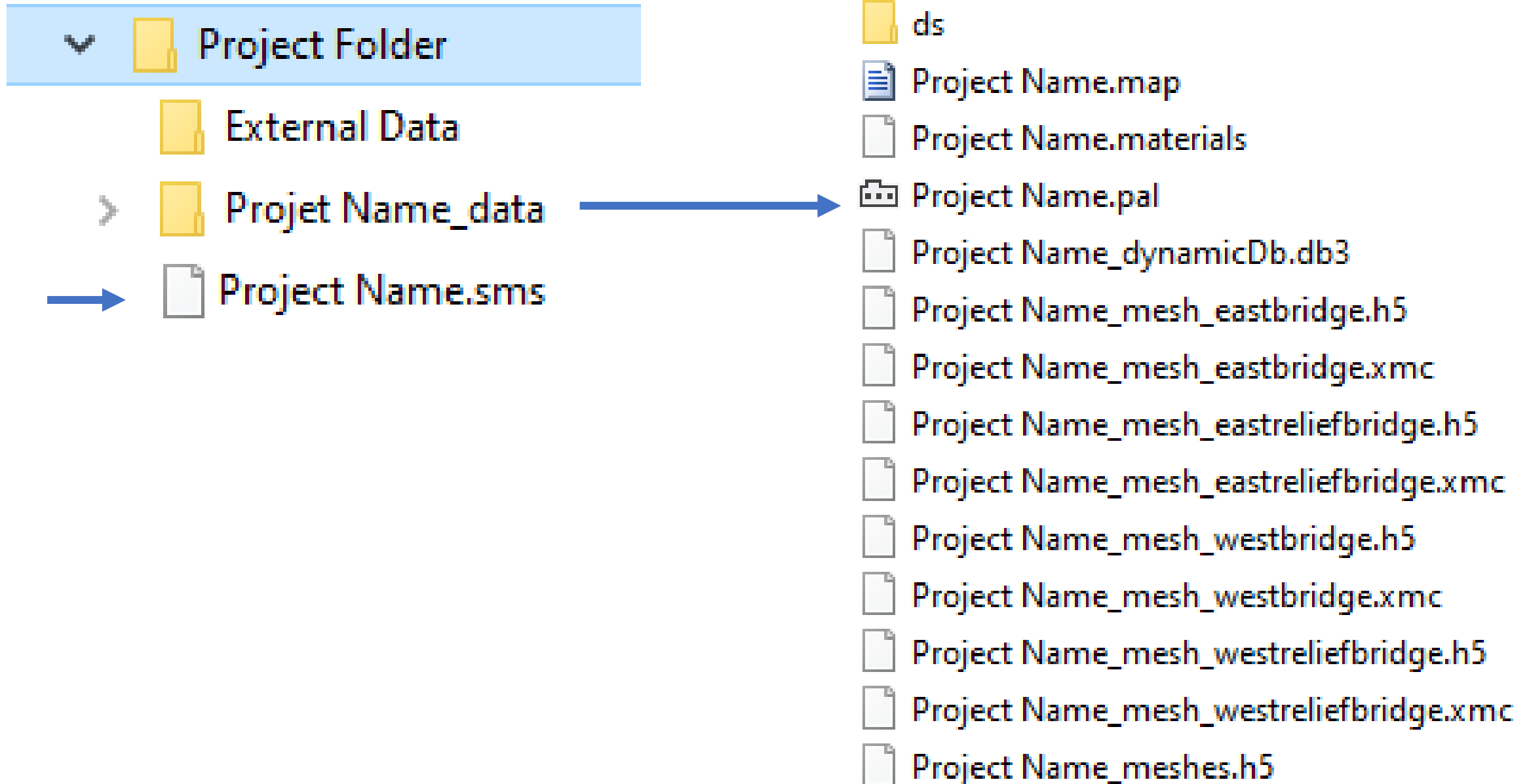

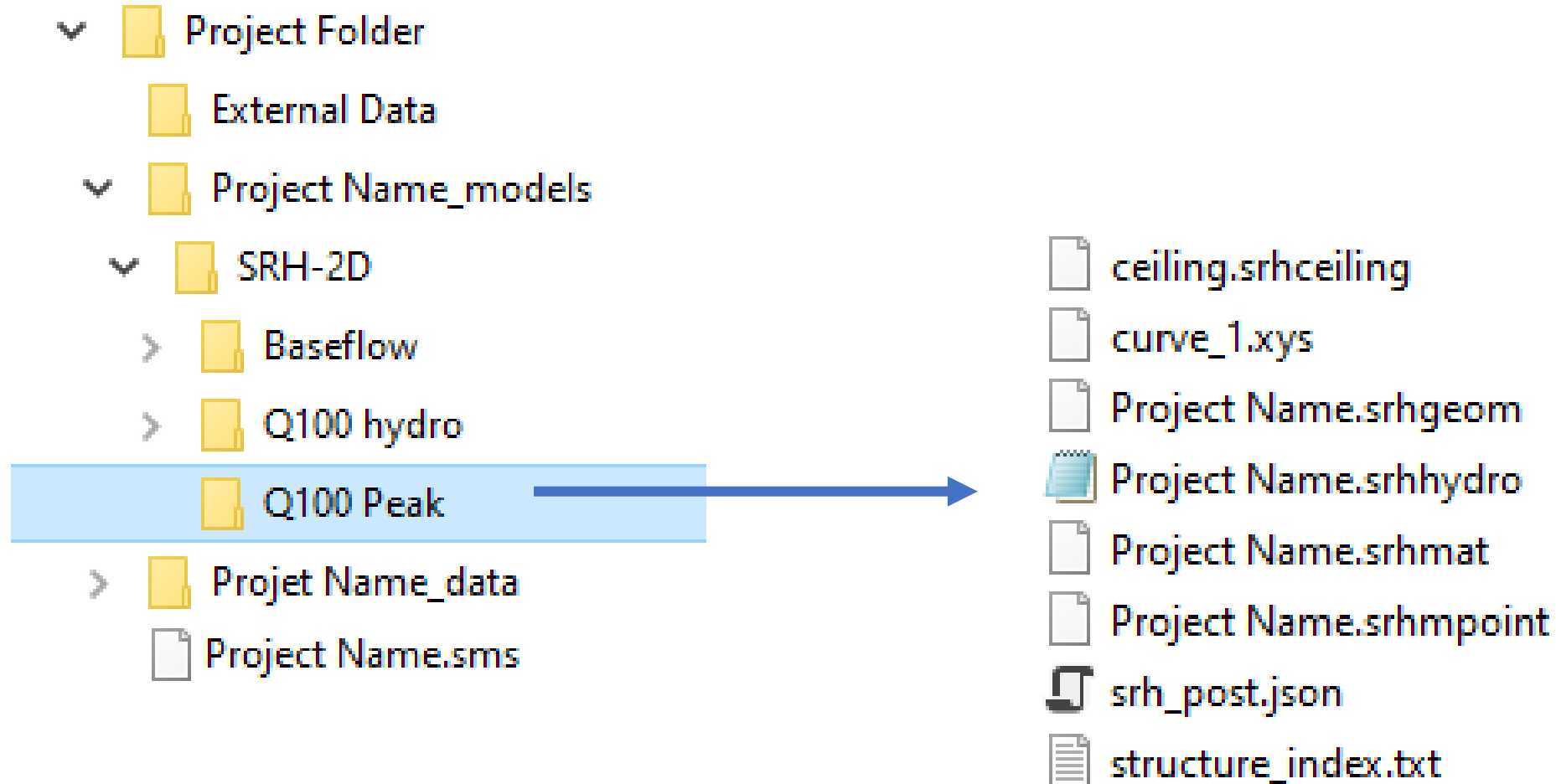
SMS File Structure

- Project Files
- SRH-2D Files
- Temporary Files

File Structure: Project Files



File Structure: SRH-2D Files (Model Native)

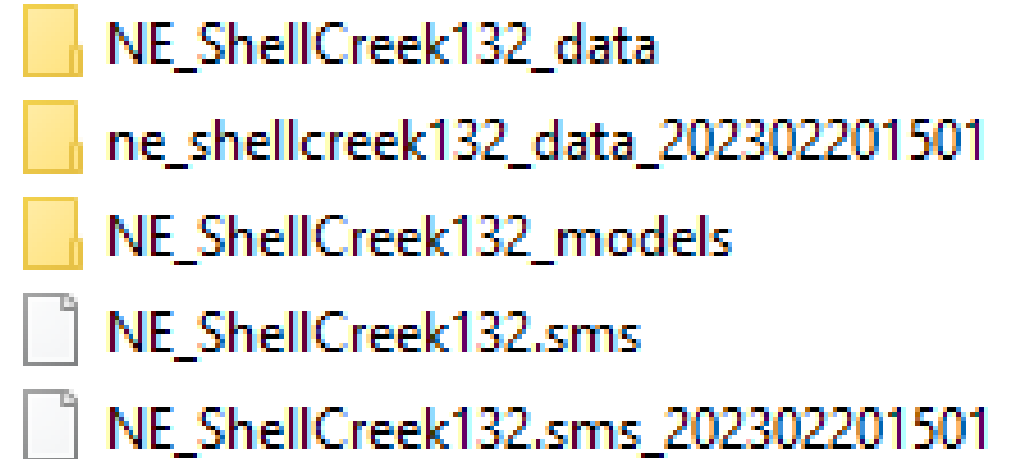


File Structure: Temporary Files

- SMS creates temporary copies of all project data during interactive session.
- SMS only changes original project files on “Save” commands
- We strongly discourage any interaction with temporary files. These are not intended for end user manipulation.
 - Similar to many other windows based applications.

When SMS “Saves”

- Existing files copied
 - Project file
 - Project data directory
 - Date and Time appended
- Files kept until save completed
 - Check for complete data
- Logs and diagnostics



When SMS “Saves”: If issue detected

- SMS will give a warning message
- Don't panic
- Don't exit SMS if possible
 - All the data is still in the session
 - Try saving to a different directory (local)
- SMS saves log and diagnostic files that tech support can use to resolve issues.

