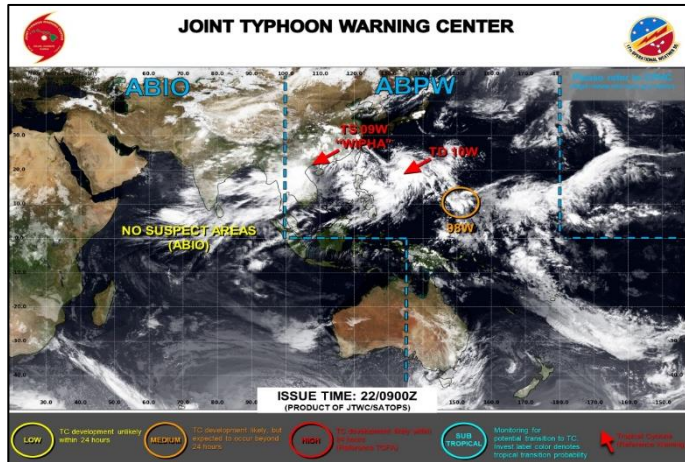

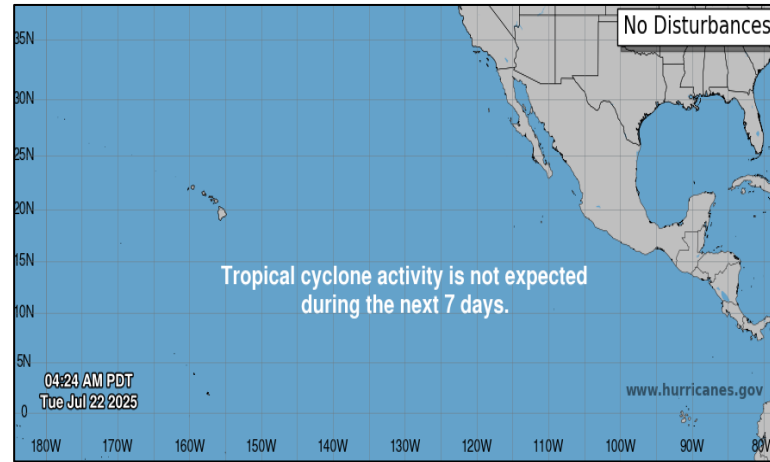

Disturbance 1 (98W): (as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

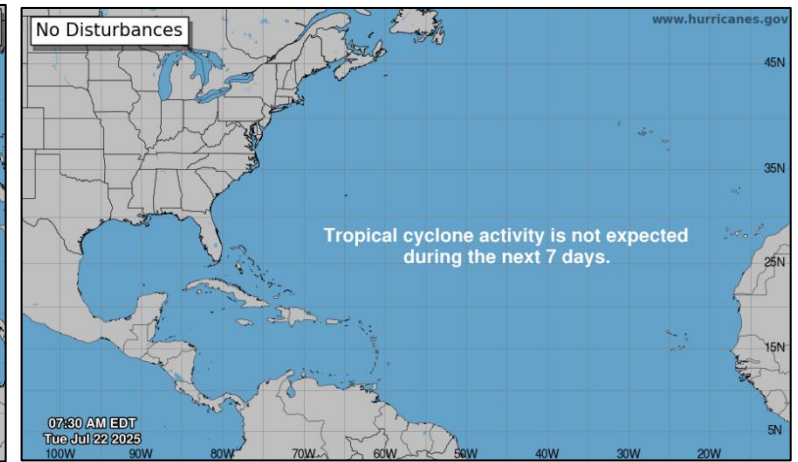
