manager Exchange Program Enrollment Extended

FEMA invites state, local, Tribal Nation and territorial emergency managers to apply for the Emergency Manager Exchange (EMX) program. The agency wants your experience and expertise to help shape our programs and policies. **The nomination period opened Aug. 26 and has been extended to Sept. 30**.

During the exchange, non-federal emergency managers will work for six months in FEMA offices engaging with decision makers. FEMA staff will be sent to the emergency manager's home office to help fill in gaps and learn about the participant's emergency management work.

Emergency Managers can apply for the EMX program by submitting their resume and a nomination letter from their home office.
