

FEMA Activates FEMA Grants Outcomes and Non-Disaster Grant Management Systems

Today, FEMA has reactivated its grant management systems—FEMA Grants Outcomes (FEMA GO) and Non-Disaster Grant Management (ND-Grants). These systems have been inaccessible since the Department of Homeland Security appropriations lapsed on February 14, 2026. Grantees may now submit amendments and payment requests on all grant awards, including the Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities program. However, FEMA staff will only be able to support the following grant programs until the lapse ends and FEMA’s funding is restored:

- Operation Stonegarden
- FIFA World Cup Grant Program
- Countering-Unmanned Aircraft Systems Grant Program

FEMA has taken this step because communities across the country rely on FEMA-administered grants to prepare for natural disasters, acts of terrorism, and other catastrophic incidents. Grantees have been unable to access their funds for 70+ days over the last six months because FEMA has experienced three shutdowns during this period.

As threats to the homeland persist and evolve—and as the nation prepares for FIFA World Cup, America’s 250th Celebration, and the 2026 hurricane season—the Administration will not allow radical Democrats in Congress to continue to endanger the American people. By activating these systems, FEMA is ensuring that critical security, resilience, and preparedness activities can move forward as much as possible—even if communities must work without DHS or FEMA support because Congress refuses to act.
