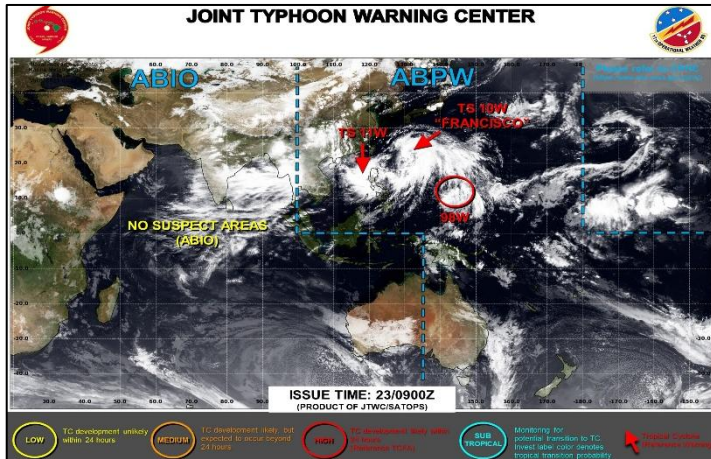

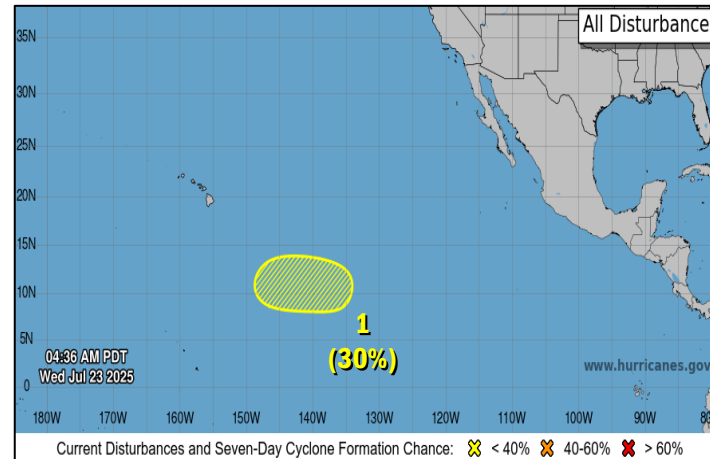
Western Pacific



Disturbance 1 (98W): (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 285 miles ESE of Guam
- Moving NW; Maximum sustained winds of 20-26 mph
- Favorable conditions for development with moderate vertical wind shear
- System will make its closest approach to Guam on Thursday, with heavy rainfall and flash flooding possible
- Formation chance – 24-hour: Med

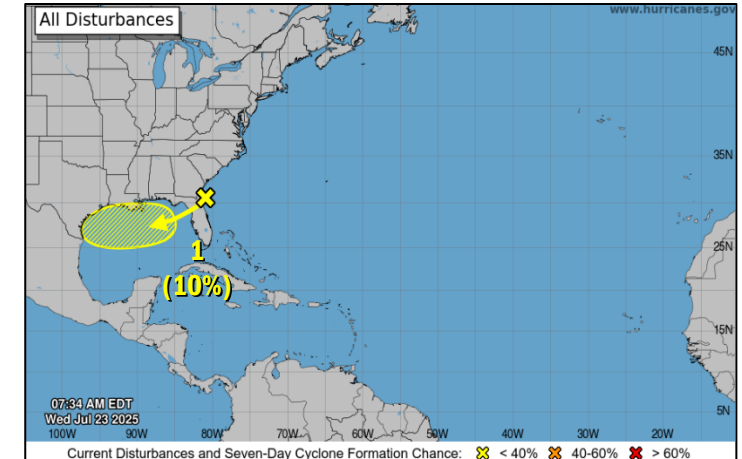
Central and Eastern Pacific



Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located well SE of the Hawaiian Islands
- Moving W at 10-15 mph
- Gradual development is possible as the system moves generally westward
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (30%)

Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

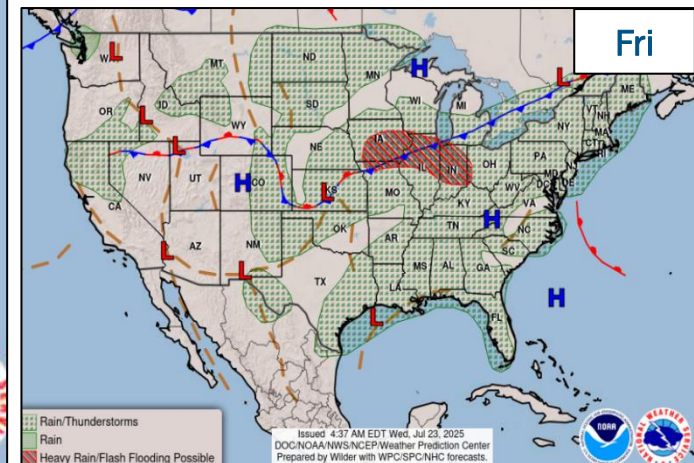
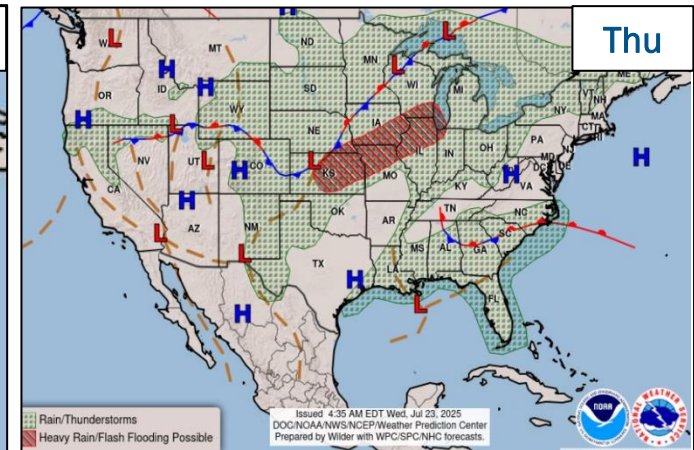
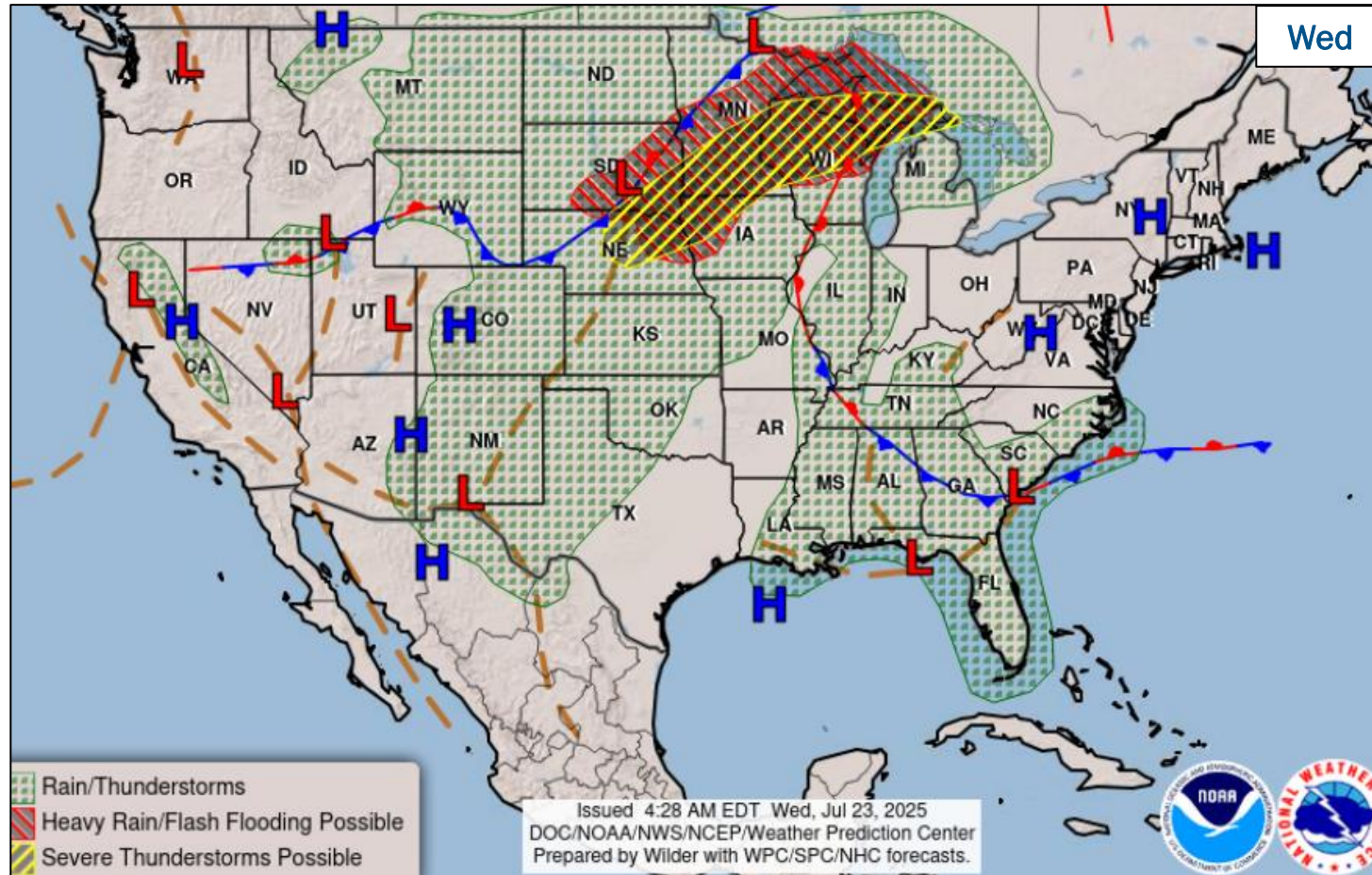
- Located near Southeastern US coast

