#### To Higher Education Officials:

In the past year, an organization based in Vietnam calling itself the World Climate Change Challenge has been emailing universities in the US and Canada, Europe and Australia & New Zealand inviting them to join a scholarship fund for climate change education. This organization is not legitimate and there are no scholarship funds. Many universities have been duped into paying a \$750 participation fee to access the scholarships, and these universities' logos have been placed on the WCCC website (wccc-corp.com) lending a sense of legitimacy to what is a scam operation.

Paul Lyndon Phillips, an Australian citizen living in Vietnam, calls himself the international director of the WCCC. Mr. Phillips has a registered commercial consultancy company in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam, and according to registries of his company in Vietnam (title: Công Ty Tnhh Thách Thức Biến Đổi Khí Hậu Thế Giới), it is a limited liability company, founded in 2011, with registered with permission to sell households goods only (<a href="http://masocongty.vn/company/736136/cong-ty-tnhh-thach-thuc-bien-doi-khi-hau-the-gioi.html">http://masocongty.vn/company/736136/cong-ty-tnhh-thach-thuc-bien-doi-khi-hau-the-gioi.html</a>). It is not a registered charity or educational foundation in Vietnam. His son, Scott Phillips, is occasionally listed in emails as a "Director of Project Implementation". Both Phillips' have attended higher education fairs in Vietnam promoting their organization.

Since forming in around 2015, when the first emails to US universities began, the WCCC has changed stories numerous times about how many universities will be asked to participate in WCCC and what each university will get in scholarship money. There are no standards associated with the group, as they have taken participation fees from any education institution who willingly signs up at the website, including a yoga institute and a college of pharmacy in their list of affiliated schools, despite claiming to focus on climate change education initiatives. There is no advisory board for the so-called scholarships and no involvement of officials in the US, Europe or Vietnam in higher education with the WCCC.

The WCCC also has no scholarship money to give out. The WCCC has misrepresented to universities that they are affiliated with or will be affiliated with the UN's Green Climate Fund (GCF) which would be the source of millions in so-called scholarships. The WCCC is not an accredited organization with GCF (<a href="http://www.greenclimate.fund/partners/accredited-entities/ae-directory">http://www.greenclimate.fund/partners/accredited-entities/ae-directory</a>) and there are direct confirmations from GCF officials that they do not have any relationship with WCCC and these scholarships do not exist (see attachments). Despite not having scholarships, the WCCC has been encouraging students already to apply for the so-called scholarships since Jan 2016 through their Facebook page https://www.facebook.com/groups/wcccscholarship/

Two newspaper articles were published in the spring in a major newspaper in Vietnam (Thanh Nien) in Vietnam raising questions about WCCC. The reporters confirmed that Mr. Phillips is not registered with the Ministry of Education, he does not have any scholarship money to give out, and he's already soliciting applications from students

despite having no standards for language or grades for the scholarships.

The WCCC group has recently (as of September 2016) also launched a mass email appeal to renewable energy companies asking for the exact same participation fee (\$750) to join a geothermal energy project in Vietnam. They have also as of October 2016 started a new part of their website called "Climate Change Research Directory" which also asks academics and scholars to register research projects in a directory for a fee.
