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Potomac Interceptor Spill – District of Columbia and Maryland

Situation: On January 19, 2026, a large section of the Potomac Interceptor (PI) sewer line collapsed along Clara Barton Parkway, in Montgomery County. The collapse resulted in a significant overflow into the C & O Canal National Historical Park. The PI carries about 60 million gallons of wastewater daily from as far away as Dulles Airport to the Blue Plains Advanced Wastewater Treatment Plant in Southwest DC for treatment (*DC Water Potomac Interceptor Collapse, as of 6:00 a.m. ET, Feb 17*). **No overflow events impacting surface waters have been reported since February 9** (*DC Water Feb 17 Update: Potomac Inceptor Repairs as of 5:00 a.m. ET, Feb 18*). FEMA is supporting federal interagency coordination for any potential requirements.

State and Local Response:

DC:

- DCHSEMA is at Enhanced Watch (Winter Weather)
- DC Water crews continue to test and optimize the enhanced bypass system and expect it to be fully operational by the end of the week (*DC Water Feb 17 Update: Potomac Inceptor Repairs as of 5:00 a.m. ET, Feb 18*)
- DC Water reports 6 of 7 new high-capacity pumps are now operational with the seventh expected to be online today (*DC Water Feb 17 Update: Potomac Inceptor Repairs as of 5:00 a.m. ET, Feb 18*)
- Specialized cleaning equipment has been mobilized to assist with removing debris that may migrate within the pipe as excavation progresses (*DC Water Feb 17 Update: Potomac Inceptor Repairs as of 5:00 a.m. ET, Feb 18*)
- DC Water reports drinking water is not impacted and daily water sampling is being conducted as depicted on the map (*DC Water Feb 15 Update: Potomac Inceptor Repairs as of 5:00 a.m. ET, Feb 17*)

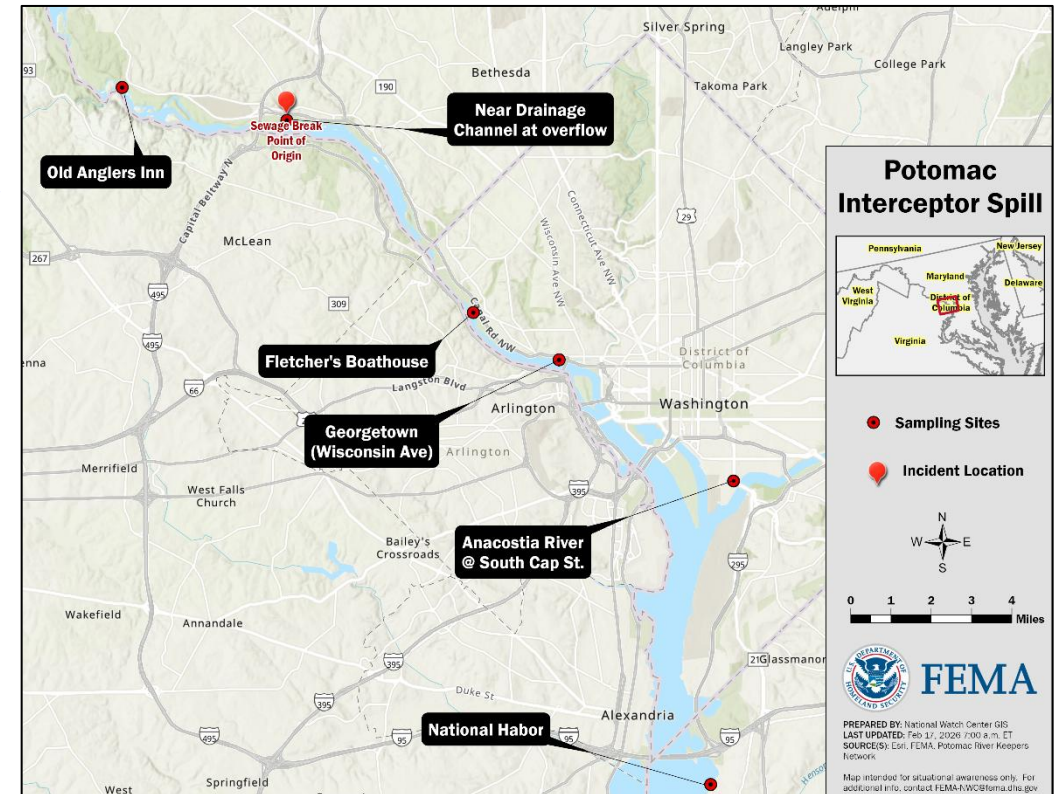

Situation: The Acting Regional Administrator for FEMA Region 6 approved a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) for the Stevens Fire. The fire is burning on state and private land around the communities of Tyrone, Little Ponderosa, and Turpin, Oklahoma (combined pop 721) in Texas and Beaver Counties (estimated pop 26k) . Oklahoma Highway 64 is closed due to the fire spreading. There are reports of 3 shelters open, and the fire is spreading into parts of Kansas, in FEMA Region 7.