- System is likely to move inland this weekend, ending its chances for development

- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (10%); 7-day: Low (10%)



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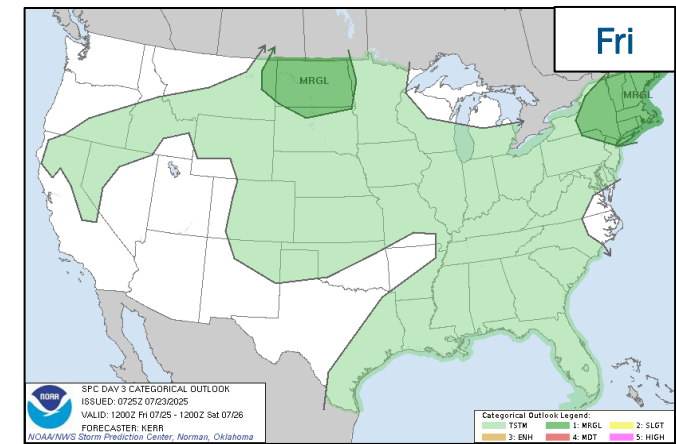
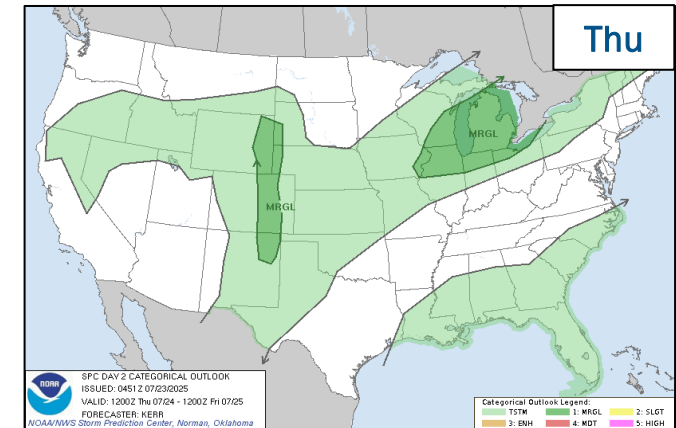
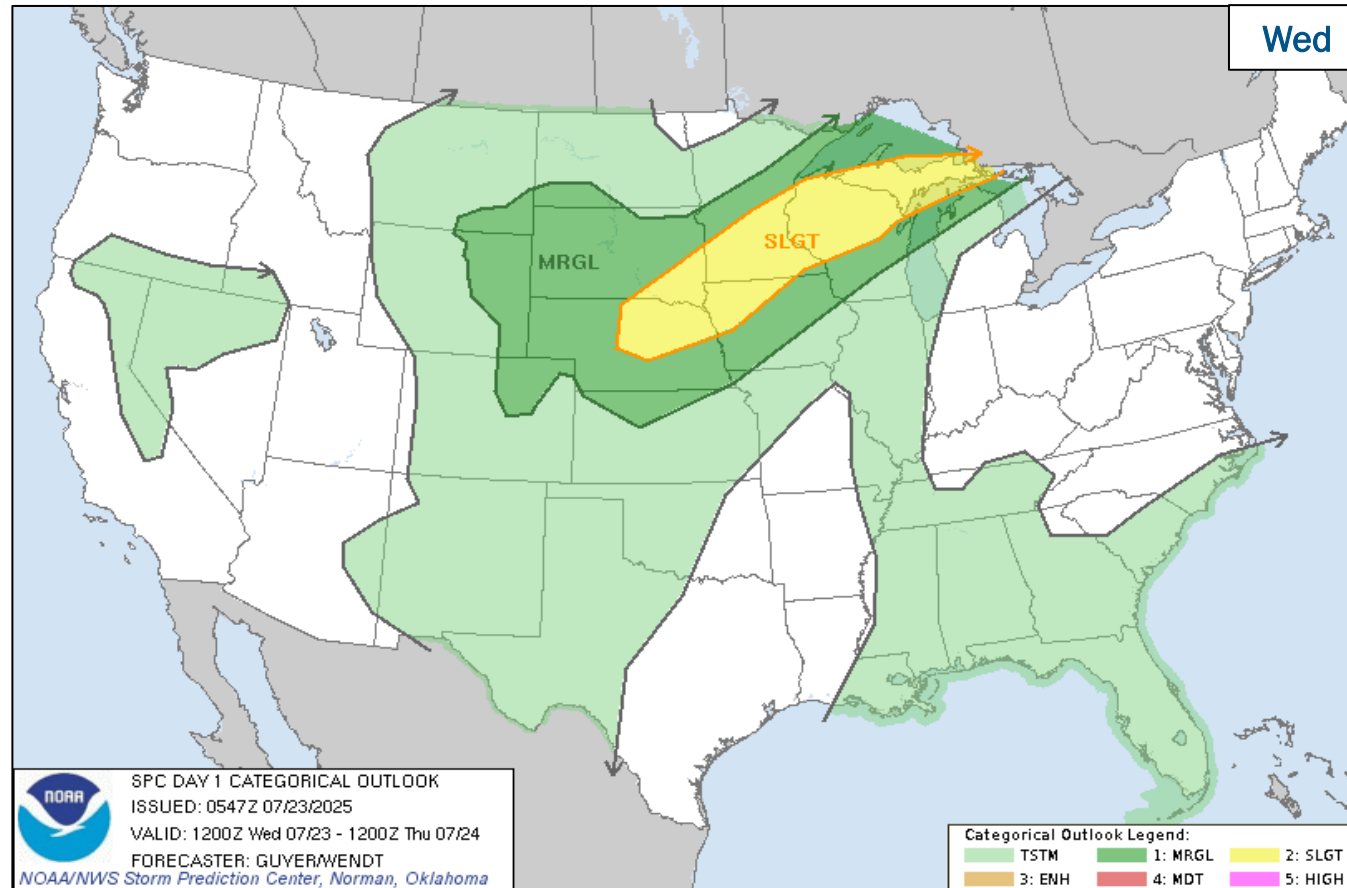