What to do when a project won't open - Data Recovery

- Using backup files
- Using “model native” files
- From data – reconstruction
- From SRH-2D coverage files

Data Recovery: Using backup files

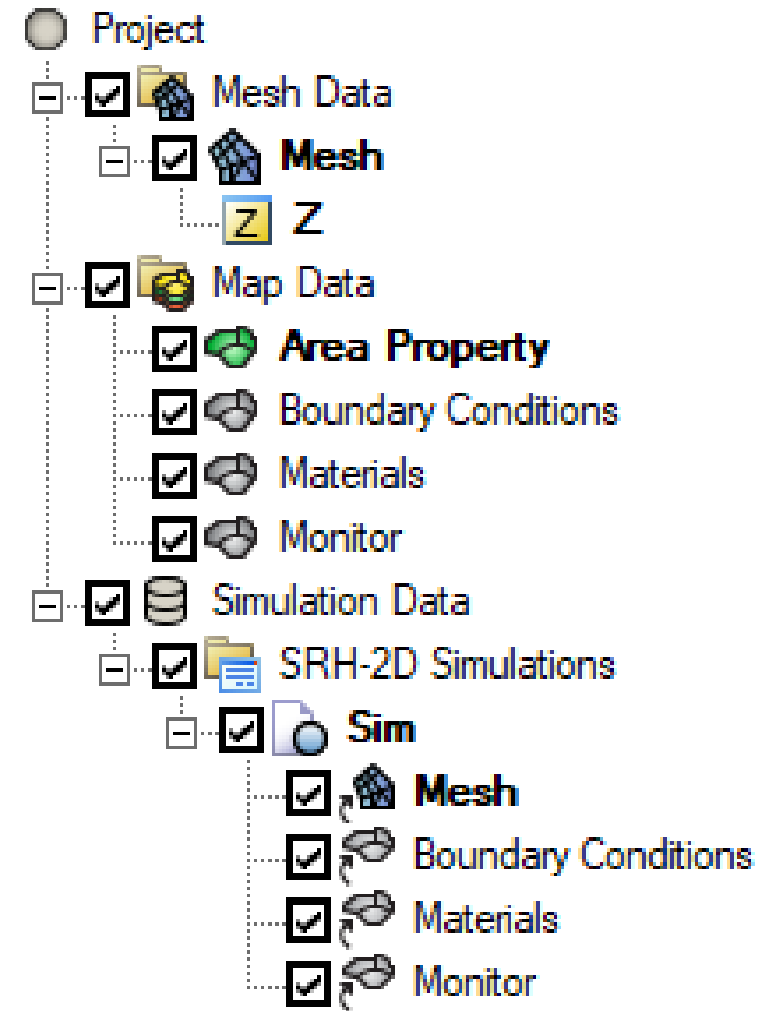
- Look for backup files
- Rename – remove the date and time strings in the file names.
- Open in SMS
 - Won't include any work done in the last session

Data Recovery: Using “Model Native” Files

- Creating a simulation from native files
- Advantages
- Disadvantages

Project from “Model Native” Files

- File | Open or Drag/drop the “srhhydro” file
- SMS Creates
 - “Mesh”
 - “Boundary Condition”
 - “Materials”
 - “Monitor”
 - “Sim” Simulation
- All model parameters and components



Advantages of “Model Native” Files

- No additional data needed
- Represents exactly what SRH-2D sees
 - Snapped BCs
 - Snapped Materials
 - Snapped Monitor Lines

Disadvantages of “Model Native” Files

- Must load one simulation at a time (can be tedious)
- No background data
 - Rasters / Lidar / CAD / Images
 - Scatter sets
- Loss of comments / notes
- Replication of resources – multiple copies of mesh and coverages

