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Glacial Lake Outburst Flood (GLOF) – Juneau, AK

Situation: The Suicide Basin located near Juneau, AK (pop. 32k) is anticipated to reach full capacity by August 12. Although no release from the basin has yet been detected, a sub-glacier release could occur within 1-6 days, which may initiate an outburst major flooding event along the Mendenhall River Valley affecting adjacent regions within two days following the sub-glacier release. Local authorities and USACE continue to fortify and expand the deployment of HESCO barriers and other flood mitigation measures to protect homes, schools, and infrastructure along the Mendenhall Valley and divert the anticipated flood water away from the most heavily populated areas. *(FEMA LNO to National Water Center and City and Borough of Juneau, as of 12:49 p.m. ET, Aug 10)*

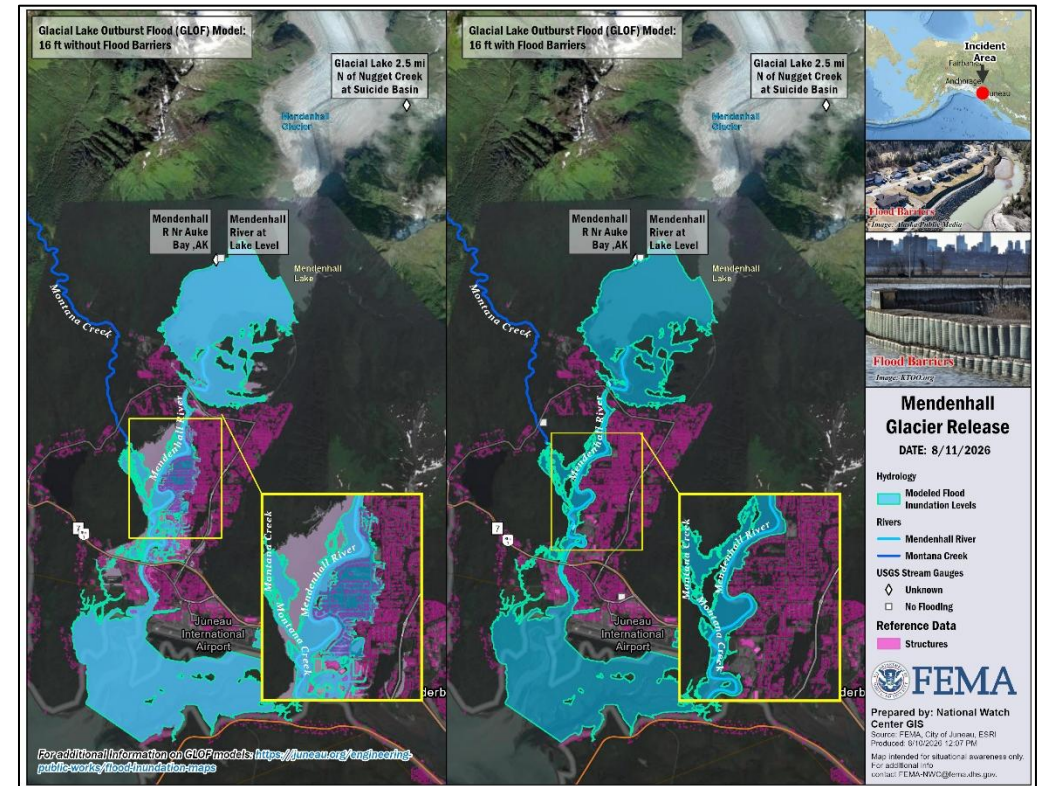
State / Local Response: *(FEMA Region 10 DSAR, as of 3:38 p.m. ET)*

- AK SEOC is at Monitoring (GLOF); 2 SEOC personnel deploying to Juneau to integrate with City and Borough of Juneau and Tlingit & Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska
- The City & Borough of Juneau installed USACE-provided HESCO barriers to mitigate impacts

FEMA / Federal Response: *(FEMA Region 10 DSAR, as of 3:38 p.m. ET)*

- FEMA Region 10 Watch is Monitoring; RRCC is Rostered
- FEMA Region 10 IMAT is deployed to WA SEOC in Camp Murray, WA (EM-3650-WA)
- FEMA NWC is Monitoring; NRCC is Rostered

The NWC will continue to monitor in coordination with FEMA Region 10, with continued reporting twice daily in the FEMA National Situation Report (5:00 p.m. / 3:00 a.m. ET) and the FEMA Daily Operations Briefing (8:30 a.m. ET).