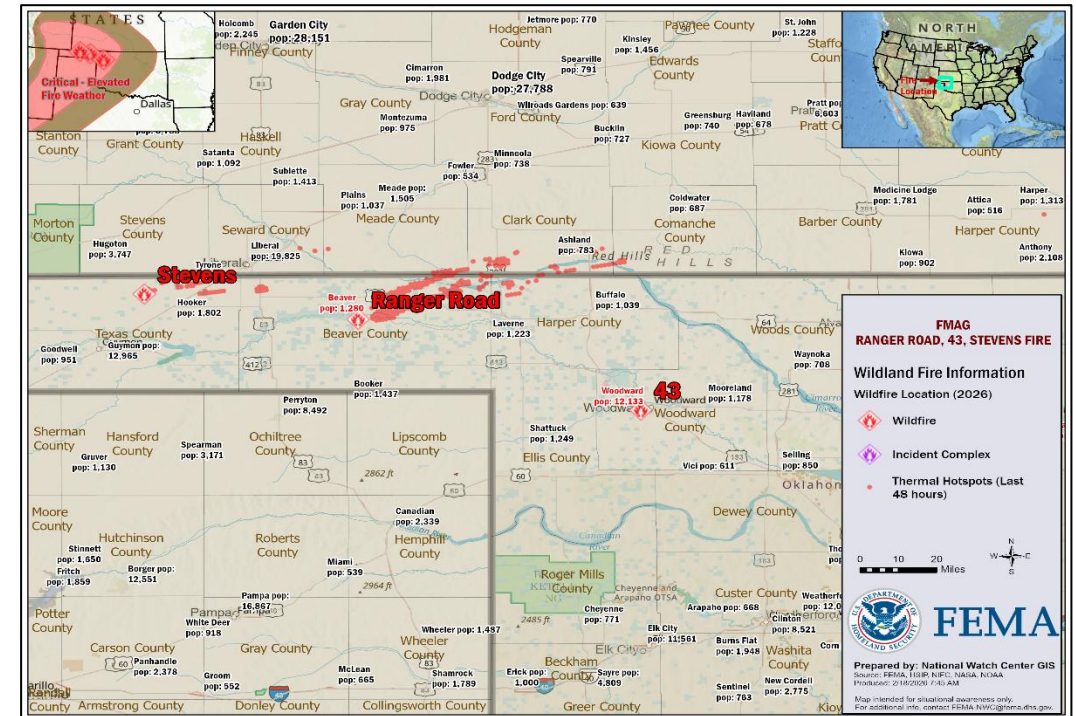

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