Data Recovery: From data files

- More tedious – avoid if possible
- Load model components

Data Recovery: From SRH-2D Coverage Files

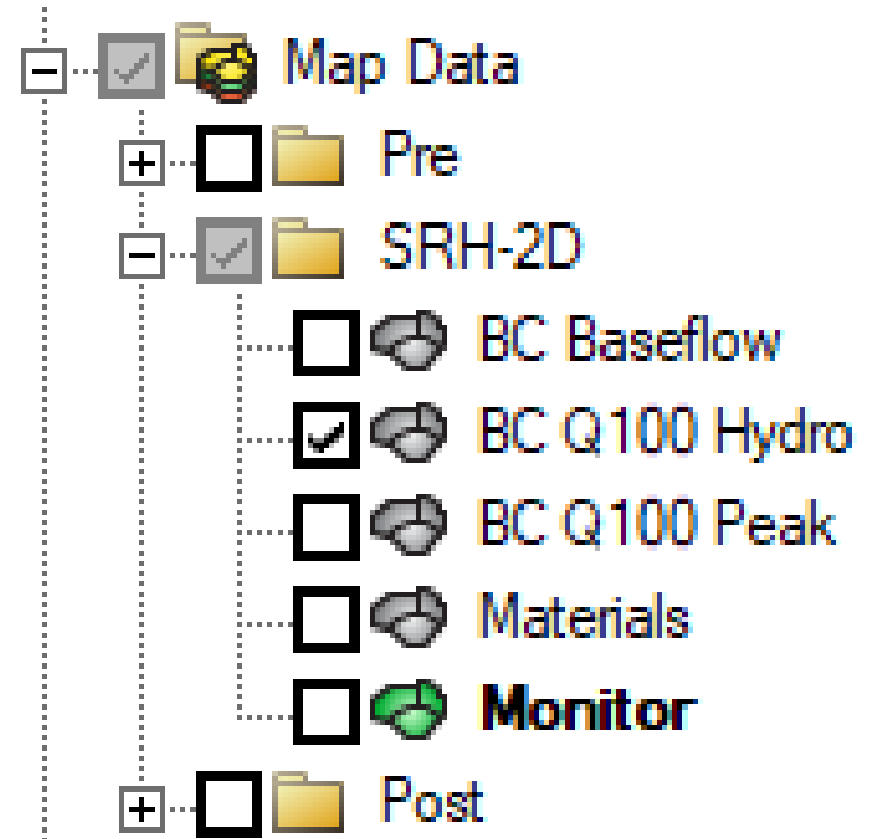
- Most commonly lost information include:
 - SRH-2D Material lists (including material attributes)
 - SRH-2D Boundary conditions
 - SRH-2D Monitory lines and points
- Starting with SMS 13.2, these can be exported to a file. (Allows for recovery by reading the file.)
- Also allows transfer of geometry, material lists, and BC attributes from one project to another.

Data Organization Tips

- Folders
- Zipped backups
- Project notes

Data Organization Tips: Folders

- Existing Options
 - Datasets
 - Coverages
- Future option: Give feedback
 - Meshes / Ugrids
 - Scatter sets
 - Simulations

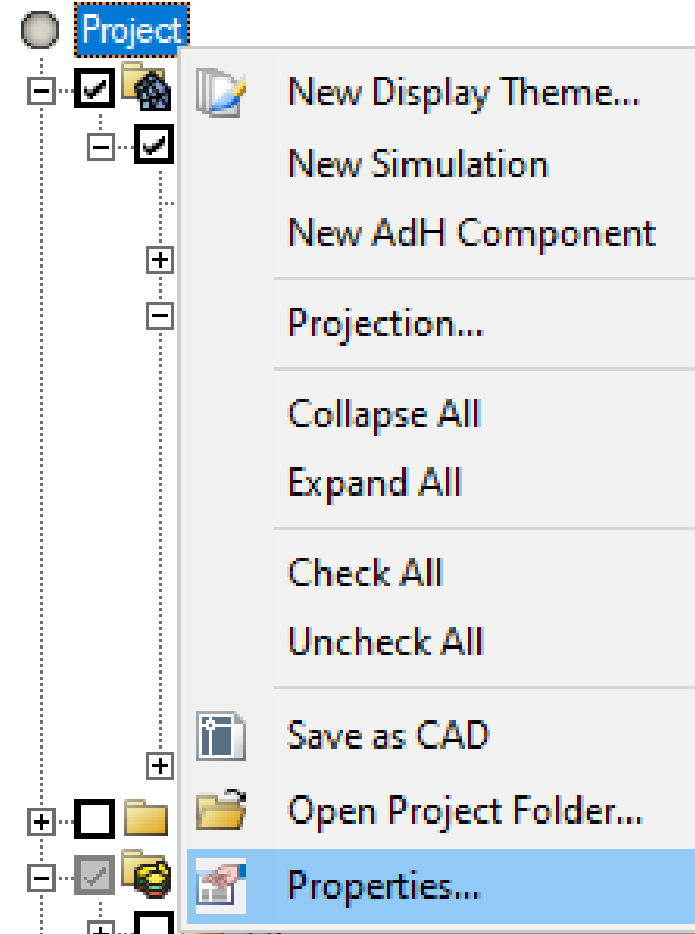


Data Organization Tips: Zipped backups

- Use File | Save as package command as a backup strategy
- Combines all data for the project – zipped
- Can have as many “backups” as you would like
 - They can be large
 - Recommend one or two and alternate
- Recently enhanced
- Also provides ready format for distribution of project

