

#### Tropical Storm Leslie: (Advisory #40 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 1,165 miles WSW of the Azores
- Moving NE at 24 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 50 mph
- Gradual weakening is forecast the next few days with Leslie forecast to become a post-tropical cyclone tonight or Sunday

#### Disturbance 1 (AL94): (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located a couple hundred miles west of the Cabo Verde Islands
- Conditions are expected to become less conducive for further development later today. A short-lived tropical depression could still form at any time today
- Formation chance: 48-hour Med (40%);
   7-day Med (40%)

- TC Milton: 36 (-227) shelters open, pop. 3,184 (-10,418) (ARC morning shelter report 6:49 a.m. ET, Oct 12)
- NGO/VOADs entered impacted areas 10/11 for feeding operations
- 400k meals delivered to state; 700k meals and 300k liters of water ETA 10/12 Health & Medical:
- 32 post-assessments completed; 4 hospitals reported operational impacts, 5 hospitals reported minor operational impacts, 1 hospital on generator power
- Water systems affecting 5 hospitals in Pinellas County are being repressurized
   FL logistics supporting mobilization of 12 tanker water trucks to support 3 hospitals

- Barrier Islands Siesta Key and Casey Key (Sarasota Co.) without water due to flooded lift stations and possible leaks and breaks; no ETA for return of water service
- TC Helene: 16 Active boil Water Notices affecting 14,000 customers / TC Milton: 15 (+10) Pop: 11,983



- = 1.6M (-800k) / 14% (-8) customers without power *Transportation:*
- 71 closures on state roads
- Main interstates are open some offramps may still be flooded
- All major airports are operational
- Port Conditions ZULU for 11 ports on FL Gulf Coast incl. (St. Petersburg, Sarasota, Bradenton)
- 8 ports open with restriction incl. Tampa

Hazardous Materials:

 Orange Co. Environmental Protection Division issued an alert for all lakes and rivers in Orange Co. due to potential contamination/hazards






