Different colors on roadway signs are used to communicate various types of information, including regulatory rules, detours, and directions. These color standards are designed to help motorists easily and interpret important messages, regardless of their location in the country.

Although you may be familiar with green indicating go, yellow signaling preparing to stop, and red meaning stop, these colors are now used in various formats, including solid and flashing lights, and different shapes beyond the traditional circle.

Solid Red Arrow: Stop!
No left turns allowed.
Drivers should wait at
the intersection
approach.



Solid Yellow Arrow: The signal is about to turn red and drivers should prepare to



Flashing Yellow Arrow: Left turns allowed, but you must yield to oncoming traffic/pedestrians.



Solid Green Arrow: It's safe to turn left. Oncoming traffic must stop.