- Located 470 miles SE of Guam
- Moving NNW; Maximum sustained winds of 15-20 mph
- Gradual strengthening is still expected over the next five days
- System will make its closest approach to Guam on Thursday, with heavy rainfall and flash flooding possible
- Formation chance – 24-hour: **Med**

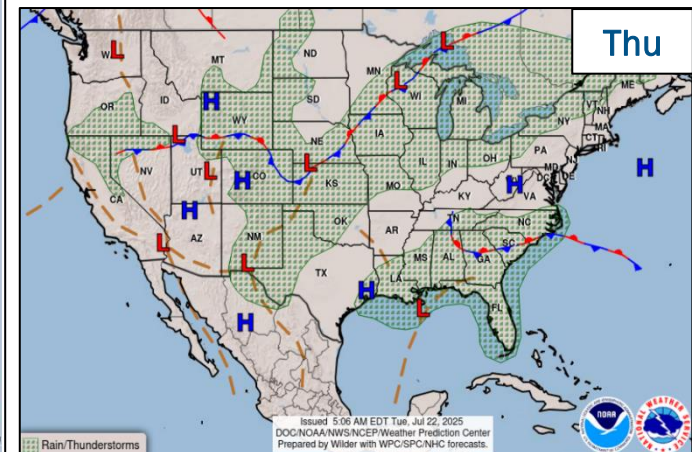
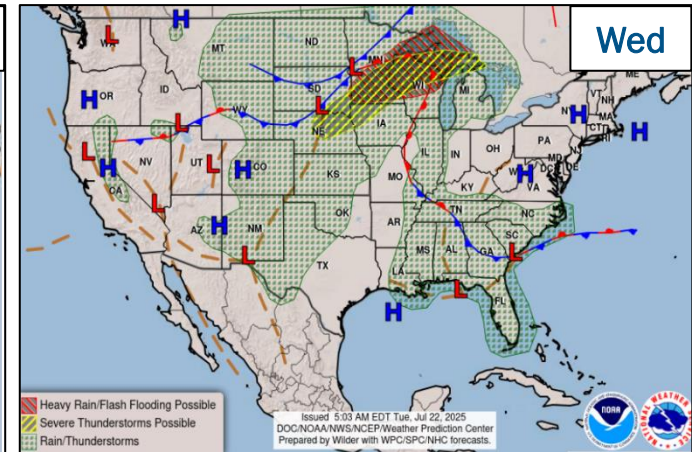
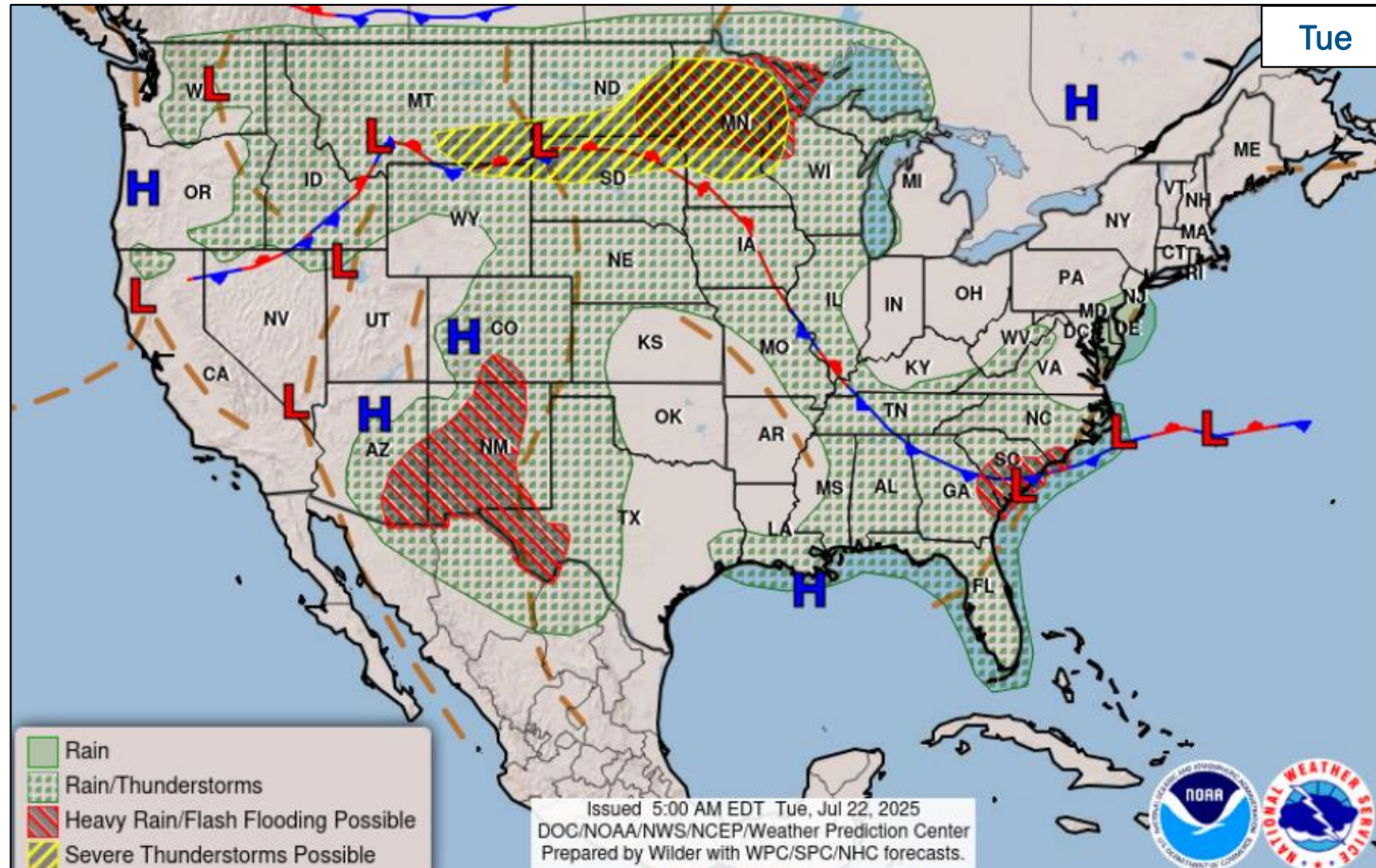
