



Safe Driving Fall & Winter Driving

This week, we'll offer safe driving tips for navigating fall and winter weather. Fall typically brings back-to-school traffic, falling leaves, weather fluctuations, and changes in daylight saving time. To adjust to varying light conditions, keep a pair of sunglasses in your car and make sure your headlights are functioning properly before you drive.

Driving over leaves can cause tire slippage, particularly for motorcycles. Slow down carefully when approaching leaves on the road, as well as on bridges and overpasses during icy conditions.

As fall transitions to winter and the likelihood of snow rises, make sure you're prepared. Keep your car fueled with plenty of gas, and have jumper cables, water, and some non-perishable food on hand in case you get stranded.
