WHAT IT DOES

The Maternal, Infant, and Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) program supports voluntary, evidence-based home visiting services for pregnant people and parents with young children.

This flyer summarizes the opportunity to apply for funding for the Institute for Home Visiting Workforce Development (the Institute) and to establish and operate the Jackie Walorski Center for Evidence-Based Case Management.

The Institute will:

- Assess workforce trends;
- Research effective workforce support practices;
- Provide technical assistance (TA) on such practices; and
- House the Jackie Walorski Center for Evidence-Based Case Management.

The Jackie Walorski Center for Evidence-Based Case Management will identify, evaluate, and disseminate evidence-based case management best practices to implement within the home visiting context.

The goals of this program are to:

- 1) Improve the quality of home visiting services;
- Support home visitor professional development and well-being; and
- 3) Reduce the costs and disruption associated with frequent staff turnover and re-training.

WHO DOES IT SERVE

The home visiting program supports voluntary, evidence-based home visiting services for pregnant people and parents with young children up to kindergarten entry.

AWARD INFORMATION

- One (1) cooperative agreement
- Up to \$4,500,000 per year*
- Five-year period of performance (September 30, 2023-September 29, 2028)

*Of which not more than \$1,500,000 shall be used to support the activities described under the Jackie Walorski Center for Evidence-Based Case Management

WHO CAN APPLY

Eligible applicants include domestic public or private non-profit entities. Tribes, and tribal organizations are eligible to apply.