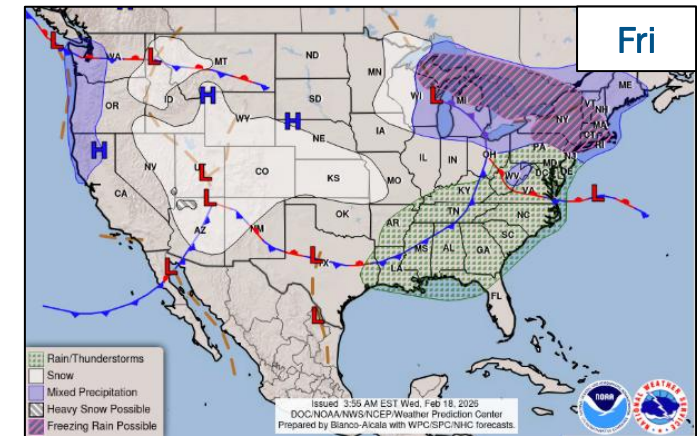
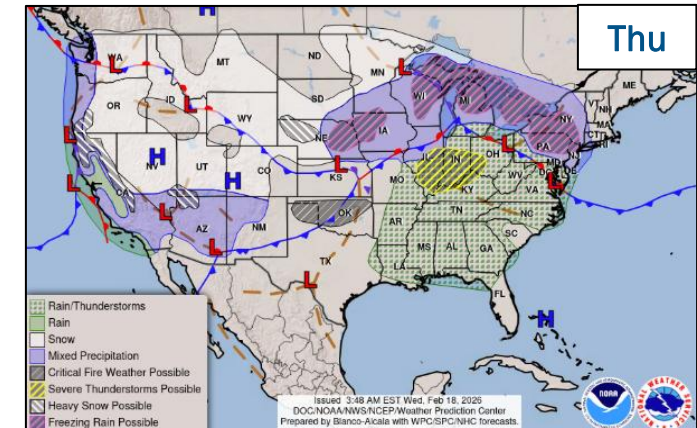
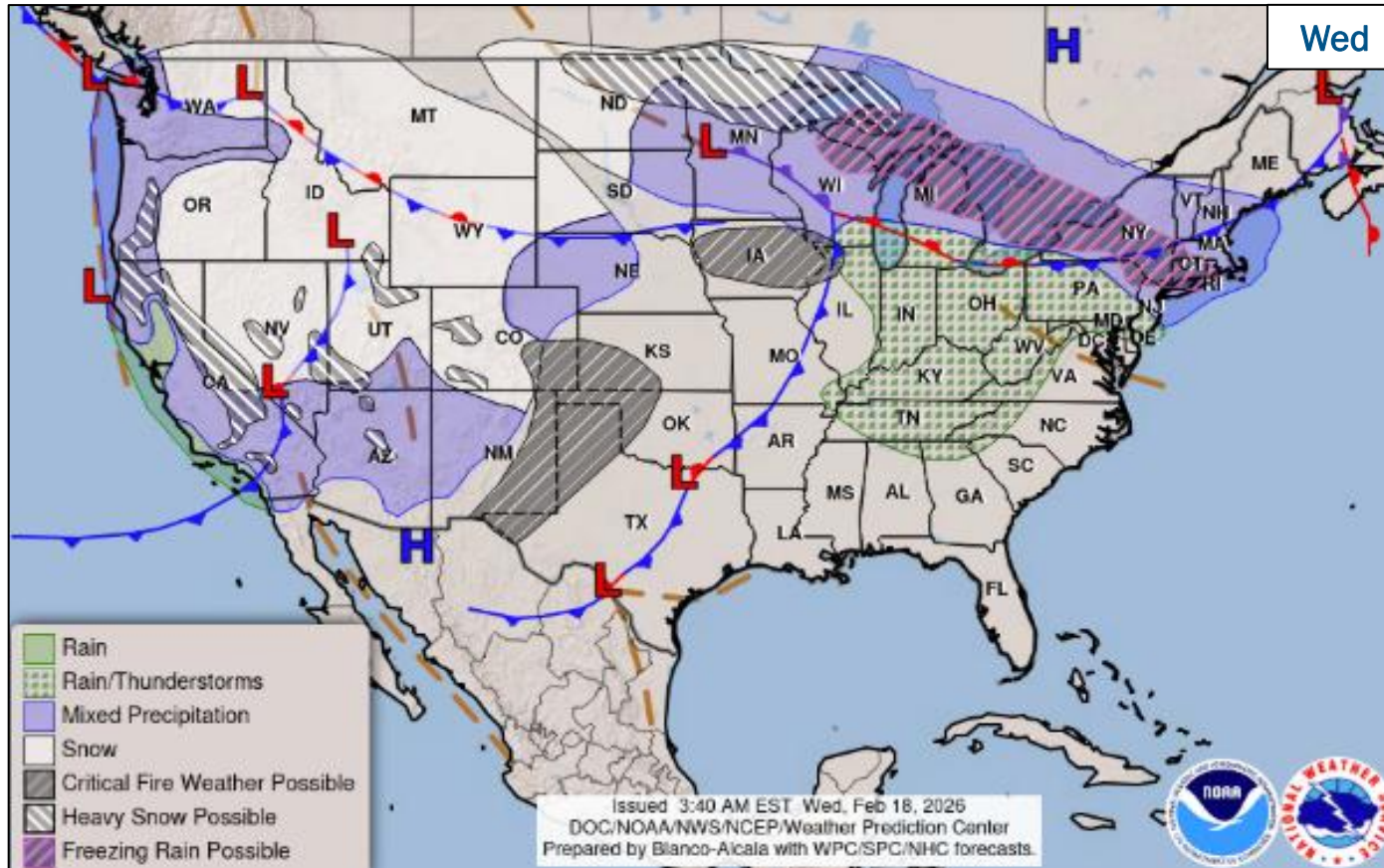