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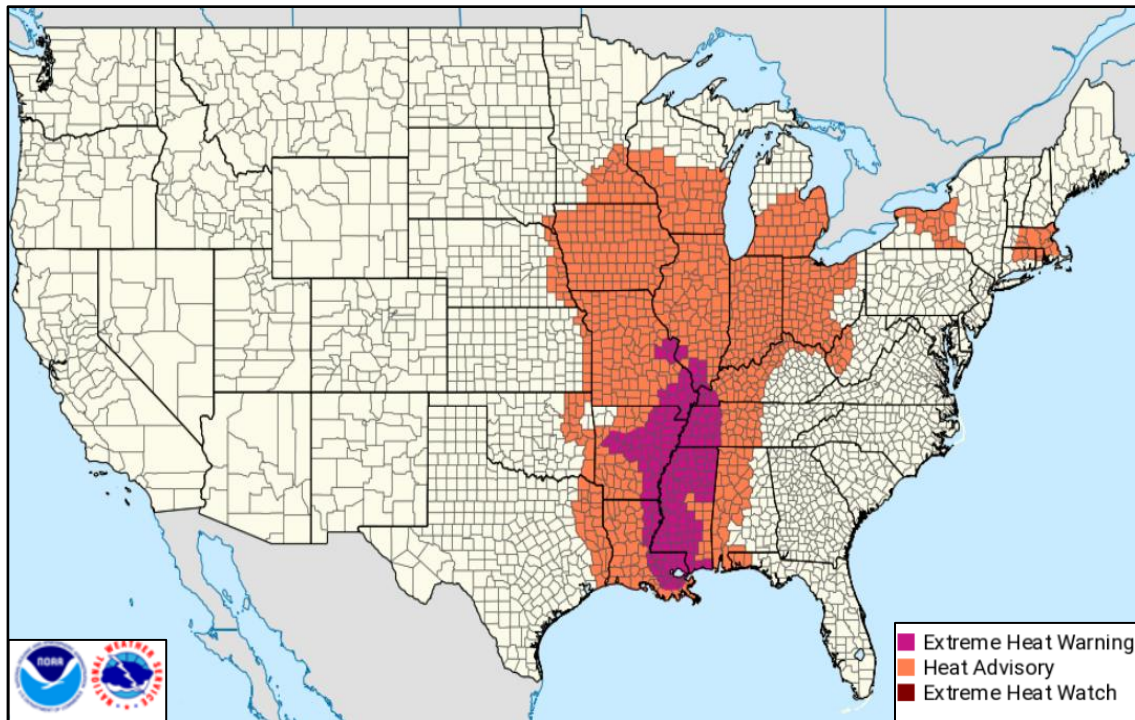
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



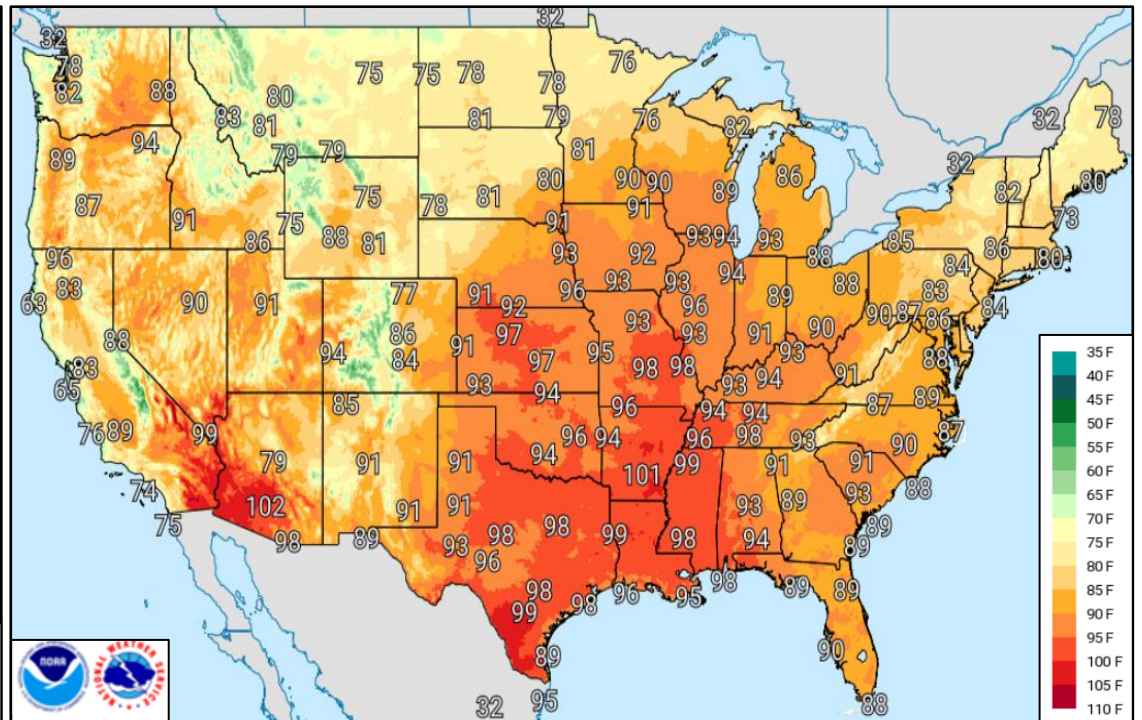
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Heat Risk – Jul 23