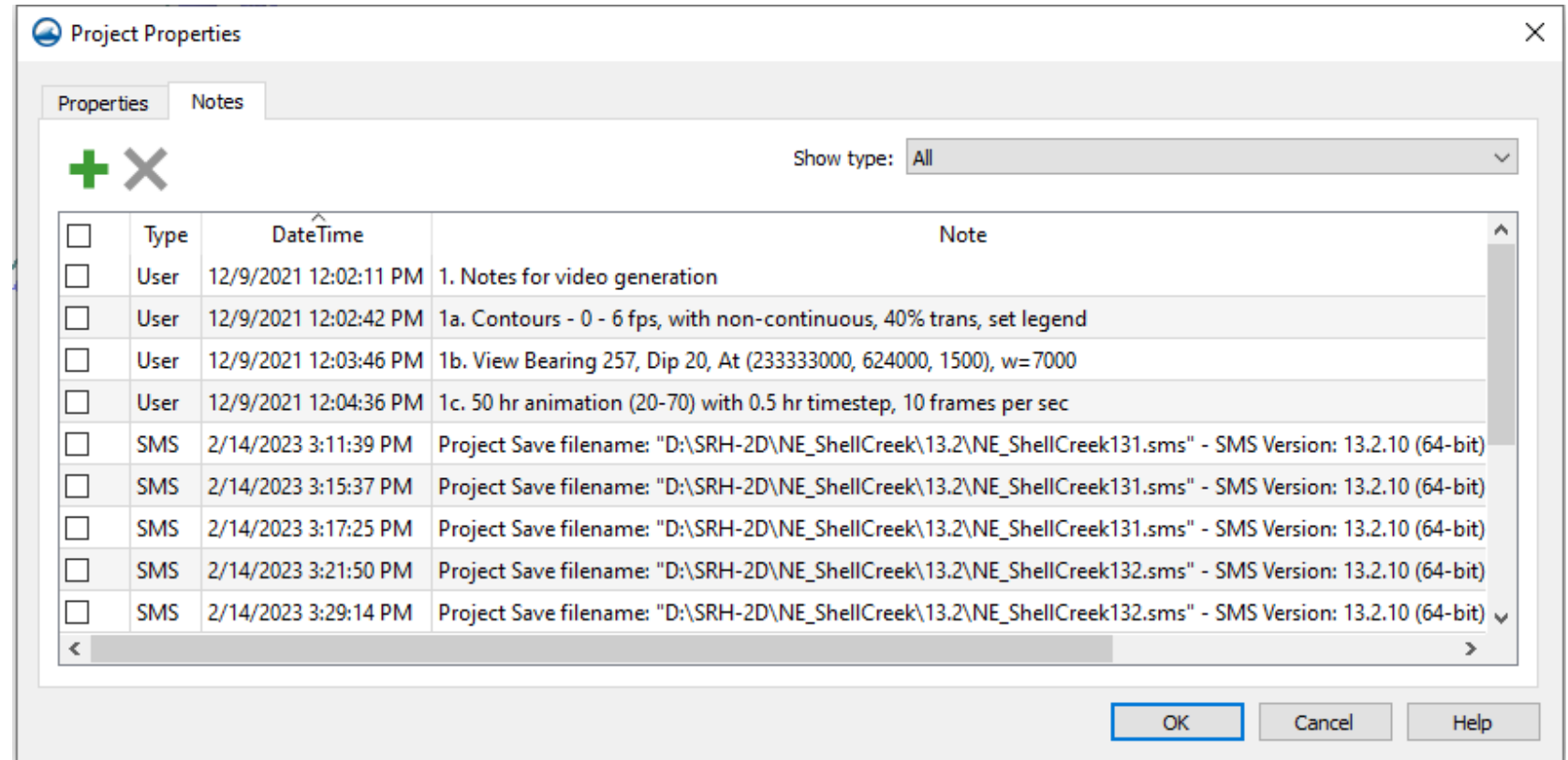
Data Organization Tips: Project Notes

- Access
 - Right click on tree entry
 - Select Properties
 - Switch to “Notes” tab
- At multiple
 - Project
 - Mesh/Ugrid/Scatter
 - Coverage
 - Dataset



Data Organization Tips: Project Notes

- Will replace the “meta-data” options
- Some are auto-generated
 - Feedback encouraged



Data Organization Tips: Project Notes

- Will replace the “meta-data” options
- Some are auto-generated
 - Feedback encouraged
- Included in Summary Project Report
- Useful in model review

Migration from Previous Versions

- SMS Version 12.3 – 2dm file – No migration
- SMS Version 13.0 / 13.1 – Automatic
 - Example – Conversion of HY8 data.
 - Recommend that you save a new project for new version
- Future – Anticipated that it will be all automatic

Troubleshooting SMS Projects

- Project
 - Make use of the FHWA Model review checklist
 - Review mesh
 - Resolution / elevation source and range
- Simulations
 - Start with simple simulation and add structures one at a time

