The DoD Opioid Prescriber Safety Training Program stems from the presidential memo, "Addressing Prescription Drug Abuse and Heroin Use," from October 2015 that mandated training for all providers, residents, and clinical trainees in federal health care facilities who prescribe controlled substances. The memo is accessible at <http://go.wh.gov/QtyMgQT>. It was created by tri-service experts and equips providers to improve patient outcomes for substance use disorders and pain management.

This program replaces the previous version that closed on 31 DEC 2020.