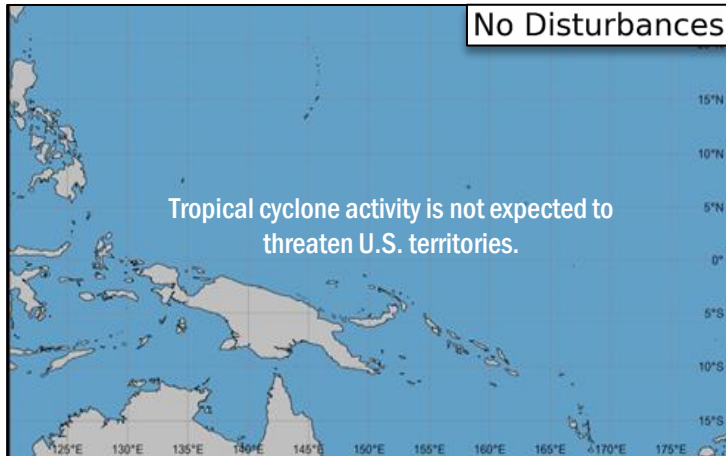


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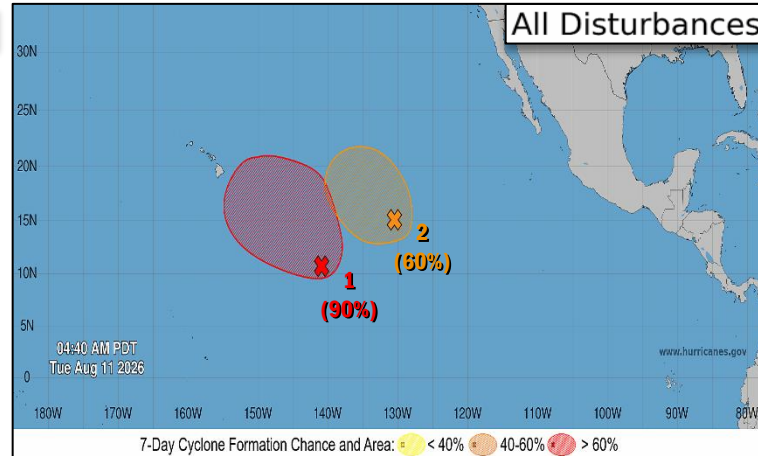
Tropical Outlook

Eastern and Central Pacific



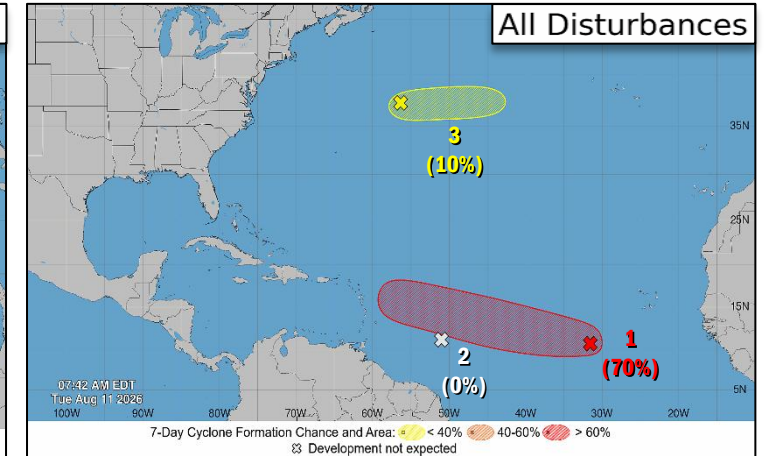
Disturbance 1 (CP93): (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 1,100 miles ESE of the Hawaiian Islands
- Moving WNW
- Environmental conditions appear conducive for further development of this system and a tropical depression is expected to form by midweek
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Med (60%); 7-day: High (90%)

Disturbance 2: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located several hundred miles WSW of the southern tip of the Baja California Peninsula
- Moving WNW to NW
- A tropical depression could form during the next few days
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Med (40%); 7-day: Med (60%)

