

FEMA Makes \$300 Million Available for Nonprofit Organizations, including Houses of Worship

FEMA recently published the Fiscal Year (FY) 2026 Nonprofit Security Grant Program funding opportunity, making \$300 million available for faith-based institutions and other non-profit organizations to harden their defenses against potential acts of terrorism and targeted violence.

Details

The Trump-Vance Administration is helping houses of worship, schools, and community centers to strengthen their resilience and improve security measures. Through FEMA's Nonprofit Security Grant Program (NSGP), nonprofit organizations can receive funding for security enhancements, like security cameras, additional warning and alert systems, gates and lighting, access control systems and training programs for staff. Today, FEMA published the [FY 2026 NSGP funding opportunity](#), making \$300 million in NSGP funding available to nonprofit organizations across the country.

To apply for NSGP funding, nonprofit organizations must submit an application to their State Administrative Agency. Eligible nonprofit organizations include houses of worship, educational facilities, medical facilities, senior centers/care facilities, community/social services, shelters/crisis centers, event venues, science organizations, camps, and museums.