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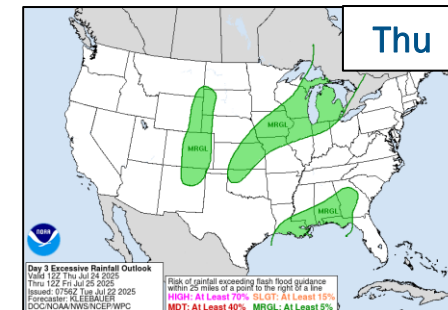
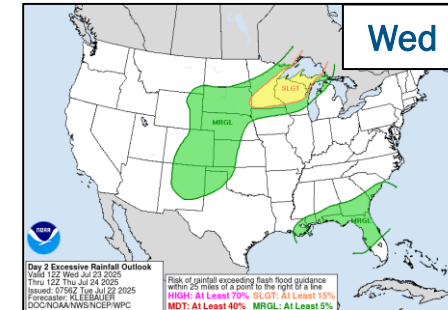
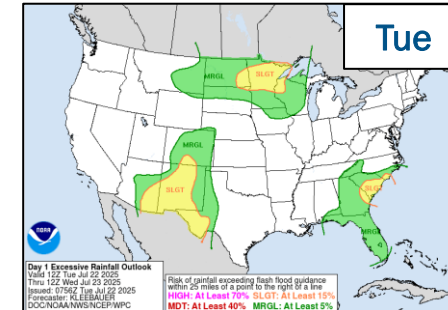
