#### IMPORTANT – READ BEFORE ATTENDING

- Vaccines, including boosters, provide additional protection against COVID-19 variants and help prevent severe illness and hospitalization.
- \*Who is eligible? Veterans, spouses, caregivers and CHAMPVA recipients under the authority of the SAVE LIVES Act (SLA) must have had eligibility established previously.
- Boosters are for a dults whose last Moderna or Pfizer vaccine was more than 5 months ago or 2 months ago for the J&J / Janssen vaccine.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> doses are for individuals with Immunocompromised conditions ONLY. If you are unsure of your immune status, you should consult with your provider or review your condition.
