- Yourself, if you could no longer make decisions on your medical care or other issues?

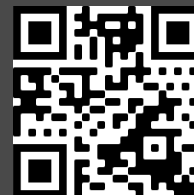
Estate plans can help you prepare for unexpected changes and offer a sense of security in uncertain times. Family and friends may have different ideas of what you want or need than you do.