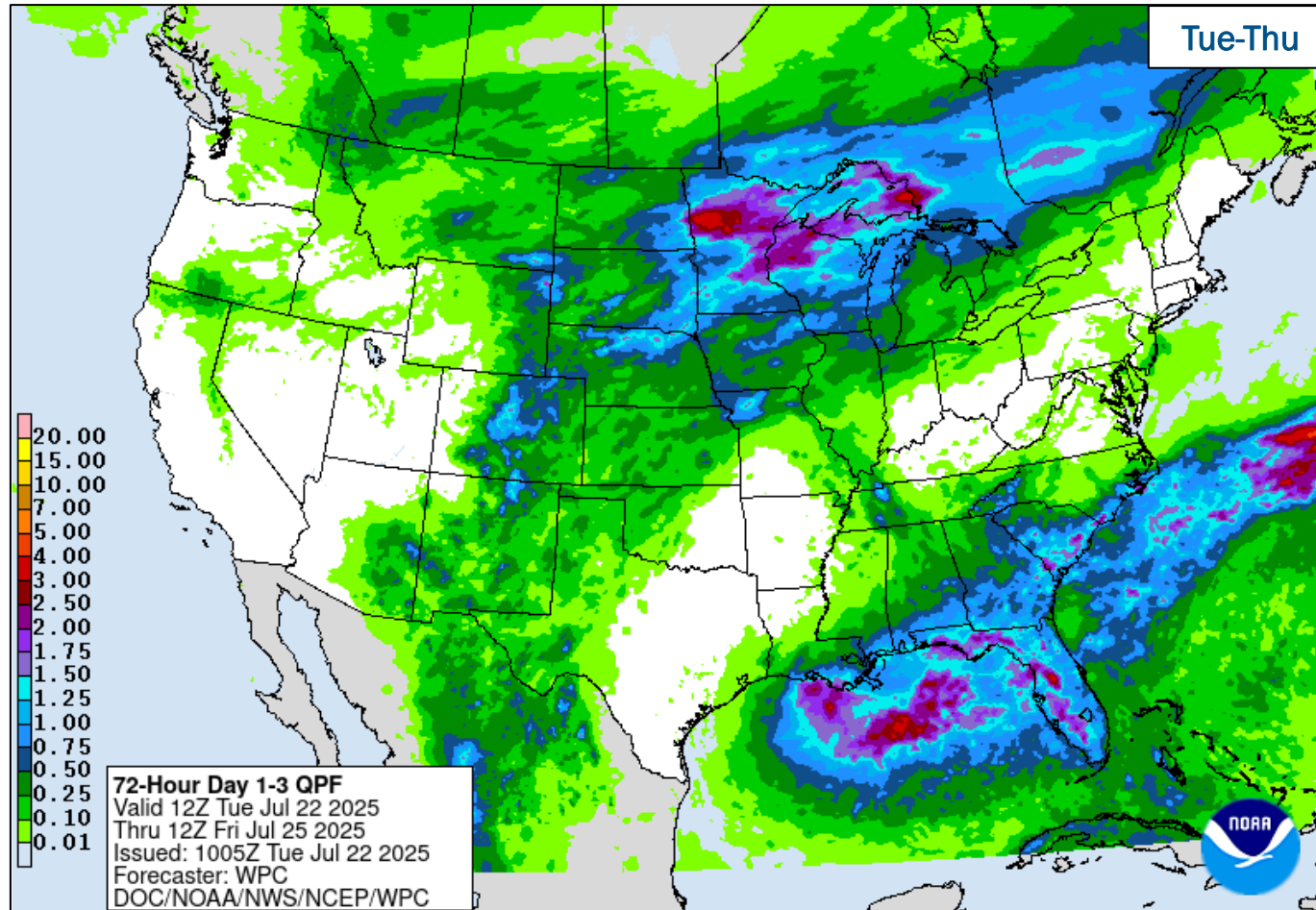
National Weather Forecast



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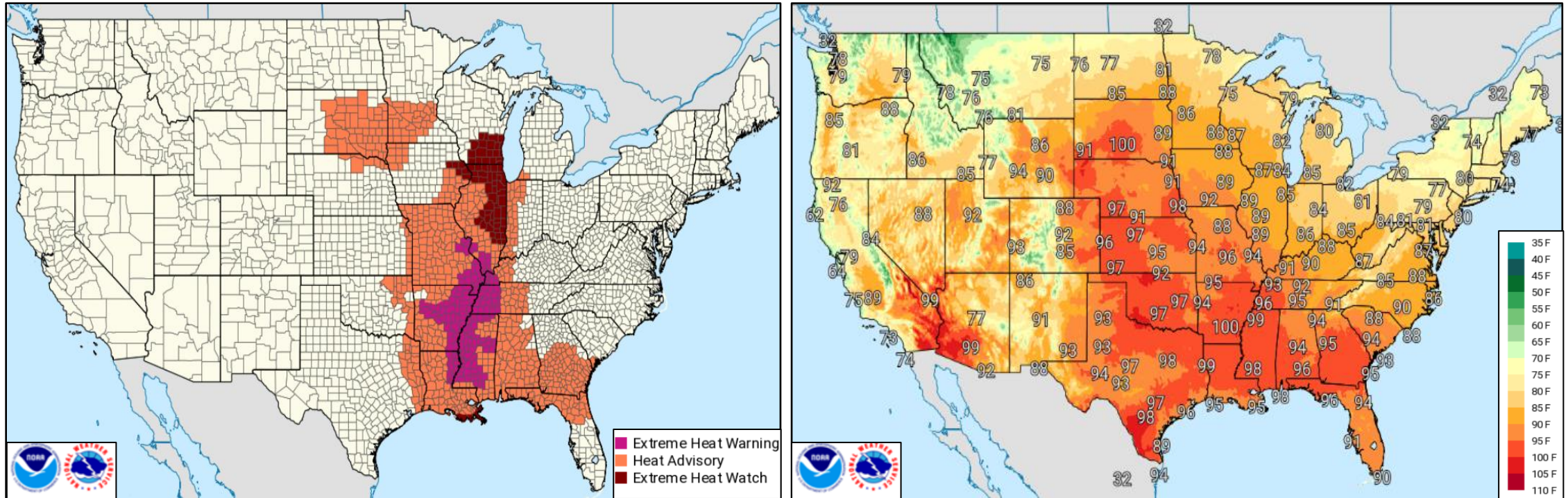
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