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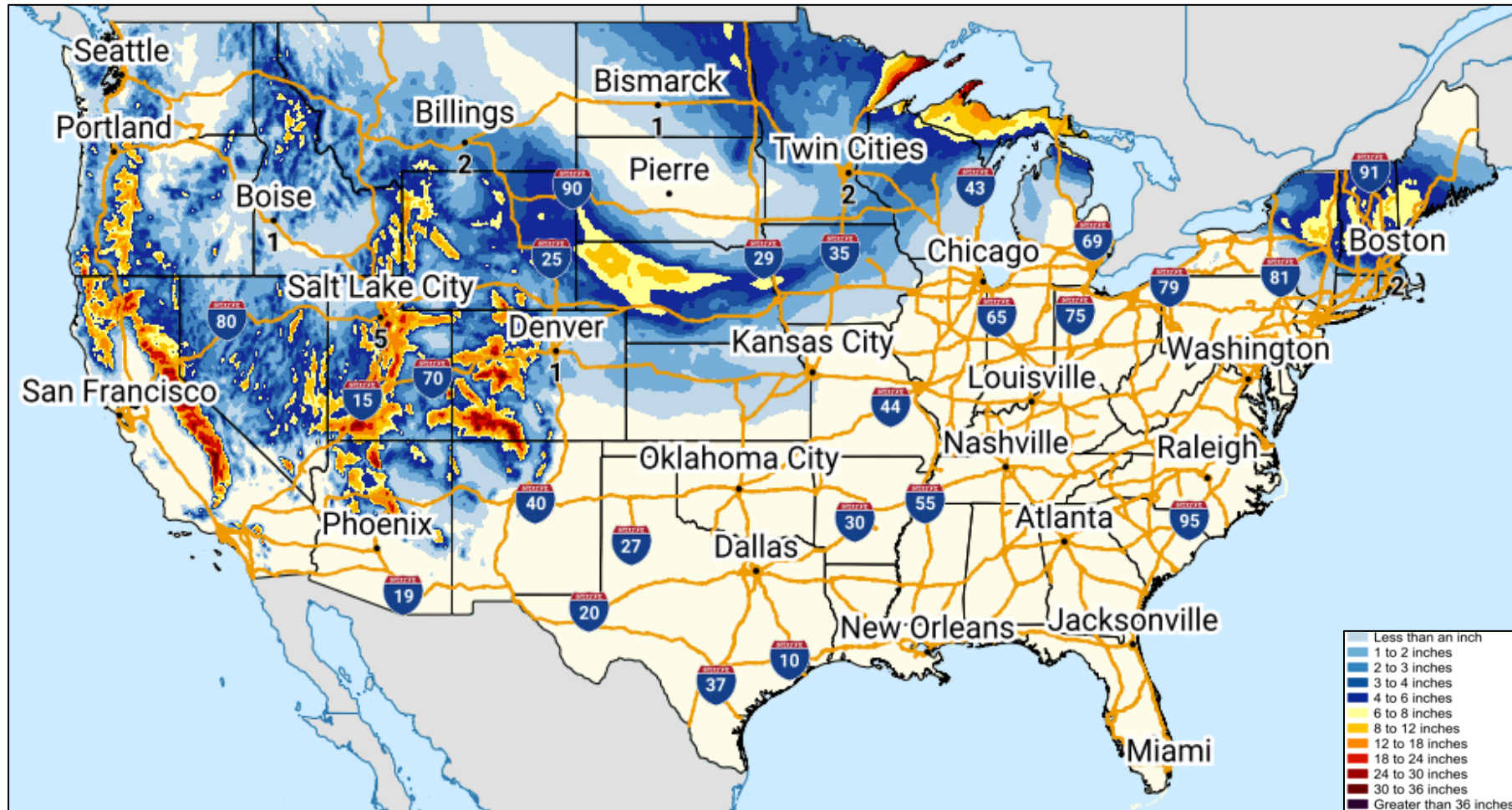
National Weather Forecast