Atlantic



Disturbance 1: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 500 hundred miles SW of Cabo Verde Islands
- Moving W to WNW
- Environmental conditions are forecast to be conducive for gradual development by the latter half of this week
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (30%); 7-day: High (70%)

Disturbance 2: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

- Located 850 miles east of the Windward Islands
- Moving W
- Expected to encounter a large area of environmental dry air Wednesday night, which should end its chances for development
- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (near 0%); 7-day: Low (near 0%)

Disturbance 3: (as of 8:00 a.m. ET)

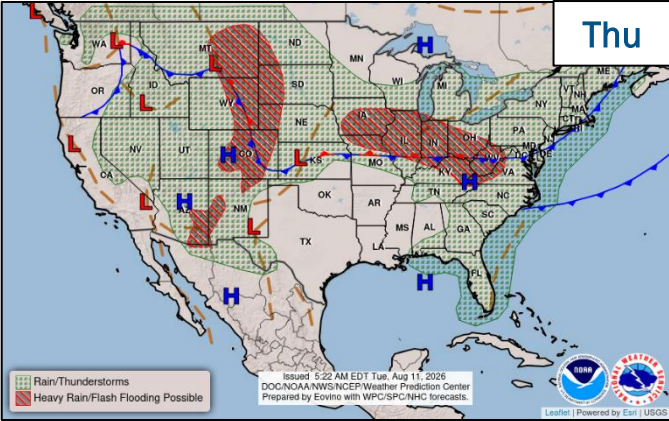
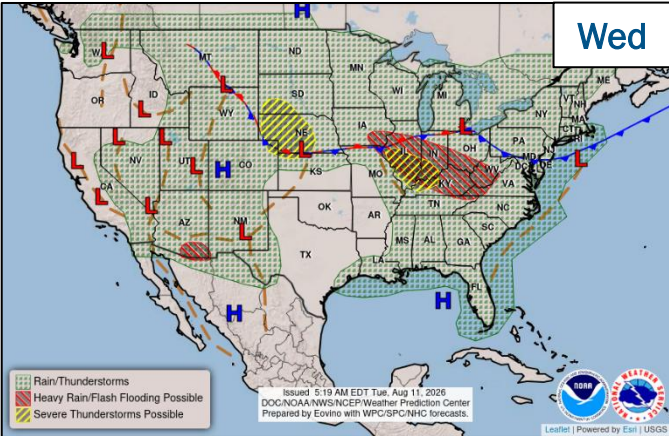
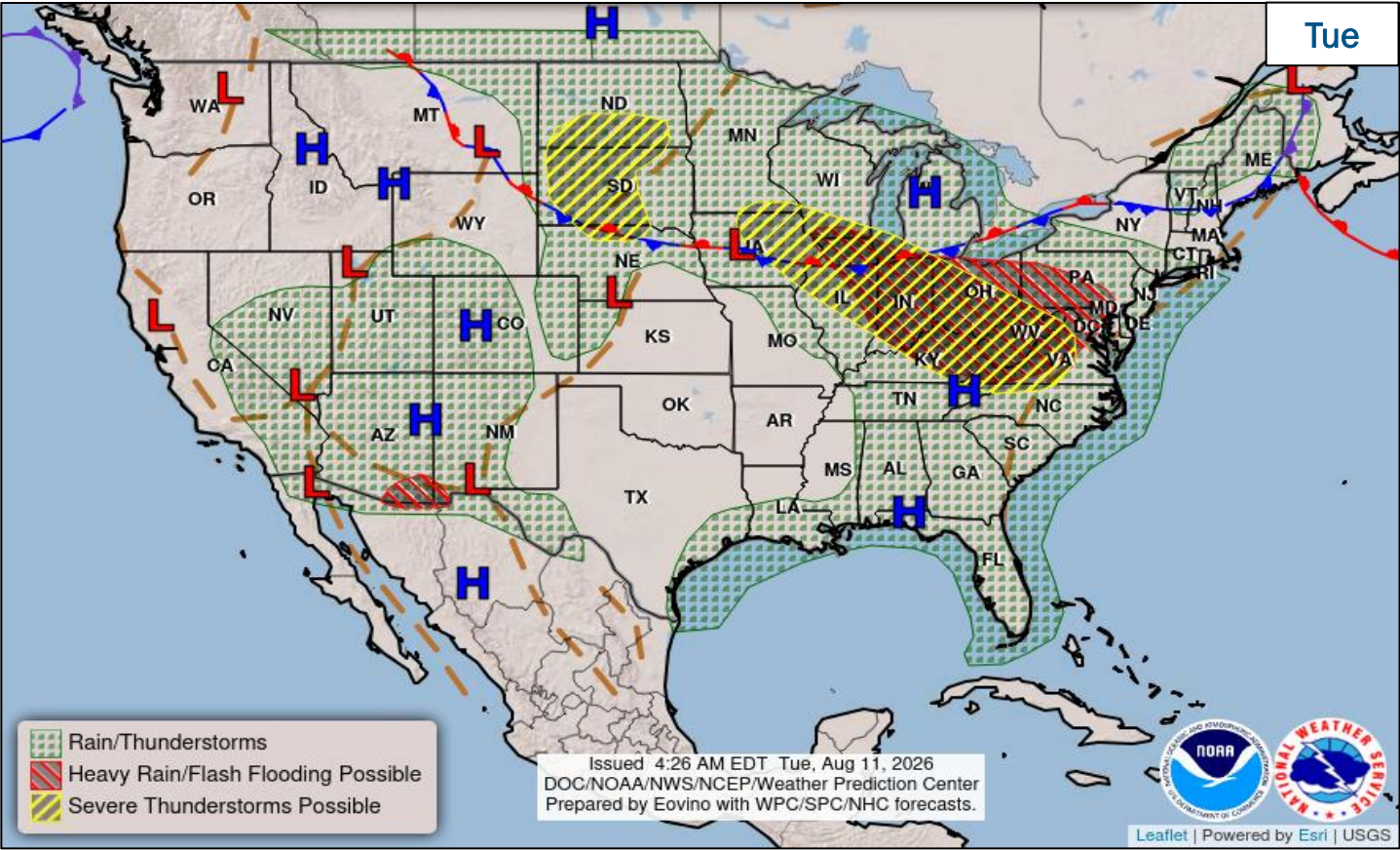
- Located a few hundred miles NE of Bermuda

