Full Speed Ahead

All you need to know:

- CNP announced new training for 2017 that expands on existing efforts to prevent destructive behaviors across the Fleet. Full Speed Ahead follows Chart the Course and Bystander Intervention training that was conducted the past two years.
- Full Speed Ahead continues the positive work of previous training in combating destructive behaviors while reinforcing Navy core attributes. It blends scenario-based videos with facilitator-led discussions and gives a unique focus toward the critical responsibility of mid-level leaders and the role they play in addressing and preventing destructive behavior.
- Full Speed Ahead will consist of small groups of less than 30 Sailors and this year's groups will include participants from all paygrades to maximize discussion on issues that impact all levels of the command.
- This is about building the strong foundation of a resilient and professional force.
- Behavior change takes both leadership and practice. Commands must measure the learning and understanding of their Sailors outside of the training environment.
- Commands are encouraged to use the lessons in Full Speed Ahead during day-to-day operations, encouraging conversations up and down the Chain of Command on making good decisions and identifying what dignity and respect look like.
- Training will be delivered to all active and reserve Sailors by certified Command Facilitators (CF).
- Master Mobile Training Teams (MMTT) from Naval Education and Training Command (NETC) will commence the CF training fleet-wide in February.

- CF personnel will need to be certified specifically by the MMTT by using a distance learning course that will be available in June 2017.
- Individual commands are not authorized to certify their own CF or modify Full Speed Ahead training material.
- Teams from 21st Century Sailor Office and Naval Education and Training Command have worked on the training and developed the lesson plan over the past year to build on existing training from FY16 (Chart the Course).

Training must be completed for all Sailors no later than Dec. 31, 2017. Civilians and other service personnel assigned at Navy commands are encouraged to participate in accordance with their mission requirements and command direction.