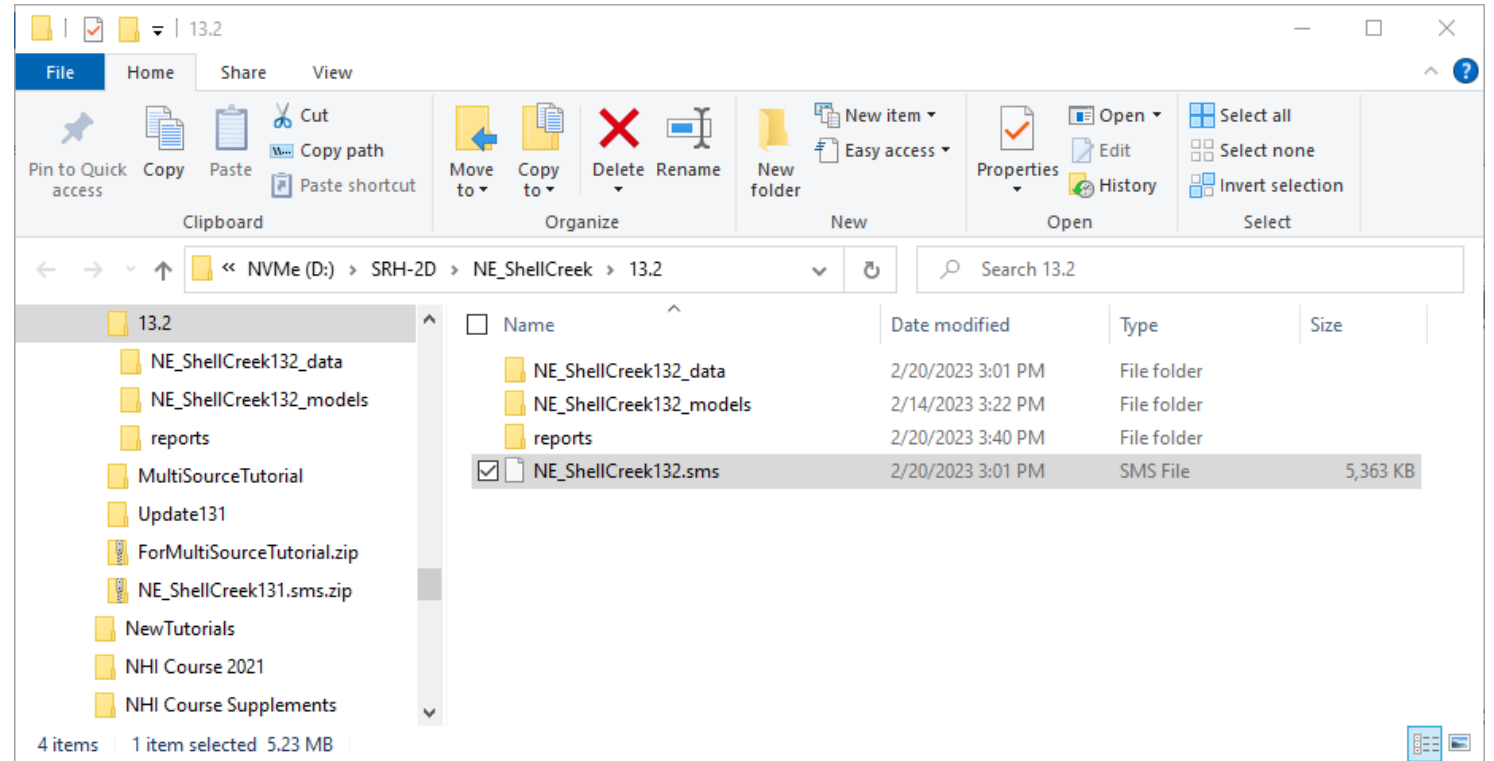
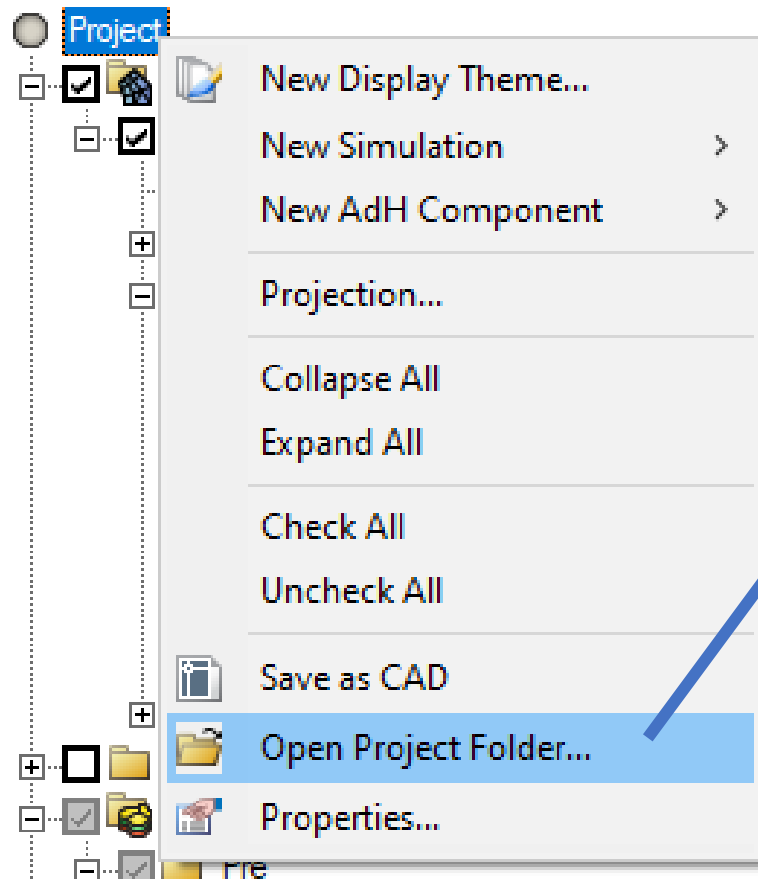