- Formation chance – 48-hour: Low (10%); 7-day: Low (10%)



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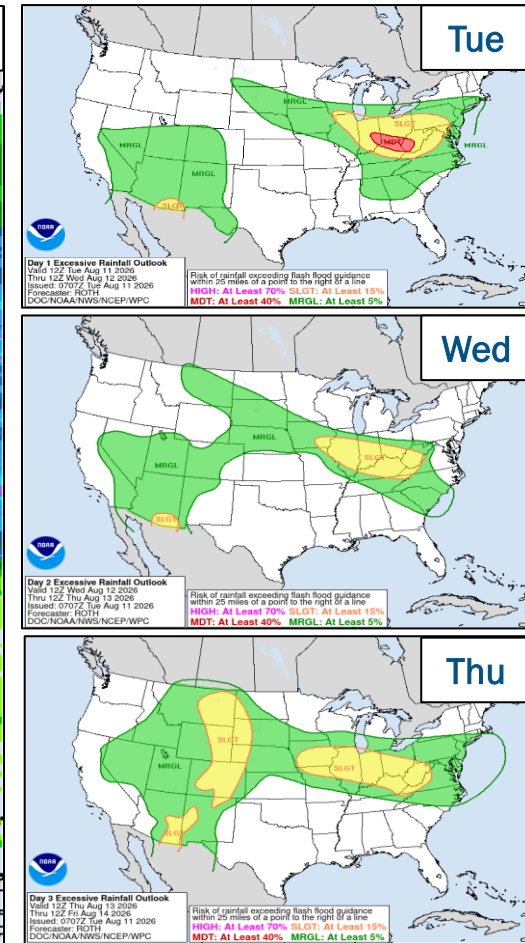
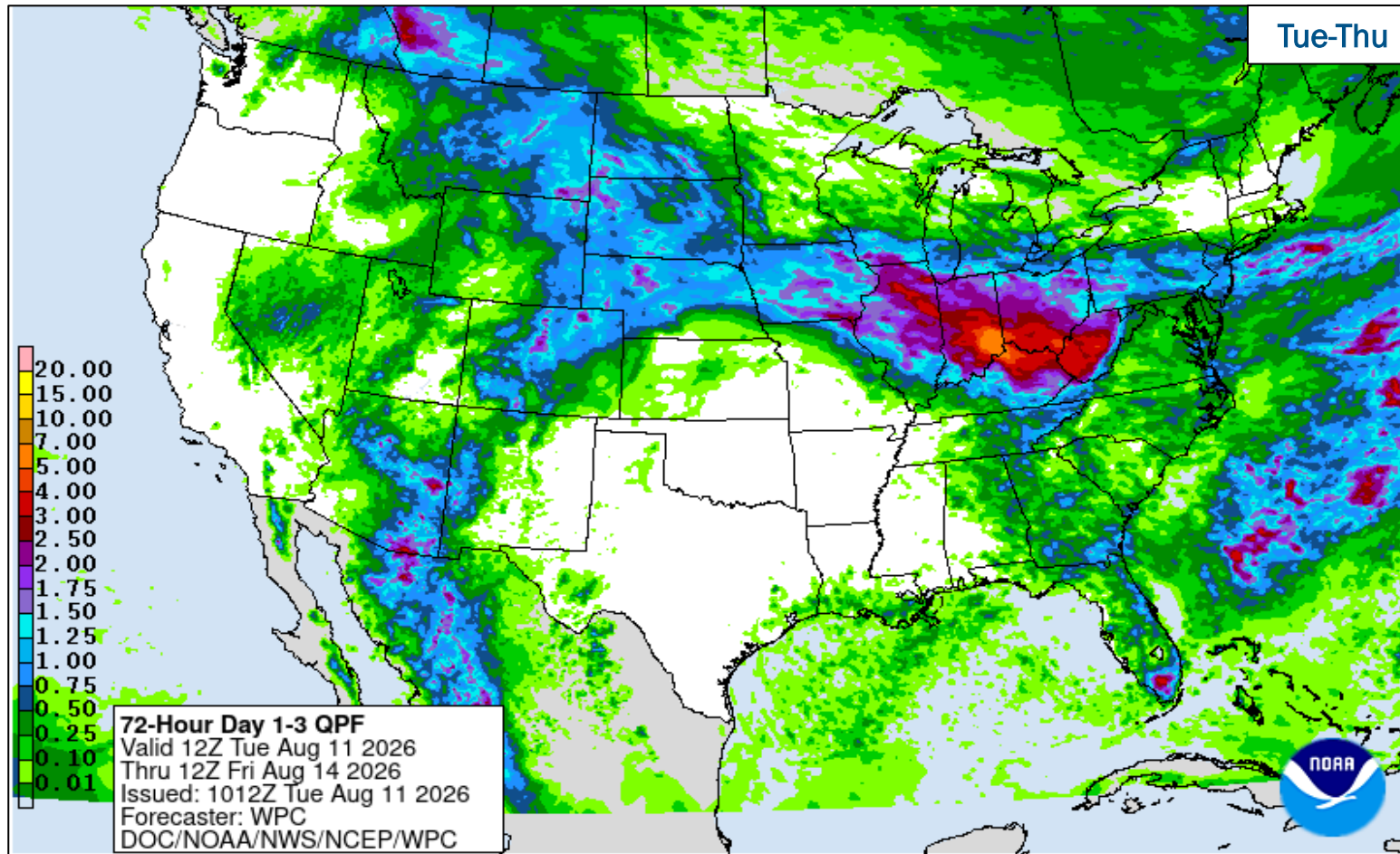
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National Weather Forecast



