

Tropical Storm Leslie: (Advisory #36, as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 1,635 miles WSW of the Azores
- Moving N at 10 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 60 mph
- Gradual weakening is forecast to continue

Disturbance 1 (AL94): (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located over the southwestern portion of the Cabo Verde Islands
- Additional development appears unlikely
- Formation chance: 48-hour Med (40%); 7-day – Med (40%)



Milton - Florida

Situation: FEMA is responding in coordination with Florida emergency management; Locally executed, state managed, and federally supported

Lifelines: (TC Helene & Milton SLB, as of 6:00 p.m. ET, Oct 10)

Safety & Security:

- 17 (+2) counties under Mandatory /11 (-1) counties under Voluntary evacuations
- Federal and State assets strategically pre-staged for life-saving response operations

Food, Hydration, Shelter:

- 282 shelters open/13,602 occupants
- 1.2M meals received by the state, 23k blankets/202k tarps staged Health & Medical:
- 530 ambulances, 60 (+16) paratransit, 16 (-14) air staged
- 2 DMATs w/cache moving to Orlando Responder Lodging; 10 (+6) HCSATs beginning assessments at state identified locations
- 397 (+45) Healthcare facilities evacuated



- 1 EPA & 2 USACE water/wastewater SME deployed to FL SEOC
- 7 drinking water treatment plants temporarily closed in 5 counties
- Water main break in Pinellas County impacting water supply to 5 hospitals

Communications:

- Assessments ongoing; responder communication support resources staged Transportation:
- Major throughways remain open, but many roads impacted by debris and flood water
- Airports accepting military and emergency aircraft only
- Daytona Beach International, Melbourne International, Orlando International, Page Field, Sarasota-Bradenton International, St. Petersburg/Clearwater International, Southwest Florida International, and Tampa International

 - 3.5M meals/1.4M liters of water received by the state
- NC: 16 shelters / 690 occupants
- o 7.8M meals/10M liters of water received by the state