Tips and Tricks

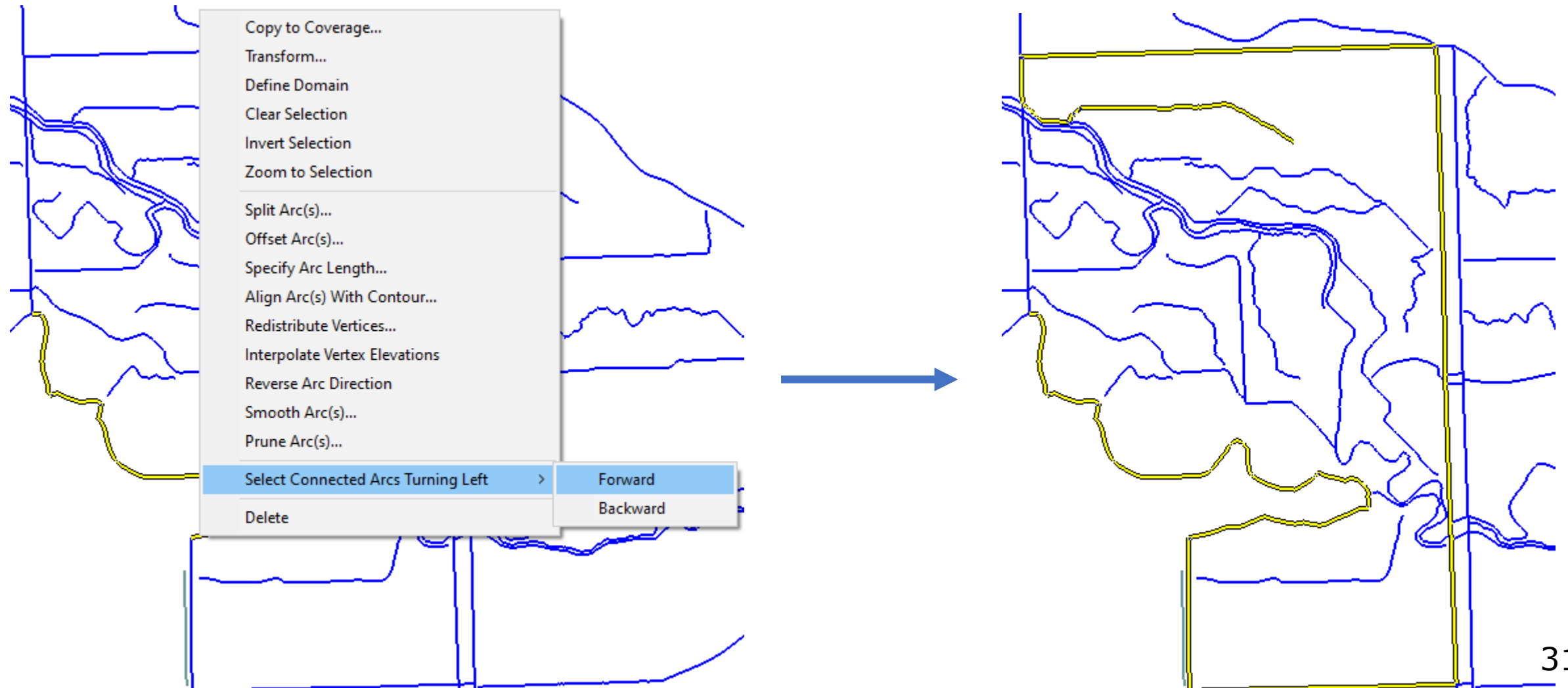
- Show project folder
- Select adjacent arcs
- Run SRH-2D with "SIF"