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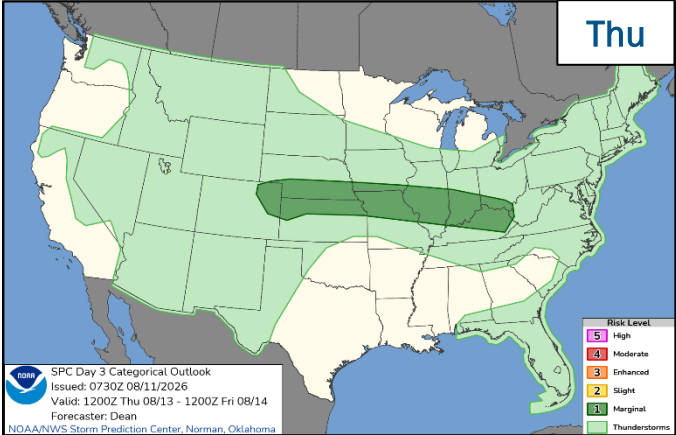
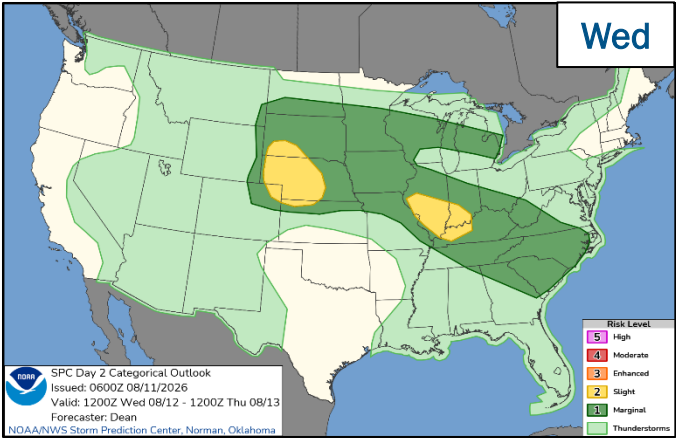
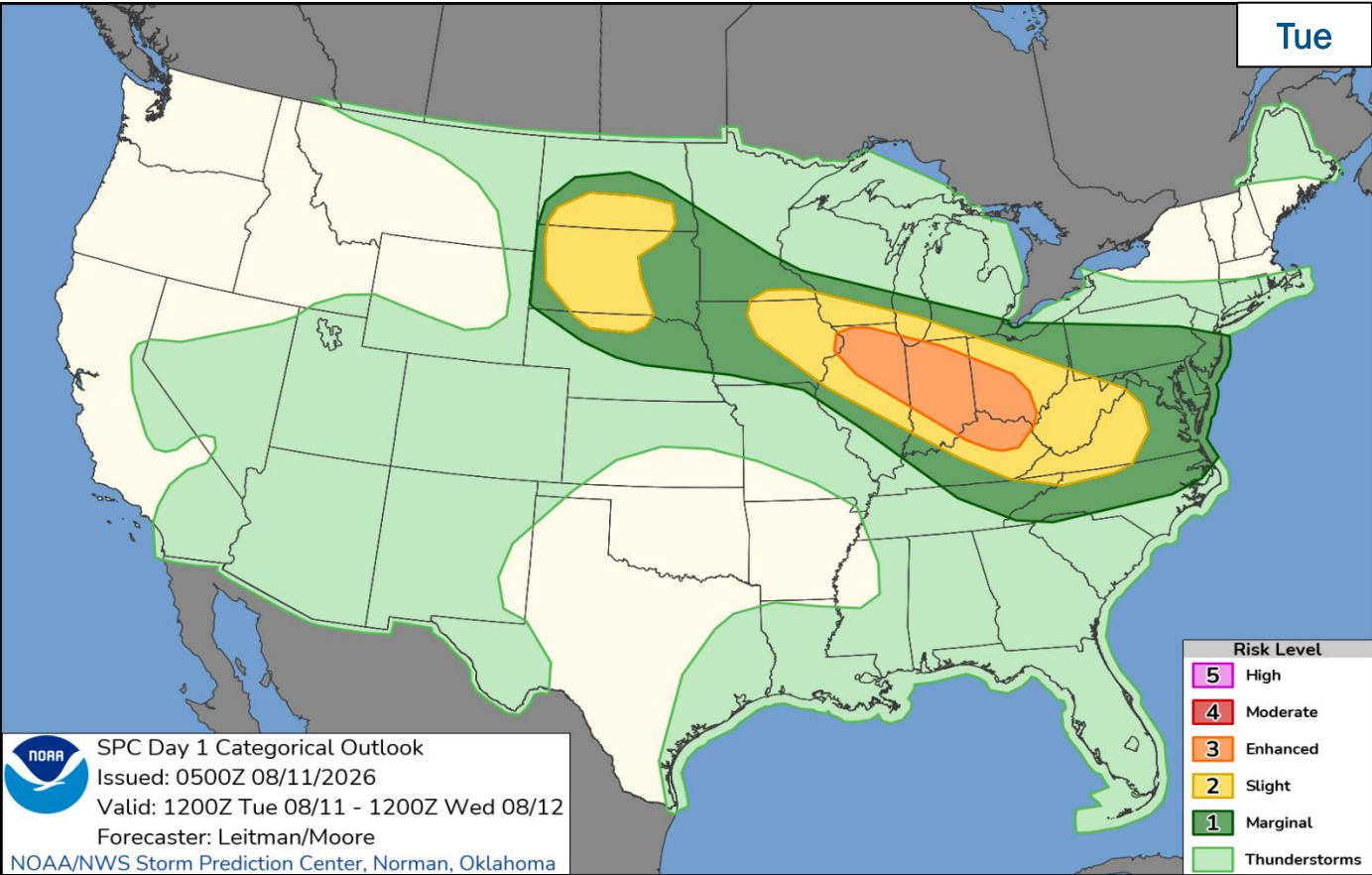
Precipitation & Excessive Rainfall