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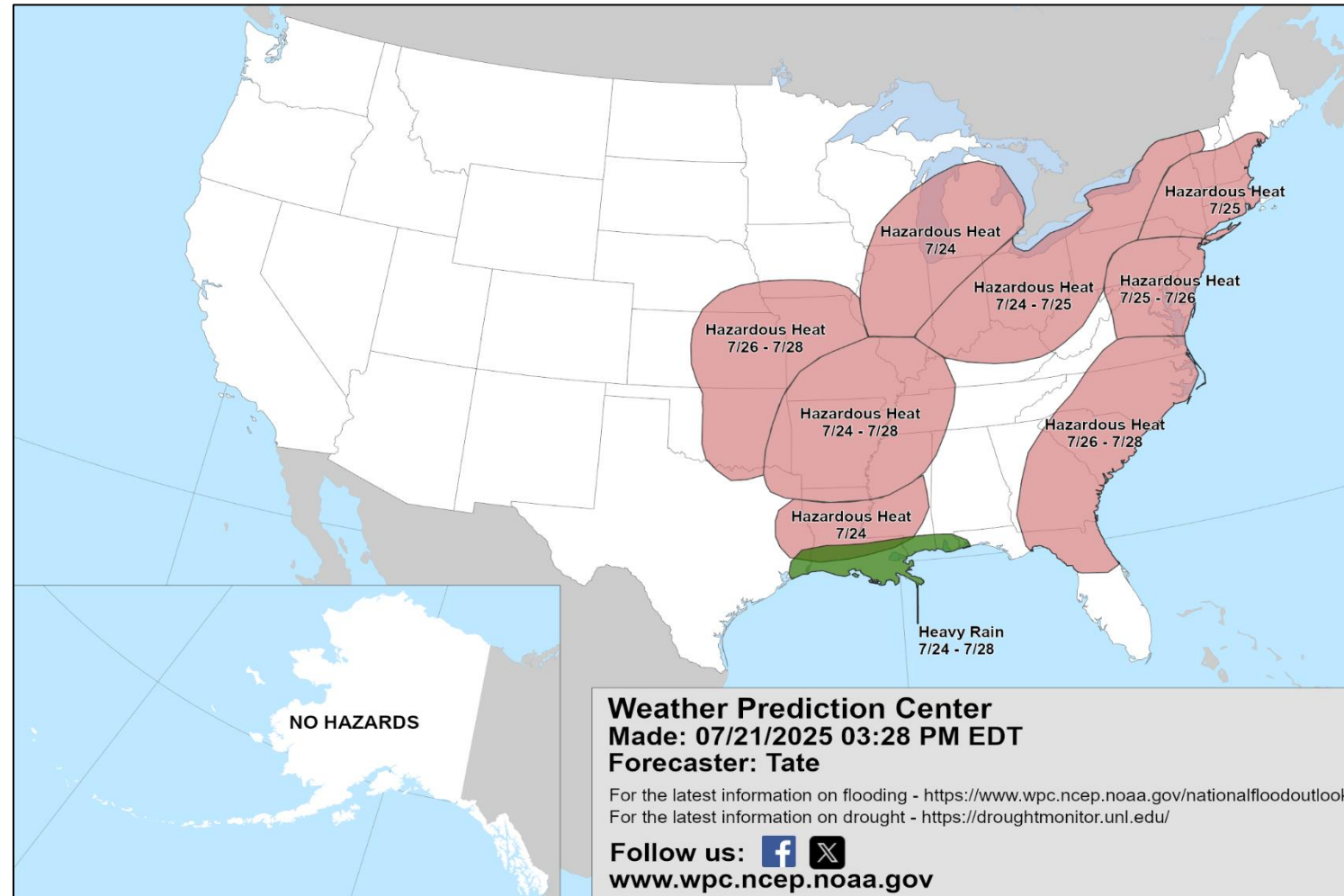
Heat Risk – Jul 22

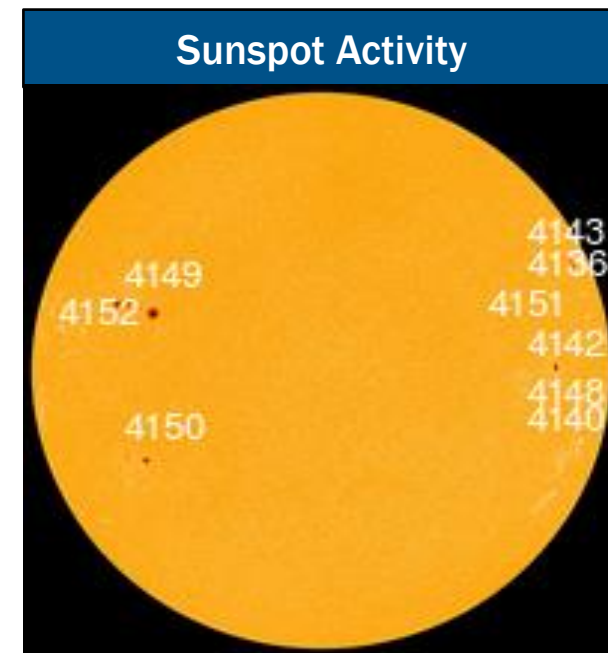
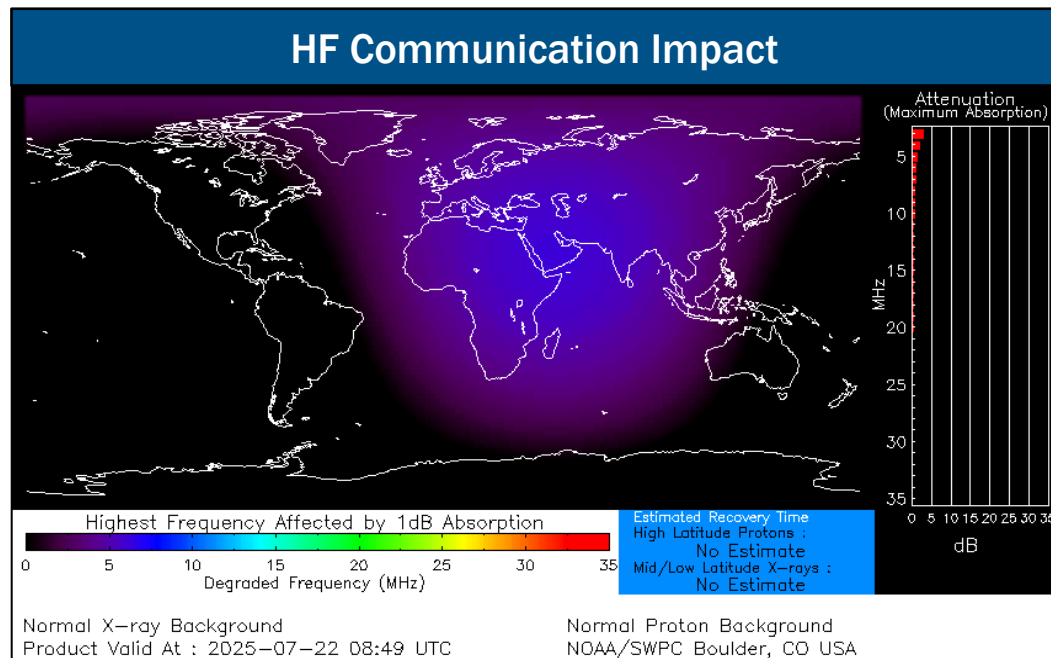
