SUBJECT: 2022 BACK TO SCHOOL OUTREACH AND ENGAGEMENT CAMPAIGN

Dear School Principals:

The Virginia Department of Medical Assistance Services (DMAS) is pleased to announce the 2022 FAMIS and Medicaid *Back to School* outreach and engagement campaign. For twenty-one years, DMAS has provided schools with access to flyers to help ensure that information about Medicaid and FAMIS is made available to every student and parent/guardian.

More than 800,000 children across Virginia receive health insurance through FAMIS and Medicaid; however, there are still eligible children who remain un-enrolled and uninsured. DMAS also continues to include additional messaging that targets parents who may qualify under Medicaid Expansion.

Please share this information with the McKinney-Vento homeless liaison, school nurse, nutrition program supervisors, enrollment coordinators, social workers, PTO/PTA leadership and your Medicaid coordinator so that they are aware of these important efforts, especially given the continuing federal Public Health Emergency (PHE).

Do not forget, if your school division participates in the Medicaid and Schools billing program, Medicaid outreach is an administrative claimable activity for which your school division can receive reimbursement.

Action Items:

Typically, it has been asked that your school distribute these flyers on the first day of school but we have found that other distribution methods can be equally effective. Some suggested ways of distributing the flyers include:

Placing a link to https://coverva.org/en/back-to-school on school websites

- Distribute through Virtual Learning Packets
- Distribute through new student enrollment packets
- Distribute in-person or virtual PTA meetings and other school events
- o Distribute through the McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison
- Distribute an automated calling message (I.e., Robo Call)
- Distribute via SMS or text messaging
- Distribute on social media platforms
- Pull information from the Back to School webpage on www.coverva.org to distribute online, via email and through any other form of digital correspondence to parents

A permanent *Back to School* page with additional resources and materials is available on the Cover Virginia website at www.coverva.org/en.. We ask and encourage you to share the webpage with both school division staff and parents throughout the school year.