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Snowfall Forecast



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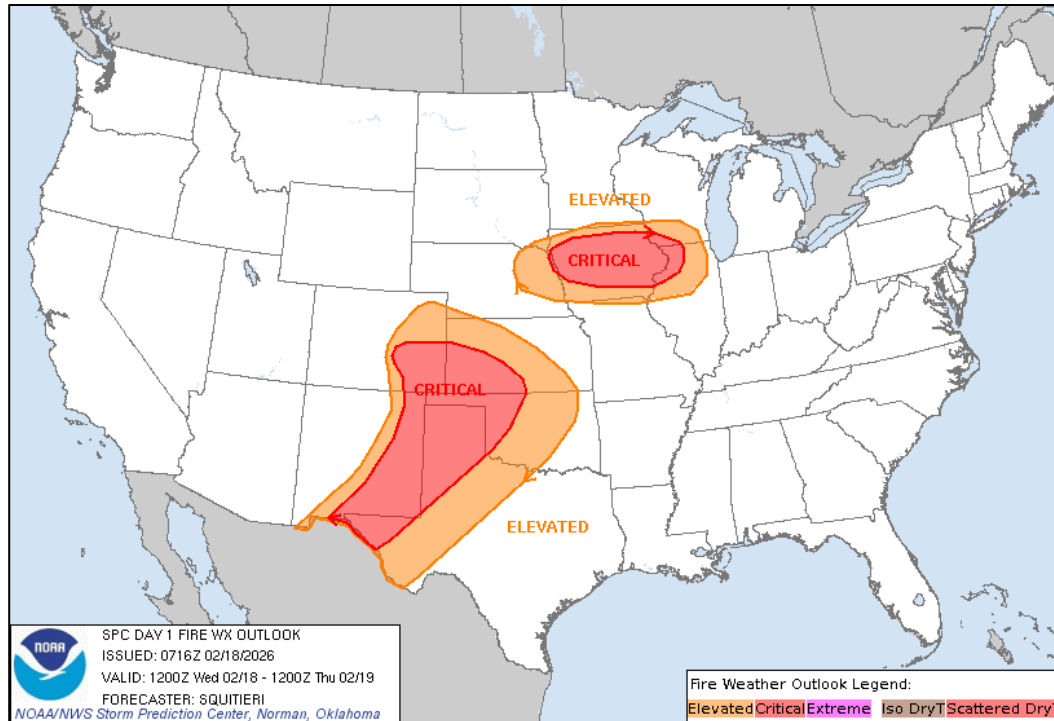
Ice Accumulation Forecast



