

# FEMA Publishes Notices of Funding Opportunity, Empowering States to Take Charge of Their Own Individualized Disaster Preparedness

---

Today, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) published two Notices of Funding Opportunity, making millions in federal funding available to help states and territories protect their communities from floods and earthquakes.

These funds demonstrate how FEMA is focusing on empowering state, local, tribal and territorial governments to manage disaster response and recovery.

The announcement comes after a critical evaluation of all grant programs and recipients to root out waste, fraud and abuse and deliver accountability for the American taxpayer. Unlike the previous administration, recipients of grants will no longer be permitted to use federal funds to house illegal immigrants at luxury hotels, fund climate change pet projects or empower radical organizations with unseemly ties that don't serve the interest of the American people.

## Details

The Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 funding opportunity for the Community Assistance Program–State Support Services Element (CAP-SSSE) makes \$15 million available to states and territories. This program is designed to support communities in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) by helping states proactively identify, prevent, and resolve floodplain management issues before flood events occur.

The FY 2025 funding opportunity for the NEHRP Individual State Earthquake Assistance makes \$2 million available to states and territories. This program is focuses on helping states to implement earthquake safety, mitigation, and resilience activities.

Both earthquakes and floods can happen almost anyway and with very little warning. These FEMA grant programs help states and territories conduct take proactive steps to reduce their risk and protect their communities.

The application period for both these grant programs will open at Monday, July 28 and close on Monday, August 11 at 5 p.m. ET. All applications must be submitted in [FEMA GO](#).

In the coming weeks, FEMA expects to publish more Notices of Funding Opportunity for its grant programs. These funding opportunities were carefully vetted to ensure taxpayer dollars are not spent frivolously.
