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# Wildfires – Central & Southern Plains

**Situation** Extremely critical fire weather conditions are in effect for the southern High Plains and western Oklahoma. Consistent winds of 25 to 30 mph, with wind gusts up to 60 mph in areas, low dewpoints, and lack of rainfall provide critical fire weather fuel. The combination of increasing wind gusts and directional change may support rapid fire spread with ongoing fires. Sixteen Fire Management Assistance Grants (FMAGs), covering a combined 178,930 acres have been approved. The wildfires prompted 14,614 evacuations, destroyed or damaged 300 structures, and threatened an additional 20,078 structures. **Mandatory evacuations remain in effect throughout Oklahoma; however, mandatory evacuations have been lifted for the South Owl fire.** Multiple fire-related watches and warnings remain in effect through Tuesday evening









## Registrations in Active Declarations


