Standards of Learning

- The 2020 Visual Arts Standards of Learning: The current standards are the 2020 Visual Arts Standards of Learning. The foreword, introduction, goals, explanation of the strands, and health and safety information are at the front of the Standards of Learning document and contain important information about art education in Virginia.
- <u>Progression Charts:</u> The progression chart shows how the *Visual Arts Standards of Learning* progress in depth and complexity over the sequence of a course of study. Educators can use the progression charts to understand the bigger concepts and skills the standards encompass. In addition, educators can use the progression charts to scaffold instruction for differentiated learning needs.