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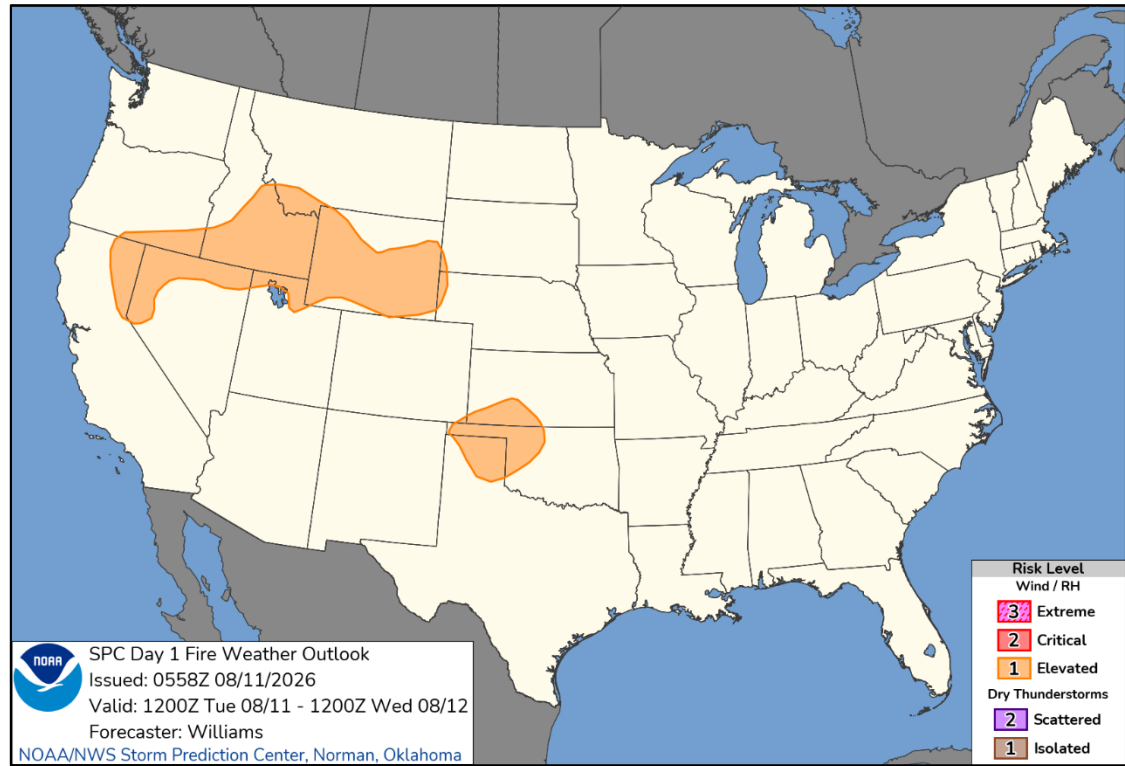