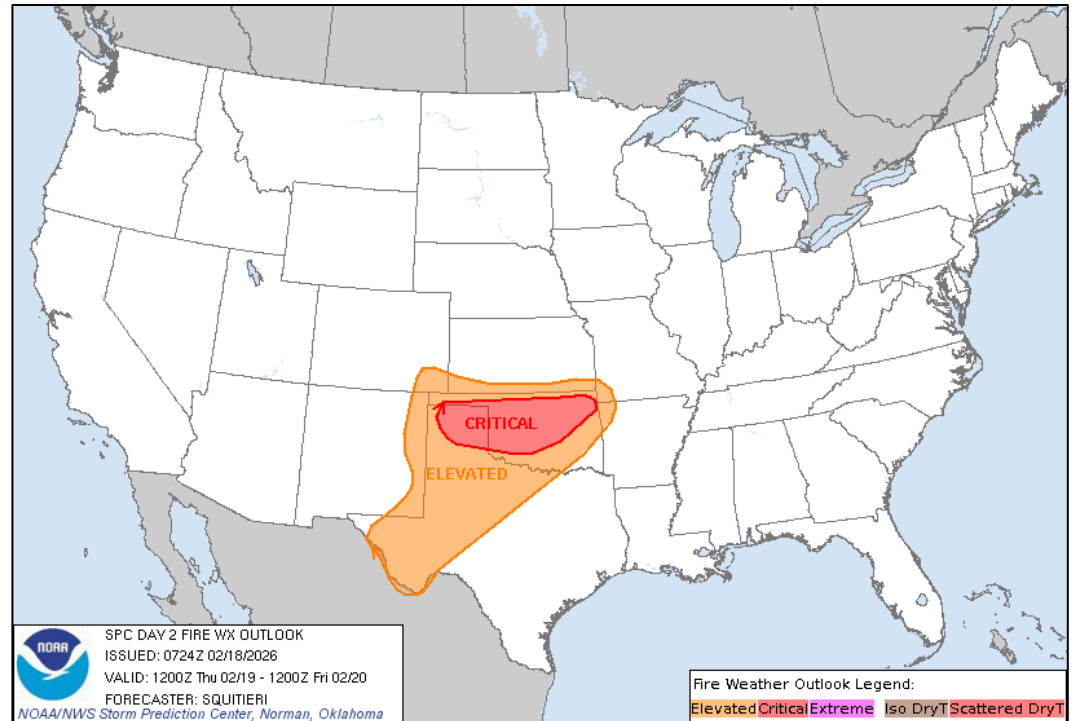

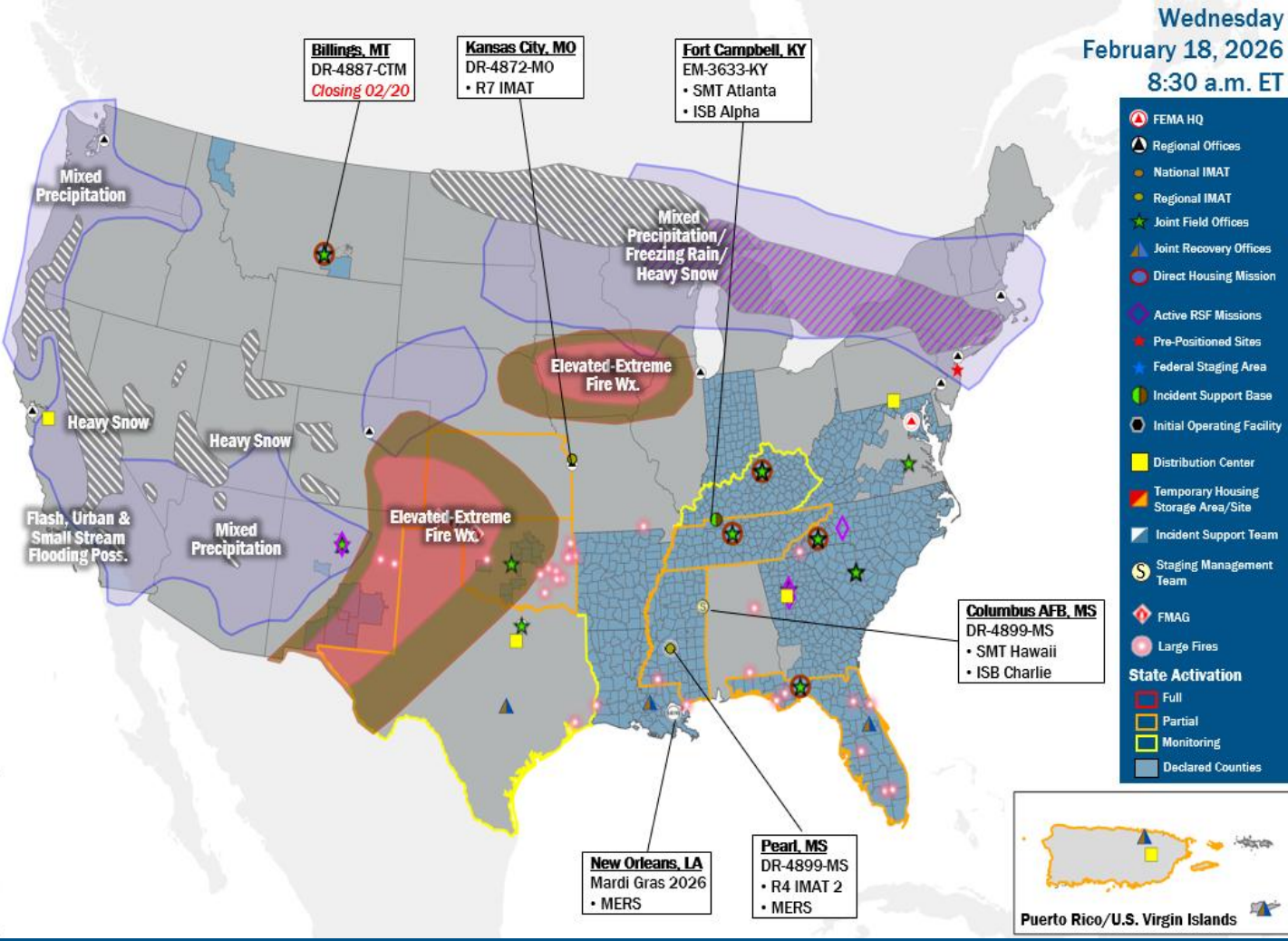