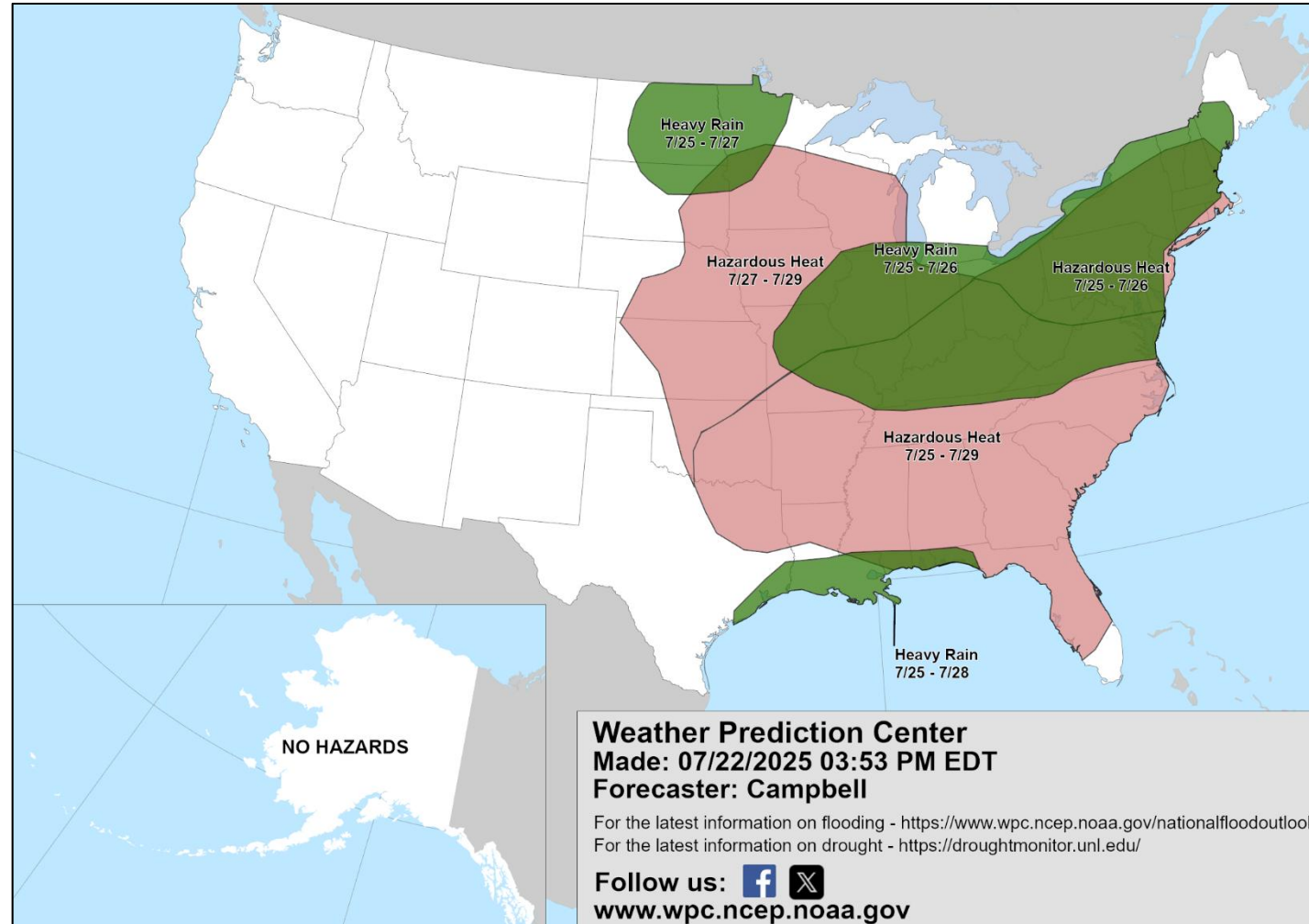
Forecast High Temperatures
