



Atmospheric River – Pacific Northwest

Situation: Excessive rainfall is contributing to an atmospheric river event impacting the Pacific Northwest. Small stream and moderate-to-major river flooding is ongoing across the western Cascade foothills to the Puget Sound region in Washington and is expected to continue through Friday. Saturated soils in burn scar areas will contribute to potential landslides in steep to mountainous terrain as heavy rainfall lingers across the region. Additionally, many rivers are forecast to experience secondary peaks later this week. FEMA Region 10 reports there are currently no resource shortfalls.

Lifeline Impacts: (FEMA R10 Deputy RA, as of 7:09 p.m. ET, Dec 9)

Safety & Security: USACE is actively managing multiple dam releases.

Food, Hydration, Shelter: 3 shelters open / 30 occupants (Red Cross, as of 6:51 a.m. ET)

Transportation: 16 road closures including an I-5 exit

State / Local Response:

- WA SEOC is at Full Activation
- OR SEOC remains at Normal Operations


FEMA / Federal Response:

FEMA Region 10:

- R10 RRCC activated to Enhanced with ESF-3, USCG (Search & Rescue support), NWS, Defense Coordinating Element (DCE), and Civil Air Patrol (CAP) (imagery data collection)
- FEMA R10 IMAT reconstituting from AK operations; R3 IMAT is standing by to assist if needed.
- Two FEMA operations liaisons deployed to WA EOC.


National Weather Forecast

FEMA Common Operating Picture


