ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Cancer Research Interns (CRI) Summer Program provides undergraduate, graduate, and medical students the opportunity to complete a paid summer internship at the NCI. CRIs can spend up to 12 weeks working side-by-side with some of the leading scientists in the world and learn more about the cancer research conducted in the intramural research program and select offices. No prior research is necessary.

ELIGIBILITY

- Must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident
- 18 years or older
- GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Have interest in cancer research
- Must apply to the NIH Summer Internship Program to be considered

PROGRAM DETAILS

- Opportunities in basic and clinical research, genomics, epidemiology, behavioral health and cancer control
- Participate in summer intensives and prepare for your next career goal
- Present your research at NIH Summer Poster Day