Tips and Tricks: Show project folder



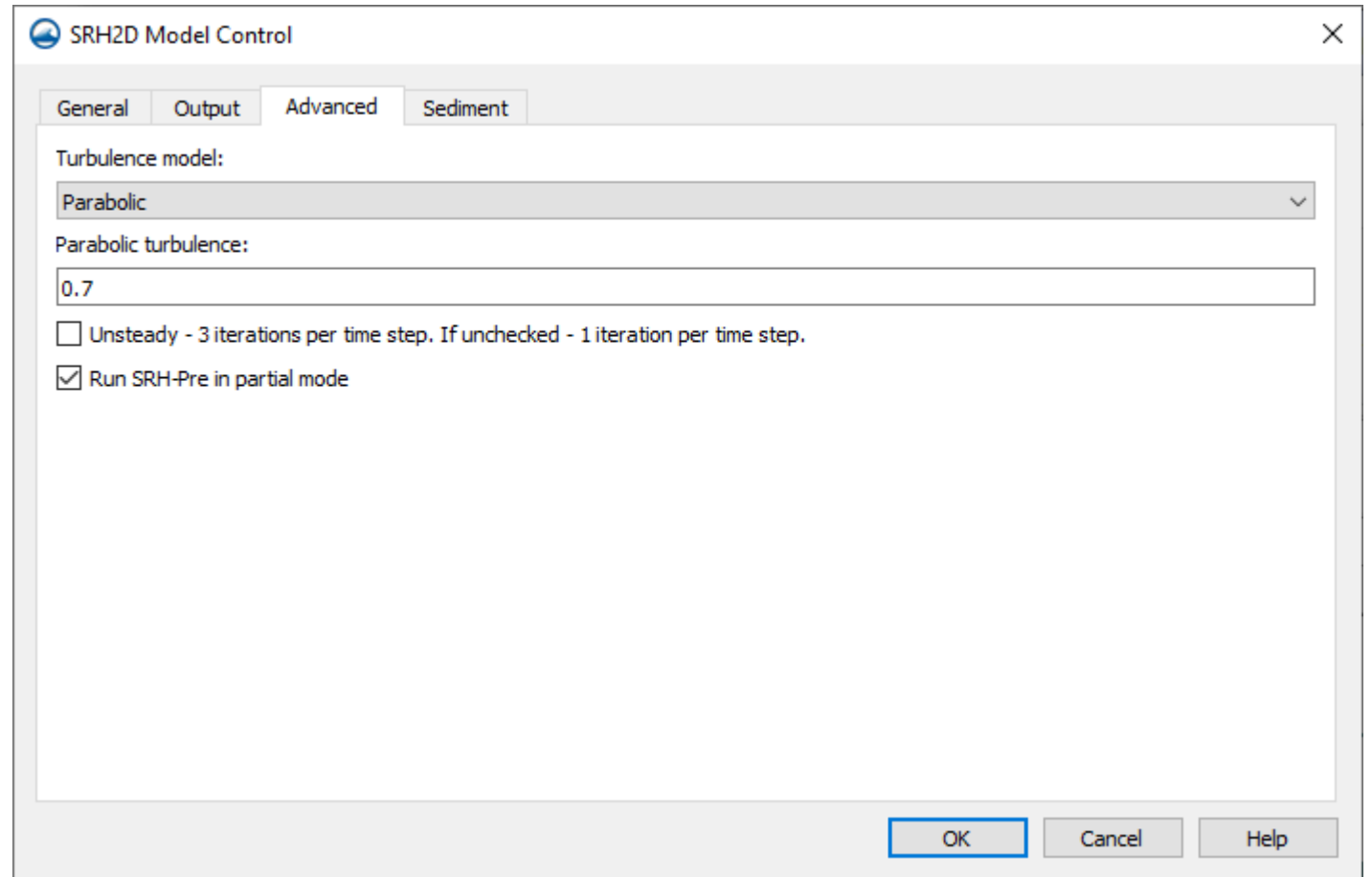
Tips and Tricks: Select adjacent arcs

- Selects all arcs to form a loop or to a free end



Tips and Tricks: Run SRH-2D with "SIF"

- Allows for custom execution of SRH-2D
- Run from SMS with standard method
- SMS creates an SOF (Script Output File)
 - in sim folder
- Rename SOF to SIF (Script Input File)
- Model Control Advanced
- SIF can be edited using text editor



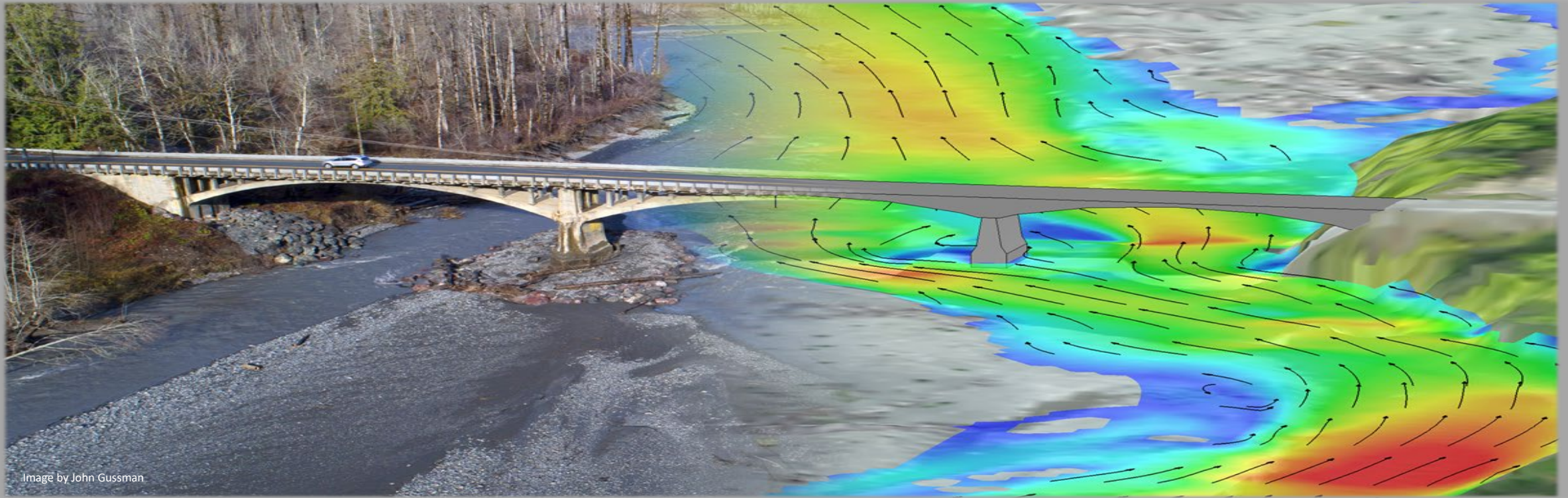
