 - How are students referring or self-referring?
 - Who are your community partners that will work with your school district to support student needs?
 - What approved technologies will you use to connect with students and caregivers?
 - What is your backup form of communication?
 - Is the technology secure?
 - What telehealth training have you received, or do you need to consider receiving?
 - What goals have you established for the school year?

- As a team, problem solving the following situations:
 - When you are conducting a suicide screening and technology and communication fails.
 - When you are working with a student who was referred to you because of suicidal statements and the student hangs up on you.
 - When you cannot reach the parent when you begin your suicide screening.
 - When you cannot reach the student after you receive a referral regarding concerns from a teacher.
 - When you need to conduct a suicide screening and you encounter a language and/or cultural barrier.
